The City of Oak Creek, in cooperation with mystateusa.com© is pleased to offer its residents a quick and reliable way of receiving emergency messages and alerts by phone or text message. This AlertSense system has the capability of notifying residents by phone in the event of an emergency that affects your neighborhood.

In the event of an emergency, you may receive an automated phone call advising you of the nature of the situation and the appropriate measures to take. The caller will always identify themselves as being with the City and will leave a phone number for you to contact for further information. An added feature of this system allows people to sign up their mobile phones or other communication devices to receive these alerts by text message.

Fair Housing

FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT: PROTECT YOURSELF!

Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding & keeping housing much more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity – the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford – is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- Race
- Sex
- Color

- Disability
- Religion
- on Marital Status
- Age
- Sexual Orientation
- National origin/Ancestry
- Lawful source of income
- Family status (household composition, including presence of children)

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

In this day & age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle & difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, because they have kids or because they have a disability.

The following are some possible "red flags" that may indicate illegal discrimination:

- → You called about an apartment for rent. You were told that it has been rented, but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- → You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, & the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along.
- → A landlord or apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- → You are told of extremely long waiting lists.
- → You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibility criteria, but the provider won't tell you what the eligibility requirements are.
- → A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- → Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent reason.
- → Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are ways to address the problem. Victims of housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in



public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court. If you have any questions regarding housing discrimination, fair housing laws & what your options may be for pursuing a complaint of housing discrimination, call the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council at 278-1240.

The Fair Housing Council offers many helpful services, including:

- Counseling for persons alleging housing discrimination
- Investigations on behalf of victims of housing discrimination
- Assistance in filing fair housing complaints with an administrative agency or in a court of law

The Fair Housing Council provides educational presentations to neighborhood groups, civic & religious organizations, social service agencies, community centers & other groups that are interested in learning more about fair housing law & housing discrimination. With winter weather approaching; please remember to clear the snow from any fire hydrants that may be on your property. Generally, an area four feet in diameter allows Fire Department personnel to access the hydrant and make necessary fire hose connections.

Ask the Fire Department

When I call an ambulance, how do I know what hospital I should go to?

Patients can go to any Emergency Room that is currently accepting patients. On occasion, Emergency Rooms may "close" to ambulances due to having reached their patient capacity. In some cases, Fire Department personnel will recommend a hospital that specializes in certain types of medical care. For example, Froedert is the only Level One Trauma Center in Southeastern Wisconsin.


When I approached an accident scene recently, I noticed that the Fire and Police personnel were all wearing reflective vests. Is that part of their uniform?

Absolutely! Whenever Fire and Police personnel are required to operate on a roadway, they wear reflective vests over their regular uniform. This makes emergency personnel more visible to drivers. In addition, vehicles are outfitted with reflective material, cones are deployed to direct traffic, and a sign is placed on the road to warn drivers of the upcoming accident scene.

LADDER SAFETY

According to OSHA, The Department of Labor, and the Center for Disease Control, accidental falls from height over six feet accounted for 809 fatalities in 2006. The Oak Creek Fire Department urges residents to use caution when cleaning debris out of gutters or hanging Christmas lights. Remember these ladder safety tips:

- -Set up ladders on firm, level ground.
- -Inspect ladders to ensure that they are in good working condition.
- -Respect the ladder's Duty Rating and and equipment when calculating the load.





-Do not stand on the top rung or step of a ladder.

NOVEL INFLUENZA A (H1N1)

In June, the pandemic alert level was raised to Phase 6 by the World Health Organization. This reflects that the H1N1 (swine flu) virus has spread to other parts of the world, but it does not mean that the virus has changed or become more severe. Influenza is spread by coughing speezing and unclean hands. Choose



coughing, sneezing and unclean hands. Choose to limit the spread of flu germs by following these guidelines:

- * Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when your cough or sneeze.
- * If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve.
- * Put used tissues in the trash.
- * Clean your hands after coughing or sneezing. Wash with soap and water, or with alcohol-based hand cleaner.
- * Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- * If you get sick, stay home from work or school and all activities for the recommended time frame, (7 days after symptoms start or 24 hours after symptoms stop, whichever is longer).
- * If you have to stay home, consider planning to have a supply of food, medicines, and other essential supplies.

- * Frequently cleanse commonly touched items.
- * Don't share drinking cups.

