#### CITY ADMINISTRATOR -GERALD PETERSON



As we are now well into 2013, the City of Oak Creek can report it has much in the way of development and revitalization activity which is being reviewed and evaluated. Projects that are seeing continued progress include: the Lakefront Development where city staff is working with engineering consultants

on plans to extend Highway 100 from Chicago Road into the southern part of the property. Another project at the lakefront site would extend a road into the property and along the lake frontage, eventually reconnecting back to 5th Avenue at American Way. This work will allow the public to gain access to the spectacular bluff views and public uses contemplated for the site. This spring we will also see a soil/clay cap put on the property as another step in transforming its use from an industrial property to public lakefront. If you travel along 5th Avenue, you may have noticed work is currently underway removing remnants of the industrial buildings which have occupied the site for years. This work is eliminating a significant community eyesore and nuisance. Discussions with property owners are ongoing to transfer these properties into City ownership in an environmentally responsible and prudent manner.

The Drexel Town Center plans have been shared with the public at a meeting which occurred on February 11th. The City's Plan Commission and Common Council will be reviewing zoning and land uses and future development plans for the site. By the time you receive this newsletter, it is likely work to take up the concrete and asphalt left from the previous users will be underway preparing the site for its future mixed use development including a new City Hall and Library to serve the residents of the community.

This work will be done with the assistance of State grants totaling \$1,125,000. The Common Council will also be considering a TIF finance plan and development plan for a 200 acre business park located at Howell and Oakwood Avenues. Plans to conduct mass grading and the installation of public utilities have been developed and pending Council approval, this project is expected to move forward this year. At completion, the potential job creation at the site is nearly 1,400 with approximately \$110 million in new taxable value.

In ongoing efforts to contain cost and work within what appear to be slow and improving economic conditions, the City has worked hard to contain costs throughout City operations and has taken actions to accomplish these controls including privatizing refuse service effective January 1, 2013, modifying employee contributions to pension plans consistent with legislative directives, modifying health plan benefits, freezing pay ranges for all non-union sworn police and fire employees, refinancing bonds to achieve lower rates, and reduce annual/lifetime costs amongst other cost control measures.

The bridge will be constructed on-site, adjacent to the interchange, reducing the overall construction time and getting the interchange re-opened more quickly, easing the commute for our residents. Multiple city streets are scheduled for re-paving this year, including our neighbors on Susan Drive, who have been anxiously awaiting this news for several years!

Enjoy the time spent with families and friends this summer, it's a wonderful time of year in Wisconsin and a payoff for those long, cold winter nights, which returned with a vengeance this year. With school letting out in June, slow it down in our neighborhoods, and keep an eye out for our younger residents.

#### **Summertime Food Safety**

To help prevent food poisoning follow four safety tips. Clean: Always place cooked meat on a clean platter, rather than back on the one that held the raw meat. Always wash your hands after handling raw foods of animal origin. Separate: Always keep cold foods cold and hot foods hot. When you're finished eating, refrigerate leftovers promptly. Don't let food sit out for more than two hours. On a hot day (90°F or higher), reduce this time to one hour. Cook: When grilling, always use a meat thermometer to ensure that meats reach the minimum internal cooking temperature. Chill: Put perishable items in a cooler or insulated bag. 

#### **Safe Grilling**

There is nothing better than a barbecue on a warm summer night. The Oak Creek Fire Department would like to make sure that residents keep safety in mind when they fire up their grills.

#### **Gas Grill Safety Tips**

- 1. Check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes, and leaks. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the hose or tubing.
- 2. Move gas hoses as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease.
- 3. Always keep propane gas containers upright.
- 4. Never store a spare gas container under or near the grill or indoors.
- 5. Never store or use flammable liquids, like gasoline, near the grill.
- 6. Never keep a filled container in a hot car or car trunk. Heat will cause the gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape.

