I'm often asked by residents about how they can get involved on one of the many committees or commissions that serve our City. Our citizens serve an important role by providing

input and guidance in areas like our parks systems, zoning appeals, community development, and many others. Our city staff and elected officials need all of our residents to communicate their ideas and suggestions as we continue to develop and improve our city, and volunteering your services is one way to accomplish that. On the main page of our city website is a link to the form which residents can fill out to be considered for any open position.

One of the things I've done in my short tenure as Mayor is to promote community initiatives that are fun, and improve the quality of life in our city. My first one, the Mayor's Landscaping Awards, was conducted in the summer of 2012, and honored local homeowners and businesses for improving our city through flower and tree plantings, and other landscaping improvements. We're currently at the mid-point of the Mayor's Fitness & Weight Loss Challenge, another event designed to improve our community, this time through better health and nutrition. I've committed to personally lose 20 pounds from November 10-February 10th, 2013, so check out our Mayor's Challenge facebook page and you can track my progress. Wheaton Hospital, local health professionals, and many of our fitness clubs and restaurants, have agreed to partner with our residents with the goal of building a healthier community. We'll award prizes in

February to the participants with the greatest percentage of weight loss (with a random drawing for a children's prize) and total up the weight loss for our city. If you can lose weight during the holidays, you have a better chance of making a commitment to fitness and lifestyle changes that will help you make your long-term wellness a priority. Join me in losing weight, and getting fit!

In the spring, I'll be launching a volunteer effort to clean up the city, and our many parks and green spaces. Centered around Earth Day events nationally, I'll be recruiting residents to step up and organize "cleaning crews" with the hope that we can identify areas that need some attention, and spruce up our city at the same time. # **CELL PHONE LAW**

A new state law aimed primarily at teenagers and others who lack experience behind the wheel, and tend to be more easily distracted, will take effect in November.

The law will prohibit drivers with an instruction permit or probationary license from operating a motor vehicle while using a cell phone, unless it is to report an emergency. Violations can result in a fine up to \$40 for a first offense and up to \$100 for subsequent violations. In Wisconsin and the nation, traffic crashes kill more teenagers than any other cause of death and distracted driving is a common factor in many crashes. Wisconsin will join 32 other states that ban cell phone use by novice drivers.

# CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

Occasionally we are all approached by persons representing charitable organizations seeking monetary contributions to fund their programs. Most often these are hardworking volunteers representing worthwhile organizations that support our community. Keep the following tips in mind before making any type of monetary contribution:

- 1. Make sure the person has identification from the organization they are representing. If in doubt, do not give them money. Instead, contact the Police Department who will verify the validity of the person.
- 2. Any donations in excess of a few dollars should be given in the form of a check made out to the organization—NOT to the person collecting the funds. If you encounter someone you suspect is trying to defraud you, tell them "no", close the door, and call the **Police Department immediately at 762-8200.**

Please contact your builder/developer, check your sales contract to review your closing statement or contact your attorney to verify if you will be responsible for any property taxes for the current tax year.

# **Springtime Rain Garden Plants and Workshops**

During the cold winter months and the early wet days of spring – thoughts of warmer days, sunshine and flowers can be cheering. This is the perfect time to start planning a rain garden or rain barrel for your yard. A rain garden holds and infiltrates rainwater and snow-ice melt from a downspout or a sump pump. It is a good way to keep stormwater runoff out of the storm sewers where it travels untreated to our streams and Lake Michigan.

Root-Pike Watershed Initiative Network is a non-profit organization dedicated to protecting restoring and sustaining the ecosystem of the Root-Pike Watershed,

which includes the Oak Creek Watershed. The organization offers free rain garden plants, mulch and consultation to homeowners, public entities and businesses that complete their free Greener Yards, Cleaner Waters workshop. .

The complementary workshops take place in early spring, beginning in March and ending in May. In addition to helpful tips on rain gardens, each workshop typically offers free oak trees and a drawing for a rain barrel. You can sign up for their electronic newsletter, Greener Yards, Cleaner Waters, which publishes the workshop schedule, how-to articles on composting, installing a rain barrel and rain garden, sources for discounted trees, shrubs and seeds, and much more (email info@rootpikewin.org or call 262-898-2055).

