MAYOR'S DESK - STEVE SCAFFIDI



The redevelopment of the former Delphi site on the corner of Howell and Drexel Avenues in Oak Creek is starting to take shape. Roadways, sidewalks, and street signs are defining the layout of

the new downtown area of our city, with several new buildings under construction. A new seventeen acre city park consisting of walking paths, wooded areas, and natural wetlands will make up the western border of the Drexel Town Square site.

Meijers store is nearly completed, and will be the first partner on the site open for business. They occupy the largest parcel of the downtown site, with an 180,000 square foot building located on the southeast corner of the development. Meijers will feature a combined grocery and department store, with a focus on locally grown, fresh produce. The new store is accompanied by a fueling center located just to the east of the store on Howell Avenue.

Just west of the Meijers building will be our new City Hall and Library, featuring a significant amount of public space and meeting rooms, two requests noted in our resident feedback sessions. The new building will also feature geothermal heating and cooling systems, and a four-sided clock tower, sure to be one of the distinctive features of the new downtown.

Right next to City Hall and the Library is a new two acre public square which will eventually host outdoor concerts, farmers markets, open-air dining options at its perimeter, and a splash pad for kids. It will be one of the largest public squares in the state, and will incorporate public uses with innovative, green space technologies.

Taking shape north of our namesake public square will be Main Street. This connection to Drexel Avenue will be reminiscent of many areas in Milwaukee including the Third Ward. With a combination of retail, restaurant, and

spacious one bedroom apartments with spectacular views, the buildings along Main Street will be a destination place for many of our residents.

Right at the corner of Howell and Drexel Avenues, Water Street Brewery is opening our first local brewpub, with beer brewed right on site. The iconic Milwaukee restaurant features a distinctive building design reminiscent of our industrial past, with a comfortable, casual dining experience inside. It is sure to be a popular place for a gathering of family or friends.

We've improved the roadways in and around Drexel Town Square, and appreciate the patience of our residents as we've gone through orange barrel construction season. These improvements will help our residents move around the city, and make it safer and easier to get in and out of Drexel Town Square.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR - GERALD PETERSON



In the Summer 2014 issue of the Acorn, I spoke briefly about signs of an improving economy and development interests in the City of Oak Creek. At that time, we were

in discussions with a number of warehouse and manufacturing businesses looking to locate in the City. These businesses help to diversify our tax base, create jobs, and help continue to keep our tax rate low.

Businesses which have located in the City since that time have included Stella and Chewys, a 160,000 square foot specialty dog food manufacturing facility in the Oakwood Business Park. We've also had two businesses move into existing and empty facilities in the City; Joy Global has converted more than 300,000 square feet of warehouse space to consolidate multiple operations around the Milwaukee area to Oak Creek. Suzy's Cheesecake has expanded and moved their manufacturing plant into a 40,000 square foot building on South Howell Avenue. Additional conversations with manufacturing and distribution warehouses and other businesses are underway as Oak Creek's proximity to both the airport and to the I-94 transportation corridor appeal to their business models. Businesses also appreciate our professional, efficient,

knowledgeable, and cooperative staff.

By the time you receive this, the Common Council will have passed the City's 2015 balanced budget. The City continues to fund its operations on revenues which have increased at less than half the rate of inflation since 2005. Cost containment efforts have been and continue to be a way of doing business throughout the City organization.

In 2015 the City will be performing \$1.5 million in local road repairs and rehabilitation, significant bridge replacement and rehabilitation work, over \$500,000 in stormwater improvements, sidewalk repairs, and street lighting maintenance. We also anticipate demolishing the city hall, library and fire station No. 1 buildings. The City also continues to make strategic investments into computer software and hardware, communications equipment, and front line vehicles and equipment to remain viable and improve efficiencies in all our operations. Improvements and expansion of the trail system at Abendschein Park based upon a master plan adopted in 2008 will be completed during the year as will be the resurfacing of courts at Willow Heights and Manor Marquette Parks along with paving pathways at Miller Park and Meadowview Park.