#### **Charcoal Grill Safety Tips**

- 1. Never burn charcoal inside of homes, vehicles, tents, or campers.
- 2. Charcoal should never be used indoors, even if ventilation is provided.
- 3. Since charcoal produces CO fumes until the charcoal is completely extinguished, do not store the grill indoors with freshly used coals.
- 4. Allow charcoal and ashes to completely cool prior to disposal

#### **Pull Over and Slow Down**

While driving, please remember to move to the right when approached from behind by an emergency vehicle. This allows for the emergency vehicle to have a clear path of travel to proceed to the emergency scene. In addition, drivers should either move over one lane or slow down when approaching an emergency vehicle that is pulled to the side of road. This is a Wisconsin State law that applies to not only fire and police vehicles, but also highway maintenance vehicles.

#### Dial 911 in an Emergency

When an emergency occurs, every second counts. The quickest way to get help is to Dial 911.
When 911 is activated, an emergency services dispatcher determines the nature of the incident and dispatches the proper resources to render

patches the proper resources to render aid. In most cases, fire, police and/or medical units will arrive in minutes.

#### The Roles of a Firefighter

The job description of a firefighter has evolved over the years. Firefighters are now EMT's and also more increasingly Paramedics. This "Jack-of-all-trades" approach gives firefighters the flexibility to respond to any type of emergency that arises. The Oak Creek Fire Department uses this strategy to most effectively deploy the resources that are needed to mitigate any emergency situation.

Each station is staffed with a minimum of four firefight-

ers. When an emergency call is received, these personnel respond with a paramedic unit and a fire engine. This allows firefighters to pro-

vide the best level of service for each emergency call; while being immediately able to respond to another type of

emergency once the first call for service is completed. For example, if fire-fighters are called to a medical emergency, two firefighters will transport the patient to the hospital in the paramedic unit. The remaining two firefighters could then respond with the fire engine to another emergency of any nature.

# WARM WEATHER REMINDERS

- With the warm weather comes more activities outside. There are more car windows down and gatherings at residences. Please be courteous of your neighbors with regard to loud noise and music levels. The Oak Creek Police Department responds to complaints at all times of the day, but the main hours of enforcement for loud noise/music (per City Ordinance) is between the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m. The Noise Ordinance also designates that lawn care equipment cannot be operated between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Rummage sale, garage sale, advertising or other such signs cannot be placed on streets, sidewalks or other public right-of-ways, nor can they be attached to public utility poles. Illegally posted signs will be removed by police personnel.

# SUMMERTIME HOME SECURITY

The Oak Creek Police Department would like to remind homeowners of a few simple tips to protect your home during this ever-popular "vacation" time of year:

- Residents can request a "vacation watch" of their home by the Oak Creek Police Department. Prior to leaving for vacation, contact the Department at 762-8200 (press "0" for Dispatch) and provide the dispatcher with information (i.e., your departure/return date, whether lights will be left on and when, if vehicles will be left in the driveway, any designated keyholders, etc.). Our Police Aides will conduct periodic checks of your home while you are gone.
- Do not allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers, or flyers to build up while you are away. Arrange for a friend or neighbor to pick up these items or stop your mail at the post office.
- Give your house a lived-in appearance. Put automatic timers on several lights, a radio, and a television. Set the timers so that the lights and appliances will turn on and off at random times. Leaves shades and blinds in a position that you would normally leave them. Ask your neighbor to use your driveway and garbage cans.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended period of time.

# Summertime Home Security continued ~



- Make sure all locks on the doors and windows function properly, and use them. Don't leave keys under doormats, flowerpots, mailboxes or other "secret" hiding places. Burglars know where to look for hidden keys.
- Make sure smoke and burglar alarms function properly and are armed.
- Turn the ringer on your telephone down low or off and leave a normal message on your answering machine.
- Keep a detailed inventory of your valuables, including a description of the items, date of purchase, original value, and serial numbers, and keep a copy in a safe place away from home. Etch personal identification codes on your valuables with an engraving tool. You can also make a photographic or video record of items in your home.
- Be a good neighbor. Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other. If you notice anything suspicious, call 9-1-1 immediately and report it to the police.