It is not too soon to apply for a rain garden grant for next year. If your proposed sites meets the requirements (sunny location, adjacent to downspout or sheet flow from a driveway or parking lot), Root-Pike WIN will provide plants and mulch for gardens up to 300 square feet. Below are some answers to commonly asked questions, courtesy of Root-PikeWIN.

**Does a rain garden form a pond?**No. The rain water will soak into the

ground. In heavy rainfalls it could hold water for a day or two, but the garden should be dry between rainfalls.

Are they a breeding ground for mosquitoes? No. Mosquitoes need 7 to 12 days to lay and hatch eggs. Standing water in the rain garden will last for a few hours after a normal rainfall and up to two days after heavy rains. Mosquitoes are more likely to lay eggs in bird baths, storm sewers, and lawns than in a sunny rain garden. Also rain gardens attract dragonflies, which eat mosquitoes!

#### Do they require a lot of maintenance?


No. Rain gardens can be maintained with little effort after the plants are established. Some watering will be needed the first

year after the garden is planted, but should be stopped after the first soaking rain. Until then, apply about a cup of water per plant. Don't over water! If a drought is announced in the news, then

give the plants a drink once a week until it rains. Do not water after the first year--you could retard root growth.

Remove weeds when you see them, especially the first year because the young plants cannot compete with weeds. Spread about three inches of mulch in the garden and on the berm after you have planted the garden. The mulch will help keep the soil moist and the weeds out. Replenish the mulch each year giving special attention to the berm and outer ring of garden. Remove weeds before you mulch.

Never, never fertilize--you will weaken the root growth. The deep root systems of native plants help them survive our weather extremes.

#### **Shovel Your Fire Hydrants**

The winter months bring a special concern to the Oak Creek Fire Department. Winter storms can often hide fire hydrants under a mountain of snow making them im-



possible to find quickly. In the event of a fire, firefighters have to locate and shovel out fire hydrants before hooking up to them. Precious time is lost. Please don't let your neighborhood hydrant remain "undercover".

We are asking that you help us by keeping the fire hydrant closest to your residence or business clear of snow. We need a 3 foot clearance on all sides. When shoveling snow be aware of vehicle traffic. Do not stand in the street and be careful not to slip and fall out into the roadway.

#### **Ask the Fire Department**

What should I do when I see an emergency vehicle in my rear-view mirror? When approached by an emergency vehicle from behind, slow down, pull your vehicle to the right. Then, when you can safely do so, come to a complete stop. This allows the fire engine, ambulance, or police car to have a clear path of travel in the left lane.

How many smoke detectors do I need in my home?

Smoke detectors should be placed on every floor of your home including the basement. It is especially important to have smoke detectors installed outside of each sleeping area and in the kitchen.

#### **Carbon Monoxide Safety**

Carbon monoxide, an odorless, colorless



gas, is a byproduct of the combustion of fossil fuels. When appliances such as MONOXIDE furnaces, water heaters, dry-

ers and stoves malfunction or are improperly vented, a buildup of carbon monoxide gas can occur. As this gas builds up in a home, occupants may experience headaches, nausea, dizziness, fatigue and confusion. At higher levels, carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms include vomiting, loss of consciousness, and even death. Now that the winter months are

upon us, the Oak Creek Fire Department would like to remind residents that carbon monoxide detectors should be placed on each level of their home. In addition, they should have appliances inspected by a licensed professional.

#### **Have Two Ways Out**

It's important that each member of your family knows at least two ways out of every room. That way, if one exit is blocked during a fire, there is another way for the occupant to escape to safety. Parents can reinforce this message with their children by creating a home fire escape plan. A free template can be downloaded at www.safekids.org/assets/docs/safety-basics/safety-tips-by-risk-area/fire-escapeplan-for-your-home.pdf. It's important to not only detail two ways out of every room, but also to establish a meeting place outside of your home. A meeting place is the location where the entire family knows to gather after they have exited the home.