SEASONAL FLU VACCINATION CLINICS

In addition to the above practices, one of the best ways to prevent seasonal flu is to receive the vaccination each year. **Adult seasonal flu clinics** will be held:

COLORECTAL CANCER IS PREVENTABLE, TREATABLE, BEATABLE!!

Every year, approximately 131,000 Americans are diagnosed with colorectal cancer and about 55,000 die from this disease. Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in the United States. The Health Department has information about how to prevent and screen for colorectal cancer, and any resident age 50 or older is eligible to receive a free home testing kit. This fecal occult blood test is a simple at home procedure that checks stool samples for hidden blood which can be a sign of cancer, polyps, or other internal disorders. Are you 65 years or older? Have you fallen or are afraid about falling? The Oak Creek Health Department has a program for you. We will be conducting a well researched falls prevention



program *Stepping On* in September. Topics include simple and fun balance and strength training, the role vision plays in keeping your balance, how medications can contribute to falls, ways to stay safe when out and about in your community,

DID YOU KNOW THAT THE OAK CREEK HEALTH DEPARTMENT IS OFFERING FREE SHORT-TERM AND LONG TERM RADON

KITS? Radon is a radioactive gas. It comes from the natural decay of uranium that is found in nearly all soils. It typically moves up through the ground to the air above and into your home through cracks and other holes in the foundation. Your home traps radon inside, where it can build up. Any home may have a radon problem. This means new and old homes, well-sealed and drafty homes, and homes with or without basements. The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency estimates that radon causes several thousand preventable lung cancer deaths nationally each year. Testing is the only way to know if you and your family are at risk from radon exposure. If you are interested in obtaining a free radon test kit, please stop in the Oak Creek Health Department; proof of residency is required.

BUS LIGHTS

With the start of the new school year, motorists are reminded to use caution when approaching school buses. Motorists

should stop their vehicle not less than 20 feet from the bus when it is displaying flashing red warning lights and remain stopped until the bus resumes motion or extinguishes the flashing lights. This does not apply to vehicles traveling inthe opposite direction on a divided highway with a median. School bus operators may submit a written report to the Police Department of those vehicles illegally passing a school bus with its red warning lights flashing. Upon receipt of this information, the Police Department will prepare a traffic citation and serve it upon the owner of the vehicle in violation. The fine for such violation is \$235. Help keep our children safe this school year—stop when you approach a bus flashing its red warning lights!—

MEDICINE COLLECTION PROGRAM

The City of Oak Creek has begun a program which provides the citizens of Oak Creek with a location to safely bring unused medications for disposal.

Citizens may bring their prescription

medications, in their original container, to the Oak Creek Police Department, 301 W. Ryan Road, Monday through Friday, from 8am to 5pm. Also accepted will be over-the-counter medications, ointments, sprays, inhalers, creams and pet medications. Items not accepted include illegal drugs, biohazard material, needles/Sharps, personal care products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, etc.), and household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas). Citizens dropping off medications will be asked for identification to verify that they are a resident of Oak Creek. Citizens cannot bring in prescription medications for other people unless they are family members.

Statute §941. An area where individuals may not be aware that it is illegal to carry a firearm is in the county parks. Milwaukee County Ordinance No. 47.05 restricts individuals from openly carrying or carrying concealed weapons in county parks. Citizens should be aware of this County Ordinance and the fact that the Oak Creek Police Department will be enforcing this ordinance in conjunction with the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office.

WOMEN'S DANGER AWARENESS & SELF DEFENSE COURSE

The Oak Creek Police Department will be sponsoring FREE, two-evening courses on Women's Basic Danger Awareness and Self Defense. The goal of this course is to present information that will help to reduce the risk of an assault and survive a deadly encounter. A portion of this course includes a physical self defense component (participation is optional). Two courses will be offered at the Police Department from 6:30-8:30 p.m. The first course will be held on Monday & Tuesday, September 14 & 15, 2009. The second course will be held Monday & Tuesday, September 28 & 29, 2009. Registration is open to residents of Oak Creek only or those employed in the City of Oak Creek. You must be 17 years or older to participate. Contact the Oak Creek Police Department, Community Resource Bureau, at (414) 766-7624 to register.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

With Halloween just around the corner, the Police Department would like to remind parents of a few tips to keep your children safe while trick-or-treating:

- Children should always trick-or-treat with an adult or older sibling.
- Costumes should be reflective, flame retardant, and should fit properly to prevent trips & falls.
- Consider wearing makeup instead of a mask which may hinder or restrict your child's vision.
- ◆ Stay in neighborhoods with people whom you are familiar with.
- Remind children not to eat their goodies before an adult can check them.
- Eat only unopened candies and those in original wrappers only.
- Put your outside house light on to show that your family is participating in trick-or treating.
- Remove objects from your yard that might present a hazard to trick-or-treaters.
- Keep an eye out for suspicious activities or persons in your neighborhood.