#### **Pet Waste and Water Quality**

As summer approaches, more people will be out walking their dogs. The City of Oak Creek has an ordinance requiring dog owners to pick up pet waste. In addition to human health concerns, pet waste can contribute to deterioration of the quality of our lakes and streams. When pet waste washes into the water, it breaks down

> and uses up oxygen. It also contributes nutrients that can make algae grow. Parasites such as Cryptosporidium, Toxocariasis, and Toxoplasmosis can be

carried into the waterways from improperly disposed pet waste.

Pet waste may not be the biggest source of water way pollution, but it is one of the many little sources of pollution that can add up to a bigger problem. Properly picking up and disposing of pet waste will benefit the health of our lakes and rivers, by helping to keep them clean.

#### Water Friendly Landscaping

Owners of property near a detention pond, ditch, creek, lake, or other waterway have some unique landscaping opportunities and challenges. Many more natural landscape techniques offer attractive habitat to help attract butterflies and songbirds, while also helping protect the water.

A landscaped, more natural buffer zone along the water's edge, rather than traditional lawn, has many benefits, such as less mowing and maintenance. Planting native flowers and decorative grasses can improve habitat. It also helps water quality by reducing the amount of pollutants getting into the water. A vegetated buffer zone can be created in a number of ways, many of which actually reduce time and effort needed to maintain the area.

• Native plants can provide food and habitat to attract songbirds and butterflies to your yard. Information on native shoreland plant species is available from the UW-Extension at www.clean-

water.uwex.edu/pubs/index.htm.

- A buffer zone can be created simply by establishing a "no-mow" zone along the water's edge. Turf grasses will grow 12-24 inches tall before going to seed
- For creating or maintaining a view of the water, consider selective removal of branches, trees, shrubs and ground cover to create clear areas while maintaining vegetation in other areas.
- Please note that City ordinance reguires natural lawns to be maintained at a height of 12 inches or less, and certain areas, such as platted subdivisions with buildings on 50% or more of the lots, are required to maintain the grass at six inches or less. Additionally, noxious weeds such as ragweed are excluded from the definition of natural lawn. If you have a question, please check with the City Inspection department to determine specific requirements for your property prior to establishing a vegetated buffer area.

Some homeowners dump grass clippings on the bank of a pond, ditch, waterway, or wetland adjacent to their property. Unfortunately, as these clippings break down, they will add nitrogen and other compounds to the water, which contributes to algae growth and odors. Disposal of grass clippings or other yard waste on the banks of a waterway is prohibited by Section 8.23(b) of the Municipal Code.

#### **Spring Clean-Up Begins May 15**

The Street Department will conduct spring clean up beginning on Wednesday, May 15. There is **NO CHARGE** for this pick-up (except for freon appliances). Items that will be picked up are as follows:

- •Garden clippings-excluding leaves, grass and branches
- Appliances (Freon appliances- refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers, require a \$15 prepayment for pick-up). Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers.
- Construction Materials NOT resulting from a contractor
- Metal
- Mattresses
- Televisions
- Carpeting/Rugs
- Furniture
- Wood

Items that **will not** be picked up are:

- Paints
- Tires
- Batteries
- Leaves
- Hazardous Material Branches
- Grass Clippings
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Concrete/Stone

Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on Wednesday, May 15th in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick-ups until the fall clean-up on November 15th. See Special Pick-Up section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you should miss the Spring Clean-Up date.

#### **Special Pick Ups**

In addition to the fall & spring clean-ups that are provided at NO CHARGE, the City of Oak Creek provides special pick-ups for residents for a fee of \$25 for the following:

- Appliances (\$15 additional fee will be charged for freon appliances. i.e. refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers)
- Furniture
- Mattresses
- Carpeting/Padding
- Televisions
- · Metals of any kind

Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings **ONLY**. Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45 a.m. on the scheduled Friday. Residents requesting special pick-ups must prepay the fees due by noon, the Thursday prior, in order to be put on that Friday's pick up schedule.