#### **Fireplace Safety**

There is nothing better than building a fire in your fireplace on a cold, winter night. However, many house fires originate in fireplace chimneys. Please remember these safety tips to keep your family safe this winter.

• The damper must be fully open before starting a fire and left open until the fire is out. If a source for outside combustion air



exists, be sure that it is open before you light the fire.

• Don't overload the fireplace. If you do, burning logs could roll out. Never use wet or green wood.

  - Be sure to close the screen to prevent sparks from flying out into your living room. Close the glass doors to reduce heat loss from the room into the chimney only when your fire is al most out.
  - Never start a fire with liquid fire starters, i.e. gasoline, kerosene, etc.
  - Do not burn Christmas trees or a lot of paper in your fireplace. This type of fire, which gets very hot really quickly, can cause the joints of the chimney to separate or the metal to warp.
  - Annual inspection and sweeping, when required, of your fireplace and chimney is recommended by the National Fire Protection Association and the Chimney Safety Institute of America. www.csia.org

# Make Hand Washing a Priority This Winter!

Hand washing is one of the best ways to stay healthy and prevent the spread of illnesses such as the seasonal flu—and it's easy! It is important to wash your hands frequently as follows:

- \* Wet your hands with warm running water
- \* Rub your hands together with soap, scrubbing the back of your hands,
  - between your fingers, and underneath your fingernails
- \* Scrub your hands for 20 seconds while singing 'Happy Birthday' twice through
- \*Thoroughly rinse your hands under the warm water and dry them
- \*Turn off the faucet with a clean paper towel

#### **Heart Health Awareness**

Did you know the leading causes of death and disability in Wisconsin are due to heart disease and stroke? According to the Wisconsin Plan for Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention, few Wisconsin adults are cardiovascular-risk free. The American Heart Association has defined heart health using 7 factors, known

- \* Never smoked, or quit more than 1 year ago
- \* BMI of less than 25 kg/m2

as Life's Simple 7:

- \* Physical activity of at least 150 minutes (moderate) or 75 minutes (vigorous) each week
- \* Diet high in fruits, vegetables, whole-grains and fish; diet low in saturated/trans fats & added sugars
- \* Total cholesterol of less than 200 mg/dl
- \* Blood pressure below 120/80 mm Hg
- \* Fasting blood glucose less than 100 mg/dl

#### Free Radon Kits

Radon is a radioactive, colorless gas that causes several thousand preventable cases of lung cancer deaths nationally each year. #### WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter parking restrictions are in effect from December 1st until



April 1st. During this time, there is no parking allowed on the streets in the City of Oak Creek during the following hours:

Mon. thru Fri. from 2 a.m.-6:00 a.m. Sat. & Sun. from 2:30 a.m.- 6:00 a.m.

Permission may be granted by the Police Department (on a day-to-day basis) for exceptions on the restriction during emergencies, if a vehicle becomes disabled, or if there is an overnight guest. Please us the non-emergency number if you need permission – (414) 762-8200.

# UTILITY PROBLEMS

During severe weather, the Police Department receives



an abundance of telephone calls from residents wishing to report utility problems. These problems should be reported directly to the respective utility company at their 24-hour phone numbers. See back cover of Acorn for Utility Phone Number Listings.

#### **SNOW & ICE REMOVAL**

The blowing and/or shoveling of snow onto City streets are in violation of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code Section 6.24(c).

"Prohibited Placement. No person except the State, County or City shall deposit or cause to be deposited, upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public land, any snow or ice taken or removed from his premises. No person except the State, County, or City shall use private or public



lands within the City as a place for the disposal or dumping of snow or ice from public or private property or from an-

other municipality except with the permission of the owner."
Sidewalks are also required to be c

Sidewalks are also required to be cleared of ice and snow per Section 6.24(a) within

twenty-four (24) hours after such snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumulate. When ice has formed on any sidewalk, such that it cannot be removed, then the person responsible shall prevent such ice from presenting a hazard to pedestrian traffic by the use of ashes, sawdust, sand, salt or any other similar substance. Property owners are also required to keep mailboxes & fire hydrants on their property free and clear of all snow and ice per Section 6.24(d).