FALL CLEAN-UP BEGINS NOVEMBER 16, 2009

The Street Department will conduct a spring clean up beginning Monday, November 16, 2009. There is no charge for this pick up. Items that will be picked up are as follows:



- Yard Waste; excluding leaves, grass and branches
- Construction Materials; not resulting from a contractor
- Mattresses
- Wood
- Metal

- Televisions
- Carpeting/Rugs
- Furniture
- Appliances

Items that will not be picked up are as follows:

- **Paints**
- **Batteries**
- **Grass Clippings**
- Tires
- Hazardous Materials
- Leaves / Branches
- Fluorescent Tubes

Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on November 16th in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick ups until the spring clean-up, May 15th, 2010. See Special Pick-Ups section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you miss the Fall Clean-Up date.

FINAL BRANCH PICK-UP

The last branch pick up for 2009 will begin Thursday, October 1st. Residents are reminded that branches should be placed at the curb or roadside prior to the 1st to guarantee a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until April 1, 2010.

Reminder, branches are to be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pickup brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard, any time of the year, at 720 W. Puetz Road.

The next branch pick up will be April 1, 2010



RAKING OF LEAVES INTO THE STREET IS PROHIBITED

The City of Oak Creek has adopted Ordinance No. 1984, which prohibits property owners from placing leaves, grass, yard waste or rubbish in the street, alley or sidewalk areas. For your convenience, the ordinance reads as follows:

"No owner or occupant shall allow the street, alley or sidewalk pavements abutting his premises to be littered with rubbish, dirt, grass, leaves or yard waste as defined in S. 8.40. If such owner or occupant shall refuse or fail to remove any such rubbish, dirt, grass, leaves or yard waste as defined in S.8.40 when notified to

do so by the Common Council or designee, the City may cause it to be done and the cost thereof shall be reported to the City Clerk who shall spread the cost on the tax roll as a special tax against the premises, pursuant to Sec. 66.66(16), Wis. States. or such cost may be covered in action against the owner or occupant."

The City of Oak Creek does NOT pick up leaves curbside. Residents may bring their leaves to the drop-off site located at 720 West Puetz Road, Monday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. or Tuesday evenings until 8 p.m. through the month of September.

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

The blowing and/or shoveling of snow onto City streets are in violation of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code. Section 6.24(c) reads as follows: "Prohibited Placement. No person except the



State, County or City shall deposit or cause to be deposited, upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public land, any snow or ice taken or removed from his premises. No person except the State, County, or City shall use private or public lands within the City as a place for the disposal or dumping of snow or ice from public or private property or from another municipality except with the permission of the owner. The deposit of any snow or ice upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public lands of the City, contrary to the provisions of this Chapter, shall be and is hereby declared to be a nuisance. The City may remove any snow and ice so deposited and cause the costs of such removal to be charged to the owner or occupant of the property from which said snow or ice was removed and illegally deposited, pursuant to Section 66.60(16), Wis. Stats."

Property owners are also required to keep clear their mailboxes and fire hydrants on their property per Section 6.24(d) as follows: "Hydrants and Mailboxes. Every property owner or occupant shall keep all fire hydrants and mailboxes abutting his/her property free and clear of all snow and ice."

GARBAGE & RECYCLING CART INFORMATION

Per Section 8.41 of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code, household combined refuse not placed in a container provided by the City of Oak Creek, will not be collected.

If you find your blue refuse cart is always overflowing, you may purchase an additional cart from the Street Department. These carts will become your property. Contact the Street Department at 570-5682 for pricing.

Also contact the Street Department for any repairs or replacements needed for your blue refuse carts.







Payments by mail are TIMELY if ALL of the following criteria are met:

- it is mailed to the City of Oak Creek in a properly addressed envelope,
- *postmarked before midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment,
- with postage prepaid, and
- received by the proper official not more than 5 days after the prescribed date for making the payment.

DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX

Payment not received or *post-marked before midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment is delinquent. DELIN-QUENCY results in forfeiture of the installment option and accumulates INTEREST AND PENALTY charges from February $1^{\rm st}$ at $1\,\frac{1}{2}$ percent per month on the entire unpaid principal balance, regardless of when it becomes delinquent. The *postmark governs the date of payment – NOT the date on your check.

Delinquent notices for Real Estate Property Tax are mailed to the address on record in June. Payment of 2009 Real Estate Property Tax will be accepted by the City of Oak Creek through July 31, 2010, after which will be turned over to Milwaukee County for collection.

Payment of PRIOR YEAR(S) DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX must be made to MILWAUKEE COUNTY. Contact the Milwaukee County Treasurer's Office at (414) 278-4033 for information.

Wis. Stats. 74.09 Property tax bill and related information – (6) EFFECT OF FAILURE TO RECEIVE. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not affect the validity of the general property taxes, special taxes, special charges and special assessments levied or the collection of delinquent general property taxes, special taxes, special charges and special assessments.

LOTTERY AND GAMING CREDIT

If you received the 2008 Lottery and Gaming Credit on or before January 31, 2009, you do not need to recertify for 2009.

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

Lottery and Gaming Credit applications are available on our website or at the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office.

2008: The 2008 Lottery and Gaming Credit is \$71.83. If you did not receive this credit and are eligible, complete a 2008 <u>Late</u> Lottery and Gaming Credit application and return it, along with a

copy of your tax bill, to the State of Wisconsin Department of Revenue (address is shown on the application) by October 1, 2009.

2009: If you first qualify for the Lottery and Gaming Credit beginning in 2009, or if you applied for the 2008 <u>Late</u> Lottery and Gaming Credit, complete and return the 2009 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office by November 15, 2009; the credit will appear on your 2009 Real Estate Tax Bill. For applications received between November 15, 2009 and January 31, 2010, you may deduct the credit from your first payment. The 2009 Lottery and Gaming Credit amount will be determined in December 2009.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

There is a \$.25 charge for additional copies of tax bills. You may print them free of charge off the internet. Internet service, computers and copy machines are available at the Oak Creek Public Library (north of City Hall). Additional Treasurers' information may be found in the pamphlet included with your tax bill and on the City website by clicking the applicable link. Have a wonderful Fall Season!



DO CARS CREATE STORM WATER POLLUTION?

Most people do not realize that in addition to their widely publicized effects on air quality, cars can add numerous pollutants to our lakes and streams.



We have all seen how a bright fresh new snow turns dirty and dark in areas near roads and parking lots after only a couple of days. This is just one way to visualize the effects of some of the pollution left by our cars and trucks. Each time it snows again, a fresh new layer covers the old grimy layer, until layers of pollution are trapped within the snow banks. Once spring comes, the pollution and particles trapped in the layer of snow will wash with the snow melt into our streams, rivers and lakes. What does not wash off with the snow melt itself, will be left on the pavement until the next rain storm comes along to wash it clean.

Take a look at a parking lot the next time it rains. During the early part of the rain, you may notice an oily sheen, green streaks of leaked antifreeze, and dark gritty particles in the puddles. Look again after it has rained for a while, and you may notice that the oily sheen is no longer there, and the puddles no longer look gritty. Most of us don't stop to think that the ground now looks so clean only because the pollution has been washed away by the rain water, and carried along with the rain water into the storm sewers and ditches, which empty into our lakes and streams with no treatment to remove these pollutants first.



We all know that when the tread on our tires wears away, we need to replace them.
What we don't usually think about is that all the rubber from the tire tread is left on the roads, parking lots, and drive-

ways in the form of small rubber particles. These get washed away during rain storms, and are deposited into our rivers and lakes. Tiny bits of brake pads and rusted metal from cars also get washed into the waterways.

If you change your own oil, do not dump it into a storm drain. Just five quarts of oil from a single oil change can create an oil slick the size of two football fields, or pollute a million gallons of drinking water.¹ Recycling is the only safe way to dispose of used motor oil.