#### **Branch Pick-Up Dates**

Branches will be picked up beginning on the following dates:

June 3 August 1 October 1

To guarantee that your branches are picked up, you must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above, but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until the next date listed.

Reminder, branches are to be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pickup brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly. Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard, any time of the year, at 720 W. Puetz Road.

#### Mulch

Generally, from mid-April through mid-November, mulch is often available for free pick-up at the recycling yard. Residents may call the Street Department at 570-5682 to check availability and/or to be put on a list to have mulch delivered to their homes for a fee of \$25 per load (4-5 yards).

#### **Basketball Standards**

There has been an ongoing problem with residents placing basketball standards in the right-of-way (Terrace Area). This area is defined as that area between the curb and the sidewalk, and where no sidewalk exists, that area between the street pavement and the right-of-way/property line.

Section 6.25 Terrace Areas, Section (d) of the Municipal Code states: "No structures or fixtures shall be placed in the terrace area. Examples of prohibited items would be basketball backstops, statuary, flagpoles and other objects. The exception to this subsection is the installation of a mailbox as specified by the U.S. Postal Service."

#### The Mighty Oak

Oak Creek was named after the mighty oak no doubt because of the many positive qualities of that strong and stately tree. Various types of oak trees grow in our region but the ones native to Oak Creek include bur, swamp white, red and white oaks. The oaks City Forestry has planted include:

- Bur oak
- Swamp white oak
- Bur x swamp white cross
- Chinkapin oak
   Red oak (sparlingly)
- English oak and English oak cultivars
- White oak (rarely) Shingle oak (rarely)

Some rules of tree talk: tree names like oak, maple or birch, are not capitalized unless they are at the beginning of a sentence. Above, the Word program automatically capitalized each first letter of a line. The only words that are capitalized in tree names are words that would normally be capitalized anyway like the N in Norway maple or the name of a cultivar such as 'Regal Prince' a cross between swamp white oak and English oak. Also, oak (and other trees) can be both plural or singular without an S at the end. For instance, we may refer to the oak woodlands or a specific oak tree.

We frequently utilize oaks in park and street tree plantings for good reason. Oaks can live a very long time (hundreds of years), they transplant readily in the Oak Creek clay, shooting out strong root growth in the first couple of years; sometimes even when the above ground portions look weak during acclimation to a new site. Oaks are often said to grow slowly, however, they actually grow at a medium rate during youth (sometimes even fast) and switch to a slow growth rate later in life. That makes them a very excellent street tree choice because they will require very little pruning once they reach maturity. Oaks also tend to have strong wood and good branch attachments



(branch attachments of 90 degree angles are the strongest). A long life, structural strength and minimal maintenance needs makes oak an especially economical choice.

Most oaks are tolerant of soil salt but not of salt spray. If we limit their use to residential neighborhoods and avoid the main thoroughfares, oaks perform very well.

Oak trees support wildlife more than many other types of trees which makes them rated highly on an ecological scale of importance. Large crowns, strong horizontal branching and nut production, attract many birds and small wildlife. For these reasons the bur oak has been referred to as The Tree of Life. Birds migrating across the nation will often find a lone oak for a rest stop if no woodland cover is present.



City Forestry recently worked with the Oak Creek Water Department to transplant a large (10inch diameter) white oak from W. Puetz Road to the north side of Miller Park, to accommodate a

water main project along the north side of W. Puetz Road from Howell Avenue west to Liberty Lane. We intend to transplant as many existing oak trees as possible from that stretch of road. However, the weather must cooperate in order to make that happen.