# BURGLARIES AND THEFT FROM VEHICLES

Several homes in the southern part of Milwaukee County have been targeted for highend burglaries. These homes have lost large amounts of cash and

valuables. The City of Oak Creek has not been immune to the thieves. Don't become a victim of crime. Protect yourself and your valuables!

- 1. Valuables or large amounts of cash should be kept in a safe. A high-quality safe is recommended. Make sure the safe is not mobile and locate it in an inconspicuous place, e.g., a storage area of the basement, a linen closet, hall closet, etc.
- 2. Keep an accurate record of your possessions. Make an inventory of what you own. Photographing or videotaping precious items or valuables identifies them as belonging to you and can speed up replacement or repayment of the items lost. Keep these records stored at a separate location or in a safety deposit box. Make sure high end valuables are covered by

your insurance company. Check to see if an insurance rider is required to insure the items

- 3. Break down boxes from purchases so they fit in the disposal container with the lid down or take them to the city refuse center.
- 4. Don't display your valuable items when you are not home. Close your drapes or shades when you leave, so thieves can't window shop!
- 5. Lock your windows and doors! Never leave them unlocked when you are not home.
- 6. When using items in your vehicle don't display them. Brackets left on windshields, cords left in plain view all display you own a device and it's available for the taking. Place all valuables, devices and money out of plain view, store them in your trunk or take them with you when you exit your vehicle.
- 7. Never leave your vehicle unlocked when unoccupied! Whether in your driveway or out in a parking lot **LOCK IT!**

Thieves look for opportunities – make yourself, your home and your vehicle less vulnerable. Make sure you know your neighbors, and can identify suspicious persons and activity in your neighborhood. If suspicious activity occurs, please call the Oak Creek Police Department, 414-762-8200, press 0 for dispatch.

# HUNTING IN OAK CREEK

According to the Department of Natural Resources, Oak Creek (Milwaukee County) is listed as a Deer Management

Zone, which would lead you to believe that you could hunt deer in Oak Creek. However, Section 11.20 of

the City of Oak Creek Ordinance prohibits hunting and trapping in addition to prohibiting/regulating the use of firearms, shooting or discharging a bow and arrow within city limits. The fine starts at \$240—depending on the specific violation.

#### PRIVATE ASH TREE MANAGEMENT FOR EMERALD ASH BORER

2013 marks approximately year nine (9) or more of Oak Creek's emerald ash borer (EAB) infestation. This is when we will expect to see accelerated tree decline and death in untreated trees. The woodland element of our community adds an interesting variable to ash tree management for EAB. Without a proven biological control or a serious logging effort, not only will woodlands of predominantly ash die, but they will harbor EAB until all the ash trees are completely dead.

Many Oak Creek woodlands are made up of a very small percentage of ash trees. A predominance of oak/hickory or maple/beech/basswood would indicate a low percentage of ash. Where most of the ash trees are found are in wet, low-lying woodlands that grade into elm and silver maple.

For most homeowners of multiple large ash trees or woodlots the most realistic management strategy will fall somewhere between treatment of desirable individual trees and doing nothing beyond management for safety. Successful safety management for EAB will consider targets — where trees would land should they fail. For instance areas such as your home and property, your neighbors' property, any areas used in activity (play and work areas, livestock range, doghouse, etc.) and, of course, public roads and power lines.

We are occasionally asked if it is feasible to treat woodland ash trees. The answer is that it could be. The most practical method for woodland treatment would be a bark spray administered by a certified pesticide applicator. It would likely be a costly venture. One could select the healthiest trees with the best form that are

positioned and growing in a long-term (sustainable) site.

City Forestry has just concluded the first round of rural right-of-way inventory. Our next step is to complete an inventory of private trees that pose a threat to public rights-of-way and property. If trees near roadways and other public areas become

hazardous and appear to be neglected, you will hear from us. We will work with residents to resolve threats to public areas, assuring public safety.



Every tree that is

tended without the involvement of City Forestry allows us more time to use for other aspects of urban forestry management such as planting, pruning, planning, removals, etc.