Many people enjoy washing their car at home in the driveway. Although this is not illegal, it can be harmful to the environment. You may have noticed white or dirty foam floating in the creeks, or a thick white film coating the area where a storm pipe opens into a stream. These are usually the result of residential car washing, where the soap is washed off the driveway and into the storm water system. The phosphates in some soaps can act like fertilizer in the water, encouraging algae growth. Decomposing algae is unattractive and also uses up oxygen in the water, which can be harmful to fish in the area. The best alternative is to use a commercial car wash. The wash water from a commercial car wash is often recycled, and the dirty water is sent to a plant for treatment prior to going into our waterways.

The City has initiated a program to identify and prevent illicit discharges throughout the City. City staff are visually inspecting outfalls throughout the City, and conducting chemical sampling if a dry weather flow is present. Most dry weather flows are from sources such as sump pump discharges or lawn sprinklers. However, if the testing shows a parameter is present that indicates illicit discharge, further investigation will be conducted to find and eliminate the source of the illicit discharge. This is one of the ways in which the City is working to protect and improve the quality of our water resources.

Fine Print: Things You Should Know

Is She/He Old Enough?

For all programs, age requirements will be as of the date of the first class, unless otherwise specified. Please do not request to have your child put in a class he/she does not belong in. All age requirements are set to benefit the children and make instruction more consistent for the program leader. In some instances, the requirements have been set for the child's safety.

How Much Is It?

Fees and charges are assessed according to the cost of the program. The Department does not want to exclude children who are unable to pay fees due to financial hardship. Resident families unable to pay all or part of the fees should contact the office.

Need To Transfer? Transfers are made at no charge

Need A Refund?

Refunds will be made upon request up until 1/3 of the scheduled classes have been held (i.e. 3 classes of a 10 week session) except as noted in individual class descriptions. You may expect your refund check 2 to 4 weeks after your request is received.

A \$3 service fee will be charged on each refund initiated by the participant.

Open House

You are welcome to discuss your child's progress after each class and attend the open house held during the final class session.

Makeups?

Classes missed for individual absences (i.e. illness, vacations, etc.) are not "made up" nor may participants attend classes other than the one they are registered for. Cancelled activities by the Department will be rescheduled, if possible. If a class is unable to be rescheduled, no refunds will be issued.

Can I Watch?

In an effort to avoid distractions and interruptions in instruction, for your child to have recreation time with his/her peers, and for adults to have time in an adult-only atmosphere, relatives, friends and/or other children are not permitted in classrooms or the pool during instruction.

Have A Complaint?

If a class does not meet your expectations, please contact the Oak Creek Parks, Recreation & Forestry Office at 768-6515 to discuss your concerns.

Do You Have Insurance?

Insurance coverage for program participants is not provided by the Department or by the School District for Department sponsored activities.

Where Do I Park? Enter?

CITY HALL: East doors closest to fire station.

DEERFIELD: Front entrance to school.

EDGEWOOD: Gym doors at rear of building.

HIGH SCHOOL: Main doors or East Entrance #21

SHEPARD HILLS: North doors next to the playground.

WEST MIDDLE SCHOOL: Southwest doors at the back of school next to dumpster.

EAST MIDDLE SCHOOL: Entrance #7

ST. JOHN'S EV. LUTHERAN SCHOOL: 2525 W. Oakwood Rd.

Am I A Resident?

The resident fee applies to any person whose primary residence is within the Oak Creek city limits at the time of registration and children in the Oak Creek-Franklin School District. Current proof of City residency is required once per year (August-July) to receive resident fees.

What If?

My child wants to be on the same team or in a class with a friend or sibling. Siblings who meet the requirements for the same class section or sports league will be placed together unless otherwise requested in writing by the parent or guardian. All other requests for unrelated children to be placed together:

- are not guaranteed
- will not be considered for girls softball or youth baseball
- will be for a maximum of 3 persons
- may result in the entire group being placed on the waiting list
- must be in writing and signed by parents/guardians of both children

I want to register with my adult friend:

- If one person is placed on the wait list, the entire group will be placed on the wait list
- ◆ If one person is a non-resident, the entire group will be processed during non-resident registration (if space is available)

Note: All "Buddy Link" Requests:

◆ If you request a buddy link and "the buddy" does not register by lottery deadline, you will be waitlisted for the class.

Proof of Date of Birth

- Proof of date of birth for all children is required at their first registration.
- ◆ If the child's name does not match the parent who is presenting proof of residency, proof of residency will be required for the child at their "first" registration.