At its November 5th meeting, the Common Council approved professional service contracts to go along with its

allocation of \$14.6 million in funds for Lake Vista projects. The Council also confirmed a general scope of work to provide for the public access and enjoyment to the City's lakefront. This property is the site of former industrial operations which are east of 5th Avenue and between Bender Park and the MMSD plant facility. If you've been by this area, you've noticed a gradual transformation as dilapidated buildings have been taken down and environmental cleanup including massive fill, grading, and restoration efforts have been underway. Roadway access to the site will be significantly improved through a \$7 million commitment of funds including a state grant to extend roadways to and through the site.

Other projects will include Lakefront Terrace and an active recreation area. This planning and design work will be occurring over the next 2-3 months. Construction will be underway in the Spring of 2015 and completed by Winter in 2016.

FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT: PROTECT YOURSELF!



Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding and keeping housing much

more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity, the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford, is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate

agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- ✓ Race
- ✓ Sex
- ✓ Color
- → Disability
- ✓ Religion
- ✓ Age
- National origin/Ancestry
- Family status (household composition, including presence of children)
- → Marital status → Sexual orientation
- ✓ Lawful source of income

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only

rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

METROPOLITAN MILWAUKEE FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL

In this day and age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle and difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, or a disability.

LOTTERY & GAMING CREDIT

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

If you qualify and the credit does not appear on your tax bill, complete and return the 2014 Lottery and Gaming Credit application with your payment by January 31, 2015. The application, and credit amount to deduct from your first payment, is available on the city's website.

DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX

All delinquent taxes are subject to interest and penalty of 1 ½% per month from February 1 until paid. The City of Oak Creek accepts real estate tax payments through July 31st. After July 31st, payments must be made to Milwaukee County.

Payment of all PRIOR YEAR(S) real estate tax must be paid to MILWAUKEE COUNTY. These payments are not reflected on the City's website. Call the County at (414) 278-4033 or check their website for delinquent tax information.

What's the Assessed

value of my home?

The Assessor's Office will conduct a revaluation for 2015. A revaluation was performed in 2014, and one is also planned for 2016. As opposed to performing revaluations once every three to four years, these annual revaluations ensure assessed values are based on current market condition which leads to more equitable assessments for property owners.

As in previous years, property owners that were approved for a building permit for remodeling, new construction, additions, wood decks, detached buildings and other similar type permits should expect a visit from a member of the assessment staff to update assessment records. For permits relating to

interior remodeling, basement finish, additions and new construction, an interior inspection will be attempted. Properties that sold during 2013 and 2014 may also receive a request for an interior inspection. The

owners of these properties may also receive a letter from the Assessor's Office asking them to answer a questionnaire relating to the details of the sale of the property; such as, was the property listed on the open market? These properties that sold, referred to as comparable sales, are used to establish the assessed value of other properties that have not sold and verifying sales information with property owners is an important part of the assessment process.

All assessment staff will be carrying official City of Oak Creek Identification Cards and their vehicles registered with the Police Department.

In addition to the fieldwork and sales verification of certain properties mentioned above, owners of commercial real estate will be mailed and asked to complete an Income and Expense Form. This information is for confidential use by the Assessor's Office by State Statute and City Ordinance. The information gathered on these forms is used to help establish equitable assess-

ments for commercial properties based on the current market conditions relating to commercial leases. The form does not request personal or business income, only the income information relating to the lease or potential lease of the property. These forms will be mailed between December 2014 and January 2015 and will include a requested return date.

Business owners that may or may not own the real estate where they conduct business will also be mailed and asked to complete a Statement of Personal Property. Per State Statute, business owners are required to complete this form and return it to the Assessor's Office annually. These forms will be

mailed between December 2014 and January 2015 and there is a statutory due date of March 1.

Property owners will be mailed a 2015 Notice of Assessment between May

and June of 2015. That Notice of Assessment will include the 2015 assessed value and will include instructions on how to contact the Assessor's Office during the Open Book period in order to schedule a meeting if they are in disagreement with the value.