Forestry keeps a Resident Firewood List. We can connect users of firewood with those desiring to dispose of it, helping to keep infested ash wood from leaving the City. Please contact us for more information.

Ash wood can be disposed of at the City yard during regular hours of operation. Infested wood can also be left for branch pick up during seasonally scheduled times.

By this time it is hoped that residents attempting to save their ash trees have already enrolled them in a treatment program. It may not be too late to begin treatment, especially if you have white ash. White ash is less susceptible to EAB than green ash. It is generally thought that EAB goes for the green ash of a community first, seeking white ash after the green ash has been treated or destroyed. 'Autumn Splendor,' 'Autumn Applause,'

'Rosehill' and the most common, 'Autumn Purple,' are all cultivated varieties of white ash. Common cultivars of green ash include: 'Marshall Seedless,' 'Patmore' and 'Summit.' In most cases we can determine a green ash from a white ash from a digital pictured emailed in to forestry.

Many residents have reported EAB management of their private ash trees. We appreciate your efforts and contributions to EAB management. As always, City Forestry is available to discuss EAB and other arboriculture concerns.

# RECYCLING YARD INFORMATION

The recycling yard hours are Tuesday, Friday & Saturdays, 8a.m. until 3p.m. In addition to the regular hours, the yard will be open Tuesday evenings ONLY until 8p.m. starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September.

Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill and has City pickup of garbage may use the recycling yard. Occupants of condos or trailer parks that have private garbage pickup may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste ONLY with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

The recycling yard will be closed on the following holiday dates: Christmas, Tues. Dec. 25, 2012 New Years, Tues, Jan. 1, 2013

#### \*\*\*NOTE\*\*\*

Effective December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009, shingles & roofing materials are no longer accepted at the recycling yard. Also, due to the elimination of roll-off dumpsters for garbage, all items, with the exception of sofas, mattresses & box springs, need to be 4' or less in length. All items need to fit into the

compactors. A garbage truck is on site to compact sofas, mattresses & box springs.

All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15 fee. Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers.

Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$3 per tire will be charged.

#### **BRANCH PICK-UP DATES FOR 2013**

Branches will be picked up beginning on the following dates:

April 1st June 3rd October 1st August 1st

To guarantee that your branches are picked up, you must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until the next date listed.

Reminder: Branches must be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pick up brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard, any time of the year, at 720 W. Puetz Road.

#### **SPRING CLEAN-UP BEGINS** MAY 15, 2013

The Street Department will conduct a spring clean up beginning on Wednesday, May 15, 2013. There is NO CHARGE for this pick-up. Items that will be picked up are as follows:

- •Garden Clippings excluding leaves, grass and branches
- Furniture •Wood
- Appliances (Freon appliances-refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers & water coolers-require \$15 per item to be paid prior to pickup-Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers)

- · Construction Materials NOT resulting from a contractor
- Metal
- Mattresses
- Televisions
- •Carpeting/Rugs

Items that will not be picked up are as follows:

- Paints
- Tires
- Batteries ·Hazardous Materials
- Grass Clippings
- Leaves Branches
- Fluorescent Tubes Concrete/Stone

Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on Wednesday, May 15th in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick-ups until the fall clean-up which begins on Friday, November 15th. See Special Pick-Ups section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you should miss the Spring Clean-Up date.

#### SPECIAL PICK UPS

In addition to the fall & spring clean-ups that are provided at NO CHARGE, the City of Oak Creek provides special pickups for residents for a fee of \$25 for the following items:

- \* Appliances (A \$15 additional fee will be charged for Freon appliances refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers)
- \* Furniture
- \* Mattresses
- \* Carpeting/Padding
- \* Metals of any kind
- \* Televisions

Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers.

Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings ONLY. Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45a.m. on the scheduled Friday. Residents requesting special pick ups must prepay their fees before noon on Thursday prior, in order to be put on that Friday's pick up schedule.