What made that particular white oak worthy of moving is that it was in such terrific health. Structurally it was near perfect, it was actually growing at a fast rate, it has had dependable deep crimson fall color and it was some how tolerant of the salt spray on Puetz Road. Another special reason to preserve that oak is that it came from a woodland in Oak Creek – nothing beats local genetic material for survival in our climate and conditions. Rob Fransway originally transplanted that white oak from the woodland area north of Puetz Road during the development of Springbrook Apartments.

Oaks are a worthy consideration for landscapes and, appropriately, perform very well in the City of

Oak Creek.

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

**2012:** Lottery and Gaming Credit is \$86.83. If you qualify and did not receive the credit, complete a 2012 Late Lottery and Gaming Credit application and return it, with a copy of your tax bill, as shown on the application by October 1, 2013. **Also return** the 2013 Lottery and Gaming Credit application as shown below.

**2013:** Return the 2013 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office by November 30, 2013; the credit will appear on the 2013 and future Real Estate Tax Bills.

#### BLOCK PARTIES

If you are planning to hold a "block party", please be aware that City officials require

approval. You can either visit the City's website, www.oakcreekwi.org - City Clerk's Office, to download or complete a fill-in application, or stop at the City Clerk's office approximately two weeks (or more) in advance to fill out an application, along with a map detailing where the party is to be held. The Police, Fire and Street Departments, along with the Alderperson of your district, require approval. There is no fee.

If barricades will be needed to block off a portion of the street, you will be responsible for pickup and delivery from the Street Department, 800 W. Puetz Rd., 570-5682, before 3 p.m. Friday.

#### Fair Housing is Your Right

Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding & keeping housing much more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity – the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford – is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- \* Race \* Sex \* Color
- \* National origin/Ancestry \* Age
- \* Disability \* Religion
- \* Family status (household composition, including presence of children)
- \* Sexual orientation
- \* Marital status \* Lawful source of income

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

#### Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council

In this day and age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle & difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, because they have kids or because they have a disability.

The following are some possible "red flags" that may indicate illegal discrimination:

- \* You called about an apartment for rent. You were told that it has been rented, but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- \* You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, & the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along
- \* A landlord or apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- \* You are told of extremely long waiting lists.
- \* You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibility criteria, but the provider won't tell you what the eligibility requirements are.
- \* A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- \* Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent

\* Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are erty during calendar year 2012 via building ways to address the problem. Victims of housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court.

If you have any questions regarding housing discrimination, fair housing laws and what your options may be for pursuing a complaint of housing discrimination, call the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council at 278-1240.

The Fair Housing Council offers many helpful services, including:

- \* Counseling for persons alleging housing discrimination
- \* Investigations on behalf of victims of housing discrimination



Assistance in filing fair housing complaints with an administrative agency or in a court of law

In addition, the Fair Housing Council provides educational presentations to neighborhood groups, civic and religious organizations, social service agencies, community centers and other groups that are interested in learning more about fair housing law and housing discrimination. # **CITY ASSESSOR**

The 2013 assessment year is not a citywide reassessment year. The only properties that will receive a Notice of Assessment for 2013 will be property owners that:

- Changed the characteristics of their prop-
- · Created new parcels via land splits or combinations during the calendar year 2012.
- Had a "Partial" assessment for January 1, 2012 due to an incomplete status as of January 1, 2012.
- Received a change to their assessment due to a request for assessment review.

#### Please see below for important assessment dates for 2013

- June 7, 2013 Notices of Assessment mailed to property owners whose value changed for 2013 assessment year.
- **June 10 through June 27, 2013** Open Book Period (The period where property owners can schedule an informal meeting with the assessor prior to the start of the formal appeal process called Board of Review).
- July 1, 2013 Determination letters mailed to the property owners that had a meeting with the assessor during Open
- July 17, 2013, or some point thereafter Board of Review (formal appeal) process begins. The specific date for the Board of Review had not been established as of the time that this article was created but is tentatively scheduled to begin July 17, 2013 or July 18, 2013. Please contact the Assessor's Office at 414-768-6506 for the specific dates for the Board of Review or visit the Assessor's page of the City's website at http://www.oakcreekwi.org/.