FAIR HOUSING CONTINUED--

The following are some possible "red flags" that may indicate illegal discrimination:

- You called about an apartment for rent. You were told that it has been rented, but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, and the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along.



- A landlord or apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- You are told of extremely long waiting lists.
- ✓ You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibility criteria, but the provider won't tell you what the eligibility requirements are.
- A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- ✓ Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent reason.
- Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are ways to address the problem. Victims of housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court.

OAK CREEK HEALTH **DEPARTMENT ACHIEVES** LEVEL III STATUS

Public Health The Oak Creek Health Department achieves Level III status, meeting the maximum requirements established by the State of Wisconsin for a local health department! Previously the Oak Creek Health Department had a Level II status. This achievement indicates a high level of commitment to providing health services and promotion in the City of Oak Creek. It demonstrates that the programs offered to the residents are evidenced-based and sustainable. There are approximately 29 out of 88 Health Departments in WI that are a Level III.

JANUARY IS RADON AWARENESS MONTH!

The health department was awarded a Radon Grant for 2015. FOR JANUARY ONLY- FREE radon test kits will be given out. After January there will be a minimal fee for short and long term radon test kits. Fall and winter are optimum times of the year to test your home for radon. Radon is a colorless odorless natural gas resulting from the breakdown of uranium. Long term exposure to radon increases the risk of developing lung cancer. The EPA cites radon as the 2nd leading cause of lung cancer. Of the 23 short-term test kits



that were submitted in the first half of 2014. 14 were at or above the **EPA** recommended level for miti-

gation. That is over 50%. Contact the health department for advice on testing protocol, mitigation techniques, and interpretation of radon test levels.

HEALTHIEST OAK CREEK 2014-2019

The Health Department's Community Health Improvement Plan Healthiest Oak Creek 2014-2019 was completed July 2014. Four (4) focus areas were identified by a community driven planning committee. They are 1) Reduce Alcohol & Drug Abuse 2) Increase Physical Activity 3) Improve Nutrition and 4) Decrease Inattentive Driving. To view the final plan please visit our website. NEW! ON-LINE CHILD **DEVELOPMENT SCREENING!**

Developmental screenings such as the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) ensure your child is meeting important milestones before age five. It is a simple set of questions that focuses on gross motor, fine motor, personal, social, problem solving, and communication skills. The results provide insight into 5 developmental areas used to identify opportunities of interaction and play to stimulate development. Beginning in January 2015, Oak Creek will be offering the ASQ developmental screening online! You can now put your mind at ease from the comfort of your home. NEW! CAR SEAT PROGRAM

Beginning in 2015 the Oak Creek Health Department will be offering car seat

checks to all residents! There will also be car seats available for low-income families in need. Approximately 3 out of 4 car seats are installed incorrectly putting a child at an increased risk of injury during an accident. Pregnancy is a time of change. Every woman can use help with planning for a healthy pregnancy, getting ready for a new baby, and the lifestyle change that a new baby brings to the family. PNCC services include: Help getting the health care you need, personal support, information on good eating habits and health practices, information and help finding needed services in your community. Prescription drug abuse is on the rise. It is important to lock medications up and keep them safely out of the hands of children and teens. This is especially important for parents and grandparents. Although highly recommended, medication lockboxes are difficult to find in the stores. Therefore, medication lockboxes are available for purchase at the Oak Creek Health Department: \$26.75 for a medium lockbox (up to 24 average size bottles) and \$29.75 for a large lockbox (up to 36 average size bottles). Prices are subject to change. Cash or check accepted.

ONE TEXT OR CALL COULD



In 2012, 3,328 people were killed in crashes involving a distracted driver. One of the most alarming and widespread forms of distracted driving is cell phone usage. Texting involves taking your eyes off the road, your hands off the wheel, and your mind off the task of driving. The Oak Creek Health Department has joined NHTSA's campaign "One Text or Call Could Wreck it All" to decrease distracted driving in the City of Oak Creek. So the next time you are pressed for time, and it seems like multitasking in the car is the best decision, remember those 3,328 lives that were taken because someone decided they could do two things at once. SHOVEL YOUR FIRE HYDRANTS

The winter months bring a special concern to the Oak Creek Fire Department. Winter storms can often hide fire hydrants under a mountain of snow making them impossible to find quickly. In the event of a fire, firefighters have to locate and shovel out fire hydrants before hooking up to them. Precious time is lost. Please don't let your neighborhood hydrant remain "undercover".