#### POLICY FOR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY WITHIN STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY CAUSED BY **SNOW REMOVAL**

In kind replacement of post &/or mailbox,



or a reasonable alternative may be reimbursed. Maximum payment to claimant will be \$100 per event. No labor

costs will be paid. Damage to gang mailboxes must be made by each property owner to receive reimbursement. Maximum payment will again be \$100 per event, per owner but will only include one post reimbursement. Claimant shall bring damaged parts & paid receipt for replacement parts to the Street Department at 800 W. Puetz Road. Date & approximate time of damage needs to be reported. Damage to other appurtenances installed within the City right-of-way (i.e. walls, planters, sprinkler heads, etc.) will not be considered for cost of replacement. Grass damaged within curb area will be replaced by the Street Department in spring. Temporary mailboxes on a stand are available for

any post & box destroyed during plowing. They must be returned after permanent mailbox is in-



stalled or by May 1st, whichever comes first. Only a limited number of temporary boxes are available. It is the homeowner's responsibility to pick up & return temporary mailboxes to the Street Department.

#### **MULCH**

Generally, from mid-April through mid-November, mulch is often available for free pick-up at the recycling yard. #### **FOLLOWING OF SNOWPLOWS**

WI Statute Chapter 346.915 prohibits a person operating a vehicle from following an official snowplow, equipped & engaged in snow & ice

control/removal. closer than 75 feet when on any highway having a



of 35 miles per hour or less. Highways with posted speeds of more than 35 miles per hour require a minimum of 200 feet following distance. It also requires a person operating a vehicle to stop not less than 20 feet from a snowplow at an intersection & to remain stopped until the snowplow resumes motion.

#### **GARBAGE & RECYCLING CART INFORMATION**

Per Section 8.41 of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code, household combined garbage not placed in a container provided by the City of Oak Creek, will not be collected.



#### **FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT**

Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding & keeping housing much more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity – the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford – is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- \* Race \* Sex \* Color
- \* National origin/Ancestry \* Age
- \* Religion \* Disability
- \* Family status (household composition, including presence of children)
- \* Sexual orientation \* Marital status
- \* Lawful source of income

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

#### Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council

In this day and age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle & difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, because they have kids or because they have a disability.

The following are some possible "red flags" that may indicate illegal discrimination:

- \* You called about an apartment for rent.
- \* You were told that it has been rented, but but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- \* You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, & the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along
- \* A landlord/apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- \* You are told of extremely long waiting
- \* You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibility criteria, but the provider won't tell you the eligibility requirements.
- \* A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- \* Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent reason.
- \* Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are ways to address the problem. Victims of

housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court.

If you have any questions regarding housing discrimination, fair housing laws & what your options may be for pursuing a complaint of housing discrimination, call the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council at 278-1240.

The Fair Housing Council offers many helpful services, including:

- \* Counseling for persons alleging housing discrimination
- \* Investigations on behalf of victims of housing discrimination
- \* Assistance in filing fair housing complaints with an administrative agency or in a court of law

In addition, the Fair Housing Council provides educational presentations to neighborhood groups, civic and religious organizations, social service agencies, community centers and other groups that are interested in learning more about fair housing law and housing discrimination. # FINE PRINT: Things You Should Know

#### IS SHE/HE OLD ENOUGH?

Age requirements are as of the date of the first class, unless otherwise specified and are designed to provide the best and safest environment for the children. Please do not request to have your child put in a class he/she does not belong in.

#### **HOW MUCH IS IT?**

Fees and charges are assessed according to the cost of the program. The Department does not want to exclude children who are unable to pay fees due to financial hardship. Resident families unable to pay all or part of the fees should contact the office at 768-6515.

#### **NEED TO TRANSFER?**

Transfers will be made at no charge.

#### NEED A REFUND?

Refunds will be made on request until 1/3 of the scheduled classes have been held, except as noted. Refunds are issued based on your original payment method. A \$3 service fee will be charged on each refund. Avoid the service fee by requesting credit to your account in place of a refund.

#### **CAN I WATCH? OPEN HOUSE**

You are welcome to discuss your child's progress after each class and attend the open house held during the final class session. Relatives, friends and/or other children are not permitted in class-rooms or the pool during instruction. This avoids distractions and interruptions in instruction, and allows adults to participate in an adult-only atmosphere.

#### **MAKEUPS?**