Property owners that wish to file an objection with the Board of Review are required to give the City Clerk notice of intent to file an objection forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start of the Board of Review.



#### **Recycling Yard Information**

The recycling yard is located at 720 W.



Puetz Road & is open Tuesdays, Fridays & Saturdays 8 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. In addition to the regular hours, the yard is open Tuesday evenings ONLY

until 8:00 p.m. starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September.

Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill and has City pickup of garbage may use the recycling yard. Occupants of condos or trailer parks that have private garbage pickup may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste ONLY with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

**NO** items may exceed 4' in length except for branches, furniture, appliances and metals.

**NO** contractor vehicles will be allowed in to the yard.

The yard does **NOT** accept shingles, roofing materials, grass, gas, medical or hazardous waste, paints or vehicle salvage.



All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15.00 per unit fee. Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers.

Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$3 per tire will be charged.

USAgain now has a bin located at the yard for depositing textile items such as clothing, shoes, bedding, towels, curtains, handbags, backpacks, etc...It is located at the end of the garbage compactors. See yard attendant if you have any questions.

#### \*\*OFFICIAL NOTICE\*\* CITY OF OAK CREEK **Noxious Weed Ordinance**

#### PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

- In addition to the weeds mentioned to be noxious under s. 66.0407(b), Wisconsin Statutes, the following weeds are also declared to be noxious weeds within the boundaries of the City of Oak Creek: Bull Thistle, Wild Carrot, Sour Dock, Wild Mustard, Chickory, Poison Oak, Poison Ivy, Sow Thistle, Burdock.
- (b) Except as provided in sub. (c), all weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on more than 50% of the lots in the subdivision, in multi-family apartments and complexes, planned developments and mobile home districts shall be cut to and maintained at a height not to exceed six (6) inches. All weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on 50% or less of the lots or which are not located in platted subdivisions and all weeds and grasses in business and manufacturing zoning districts shall be cut to a height not to exceed one foot (12 inches).
  - The City may cause all weeds, grass and brush to be cut and removed, in accordance with this subsection and the cost thereof shall be charged to the property owner pursuant to Section 66.0627 Wis. Stats.
- (c) The provisions for destruction of noxious weeds and cutting of all weeds and grass as provided above shall not apply to areas which are designated by the Common Council as nature centers or wildlife preserves.

Recently the City has had several instances of damage to our underground electrical system that feeds the street lights in your neighborhoods. The source of the damage has been homeowners or people they have contracted with hitting the underground tubing and wiring inside of it. This damage leads to shorting of the wires and the potential for severe injury and even death by people and animals that may cross paths with the ground around the shorted wires or the object that has caused the short.

Our Street Lighting System operates on a voltage of 480 Volts. A shock from .05 amps is enough to stop a typical person's heart beat and the fact that a typical circuit being protected by a circuit breaker ranging in ampacity from 25 to 40 amps. You can see the cause for safety first when planning on putting any holes in the ground around your house.

If you would happen to damage the street light conduit, please contact the Inspection Department at 414-768-6547 and we will check what damage was done.



# 10 MILLION KIDS OUTDOORS!



The National Recreation and Parks Association is supporting the National Wildlife Federation's 10 Million Kids Outdoors campaign. This initiative seeks a future in which all children spend time outside each day - creating a generation of happier and healthier children.

The nature of childhood has changed...there's not much nature in it. A generation ago 75% of American kids played outside daily; nowadays, only 25% do. Children are spending just minutes per day learning and playing outdoors and more than seven sedentary hours per day in front of electronic media.

Childhood as a whole has moved indoors. Increased afterschool

activities including homework and sports, shorter or nonexistent recess, lack of access to green spaces and concerns over unsupervised outdoor play have all contributed to today's children spending significantly more time inside than their parents did.