We are asking that you help us by keeping the fire hydrant closest to your residence or business clear of snow. We need a 3 foot clearance on all sides. When shoveling snow be aware of vehicle traffic. Do not stand in the street and be careful not to slip and fall out into the roadway.

ASK THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

What should I do when I see an emergency vehicle in my rear-view mirror? When approached by an emergency vehicle from behind, slow down, pull your vehicle to the right. Then, when you can safely do so, come to a complete stop. This allows the fire engine, ambulance, or police car to have a clear path of travel in the left lane.

How many smoke detectors do I need in my home?

Smoke detectors should be placed on every floor of your home including the basement. It is especially important to have smoke detectors installed outside of each sleeping area and in the kitchen.



SENIOR FALL SAFETY

According to the Center for Disease Control, in 2005, 15,800 people 65 and older

died from injuries related to unintentional falls; about 1.8 million people 65 and older were treated in emergency departments for nonfatal injuries from falls, and more than 433,000 of these patients were hospitalized. Most of these falls can be prevented by following a few simple safety steps.

- Exercise regularly to increase strength and improve balance
- Have your eyes checked once a year
- Ask your doctor to review medications to reduce side effects and interactions
- · Improve lighting in the home
- Remove hazards such as rugs that could lead to falls
- · Install handrails in bathrooms

CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY

Carbon monoxide, an odorless, colorless gas, is a byproduct of the combustion of fossil fuels. When appliances such as furnaces, water heaters, dryers and stoves malfunction or are improperly vented, a buildup of carbon monoxide gas can occur. As this gas builds up in a home, occupants may experience headaches, nausea, dizziness, fatigue and confusion. At higher levels, carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms include vomiting, loss of consciousness, and even death. Now that the winter months are upon us, the Oak Creek Fire Department would like to remind residents that carbon monoxide detectors should be placed on each level of their home. In addition, they should have appliances inspected by a licensed professional.

HAVE TWO WAYS OUT

It's important that each member of your family knows at least two ways out of every room. That way, if one exit is blocked during a fire, there is another way for the occupant to escape to safety. Parents can reinforce this message with their children by creating a home fire escape plan. of every room, but also to establish a meeting place outside of your home. A meeting place is the location where the entire family knows to gather after they have exited the home.

FIREPLACE SAFETY



There is nothing better than building a fire in your fireplace on a cold, winter night. However, many house fires originate in fireplace chimneys. Please remember these safety tips to keep your family safe this winter.

- The damper must be fully open before starting a fire and left open until the fire is out. If a source for outside combustion air exists, be sure that it is open before you light the fire.
- Don't overload the fireplace. If you do, burning logs could roll out. Never use wet or green wood.
- Be sure to close the screen to prevent sparks from flying out into your living room. Close the glass doors to reduce heat loss from the room into the chimney only when your fire is almost out.
- Never start a fire with liquid fire starters, i.e. gasoline, kerosene, etc.
- Do not burn Christmas trees or a lot of paper in your fireplace. This type of fire, which gets very hot really quickly, can cause the joints of the chimney to separate or the metal to warp.
- Annual inspection and sweeping, when required, of your fireplace and chimney is recommended by the National Fire Protection Association and the Chimney Safety Institute of America. www.csia.org

OUTDOOR BUILDING PROJECTS

Spring is usually the time homeowners think about doing outdoor building projects. Many of these projects require permits. The City website has information, brochures and permit application forms to help get you started. They can be found under the Inspection Department tab at this online address:

The City requires permits for the following structures: fence, deck, pool, shed (greater than 120 square feet), detached garage, gazebo and pergola.

SETBACKS

The first step is to map out where in your yard the structure will be located. The distance from a lot line or house to an accessory structure is called a setback. Setback information is required for all accessory structures except fences. Fences can usually be built on the lot line. There are exceptions if a property has certain types of easements. More information on setbacks can be found in the Oak Creek Municipal Code, Chapter 17. Zoning Code, at this online address: http://www.oakcreekwi.org/images/downl oads/Chapter_17_Zoning_Code.pdf

To assist property owners in determining setbacks, the City may provide a copy of the, "plat of survey," or map of the lot, if one is on file. If no survey is on file, a printout from the City's Geographical Information System may be used when applying for a permit.

PLANS

A detailed drawing showing how the structure will be built is required, except for sheds, fences and pools.



The plan may be one that is drawn by the homeowner or a professional architect. Most home improvement stores offer

customized building plans for decks and other structures. If a hot tub is to be installed on a raised deck, structural calculations are required.

BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

BUILDING **PERMIT**

The 'City of Oak Creek Building Permit Application,'

form is used for the above listed projects, except for sheds and garages. Sheds and garages require a completed, 'Accessory Building Permit Application.' The shed information provided by the homeowner on the form will be accepted in lieu of plans; however, additional plans may be submitted. Homeowners who are doing the work themselves must sign a, 'Cautionary Statement to Owners Obtaining Building Permits.' Contractors doing work in the City must provide their Dwelling Contractor Certification number or BCR number, and, their Dwelling Contractor Qualifier number.

SUBMITTAL AND

When you are ready to apply subto apply, submit application form, plans and copy of survey to the Inspection Department. Fees are listed under the Department's tab on the City website. Fees may be paid at the time of application or after the permit is approved. The City accepts checks or cash for payment. Processing of the permit can take up to two weeks, and applications are reviewed in the order in which they are received.

Any electrical work, such as wiring for swimming pool pumps, requires a separate electrical permit. Either a homeowner or a contractor may obtain an electrical permit.

INSPECTIONS

Required inspections will be listed on the approved permit or an attached memo. The cost of inspections is included in the permit fee.

NATIVE PLANTINGS &



LOCAL NURSERIES

A native plant is one that grows naturally in southeastern Wisconsin before Europeans settled the area. Landscaping with native wildflowers and grasses is better for the environment since, once they're established, they do not need fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides or watering.

Native plants' deep roots help your garden absorb water - some roots go down 25 feet! These fantastic roots form deep channels that absorb rainwater. Some of the roots die each year and new roots grow. Decomposing roots make the soil more fertile and absorbent. The root systems hold soil together and help prevent erosion. Deep plant roots also create additional channels for stormwater to filter into ground.

Examples of native plants include flowering plants such as Asters, Coreopsis, Purple Coneflowers, Sunflowers, Blazing Stars, and Black-eyed Susans. Also, native grasses such as Bluestems and Prairie Dropseed can be an attractive low maintenance alternative and can add seasonal interest to a planting.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter parking restrictions are in effect

from December 1st until April 1st. During this time, there is no parking allowed on the



streets in the City of Oak Creek during the following hours:

Monday thru Friday 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

Saturday and Sunday 2:30 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

Permission may be granted by the Police Department (on a day-to-day basis) for exceptions on the restriction during emergencies, if a vehicle becomes disabled, or if there is an overnight guest. Please use the non-emergency number if you need permission – (414) 762-8200.

UTILITY PROBLEMS

During severe weather, the Police Department receives an abundance of telephone calls from residents wishing to report utility problems. These problems should be reported directly to the respective utility company at their 24-hour phone numbers. See back cover of "Acorn".

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

The blowing and/or shoveling of snow onto City streets are in violation of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code Section 6.24(c).

"Prohibited Placement. No person except the State, County or City shall deposit or cause to be deposited, upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public land, any snow or ice taken or removed from his premises. No person except the State, County, or City shall use private or public lands within the City as a place for the disposal or dumping of snow or ice from public or private property or from another municipality except with the permission of the owner."

Sidewalks are also required to be cleared of ice and snow per Section

6.24(a) within twenty-four (24) hours after such snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumulate. When ice has formed on any sidewalk, such that it cannot be removed, then the person responsible

shall prevent such ice from presenting a hazard to pedestrian traffic by the use of ashes,



sawdust, sand, salt or any other similar substance. Property owners are also required to keep mailboxes & fire hydrants on their property free and clear of all snow and ice per Section 6.24(d).

***BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2015, Advanced Disposal will be collecting both garbage & recycling. Again, they may be contacted at (262) 679-0860 for any collection issues, new carts or cart repairs.

RECYCLING YARD INFORMATION

The recycling yard hours are Tuesday, Friday & Saturdays, 8 am until 3 pm. In addition to the regular hours, the yard will be open Tuesday evenings ONLY until 8 pm starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September.

Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill and has City pick up of garbage may use the recycling yard. Occupants of condos or trailer parks that have private garbage pick up may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste ONLY with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

The recycling yard will be closed on the following holiday dates:

Good Friday - April 3, 2015

*NOTE-Effective December 1, 2009, shingles & roofing materials are no longer accepted at the recycling yard. Due to the elimination of roll-off dumpsters for garbage, all items, with the exception of sofas, mattresses & box springs, need to be 4' or less in length. All items need to fit into the compactors. A garbage truck is on site to compact sofas, mattresses & box springs.

All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15 per

appliance fee. Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers. A fee of \$7 per television will be charged for drop off. Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$3 per tire will be charged.

***USAgain now has a bin located at the yard for depositing textile items such as clothing, shoes, bedding, towels, curtains, handbags, backpacks, etc. and is located at the end of the garbage compactors. See yard attendant if you have any questions.

BRANCH PICK-UP DATES - 2015

Branches will be picked up beginning on the following dates:

Wed. April 1 Mon. June 1 Mon. August 3 Thurs. Oct. 1

To guarantee that your branches are picked up, you must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until the next date listed.

REMINDER: Branches must be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pick up brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

Branches may be brought to the recycling yard at 720 W. Puetz Road. The hours of operation are Tuesdays, Fridays & Saturdays, 8 am to 3 pm. There are extended hours on Tuesdays from the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday of September when the hours are 8 am to 8 pm.

Residents are required to have their items at the curb/roadside by 6:45 am on Friday, May 15 in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional **no charge** pickups until the fall clean-up on Monday, November 16. See Special Pick-Up section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you should miss the spring clean-up

SPECIAL PICK UPS

In addition to the fall & spring cleanups that are provided at NO CHARGE, the City of Oak Creek provides special pick-ups for residents for a fee of \$25 for the following items:

- Appliances* (\$15 additional fee will be charged for Freon appliances – refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditions & water coolers)
- Furniture
- Mattresses
- · Carpeting/Padding
- · Metals of any kind
- Televisions (\$7 additional fee for each television to be picked up)
- * Doors need to be removed from refrigerators and freezers

Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings **ONLY**. Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45 am on the scheduled Friday. Residents requesting special pick ups must *prepay their fees before noon on Thursday prior*, in order to be put on that Friday's pick up schedule.

Please note that special pick ups <u>will</u> <u>not</u> be done for the following: branches, yard waste, recyclables, contractor generated materials, hazardous waste, tire, & concrete/stone.

MULCH

Generally, from mid-April through mid-November, mulch is often available for free pick-up at the recycling yard. Residents may call the **Street Dept.** at **570-5682** to check availability &/or to be put on a list to have mulch delivered to their homes. The delivery fee is \$25 per load which is approximately 5 yards.

FOLLOWING OF SNOWPLOWS

WI Statute Chapter 346.915 prohibits a person operating a vehicle from following an official snowplow, equipped



& engaged in snow & ice control/removal, closer than 75 feet when on any highway having a posted speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less.

Highways with posted speeds of more than 35 miles per hour require a minimum of 200 feet following distance. It also requires a person operating a vehicle to stop not less than 20 feet from a snowplow at an intersection & to remain stopped until the snowplow resumes motion.

POLICY FOR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY WITHIN STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY CAUSED BY SNOW REMOVAL

In kind replacement of post &/or mailbox, or a reasonable alternative may be reimbursed. Maximum payment to claimant will be \$100 per event. No labor costs will be paid. Damage to gang mailboxes must be made by each property owner to receive reimbursement. Maximum payment will again be \$100 per event, per owner but will only include one post reimbursement. Claimant shall bring damaged parts & paid receipt for replacement parts to the Street Department at 800 W. Puetz Road. Date & approximate time of damage needs to be reported. Damage to other appurtenances installed within the City right-of-way (i.e. walls, planters, sprinkler heads, etc.) will not be considered for cost of replacement. Grass damaged within curb area will be replaced by the Street Department in spring. Temporary mailboxes on a stand are available for any post & box destroyed during plowing. They must be returned after permanent mailbox is installed or by May 1, whichever comes first. Only a limited number of temporary boxes are available. It is the homeowner's responsibility to pick up & return temporary mailboxes to the Street Department.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING CART INFORMATION

Per Section 8.41 of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code, household combined garbage not placed in a container provided by the City of Oak Creek or its contractor, will not be collected. Also, all containers shall be stored upon private property & screened from public view and shall not be stored in the front yard setback.

Per Section 8.42, garbage shall be placed for collection no later than 6:45 am of the morning of collection. Then per Section 8.43, no carts shall be placed at the curb any earlier than 6:45 pm on the day prior to the scheduled collection day. Also, residents shall restore containers to their original storage location after collection on the same day as the collection.

Through 12/31/14, you may purchase an additional garbage cart from the Street Department. These carts will become your property. Contact the Street Department at 570-5682 for pricing. Contact the Street Department for any repairs or replacements needed for your blue garbage carts.





STREET TREE PRUNING - PART III

The City of Oak Creek has approximately 9,000 street trees and an additional 1,000 park landscape trees. Compared with older cities, we have a fairly young-skewed street tree population with an average diameter in the 12-inch range. Diameter is measured at 4.5 feet above the ground, termed Diameter at Breast Height or dbh. A standard measure helps to compare volume which can be used to estimate time and work spent on tree care.

A young-skewed urban forest requires more frequent pruning than larger street trees, however less time is taken at each stop. Our pruning cycle goals - the frequency of pruning - are every three years for trees under 12-inch diameter and every 5+ years for trees larger than that, with some adjustment for species specific needs. For instance, the growth rate of an elm far exceeds that of a Japanese tree lilac. In order to keep on this pruning schedule, we need to prune close to 3,000 trees per year, skewed heavy to the younger trees. We constantly monitor for pruning needs and appreciate reports from residents or city staff.

Ed Gilman, PhD, University of Florida, arboriculture research expert said, "Properly pruning young and middleaged trees to form a strong structure decreases the need for pruning when trees are mature. Because smaller trees are less expensive to prune than large trees, pruning budgets go farther. It pays to solve structural problems while the tree is young and branches are small than when the tree is mature and branches are much larger." Gilman's pruning books are exceptional resources. Along with proper tree establishment, pruning is the most important aspect of maintaining an urban forest. In a normal year, without dire infestations like emerald ash borer to contend with, the lion's share of our time is spent pruning.

STRUCTURAL PRUNING (CONTINUED FROM ARTICLE I AND II)

Arboriculture research and experience have determined that a straight central leader is the longest lasting tree form. Central leaders have less competition and tension between branches helping trees to weather winds, storms and heavy snow loads. Good long-term pruning selects for branch attachments that are strong. The strongest branch attachments are at a 90 degree angle from the trunk. Small diameter branches, relative to the trunk, are less likely to fail simply due to weight distribution.



This bur oak has an exemplary central leader and branching. The little jog near the top is of no concern. Once the tree puts on enough volume it will straighten up and that little curvature will not be noticeable. Also note the wide, strong branch angles where the branches attach to the main stem.

By contrast, a tight angled branch attachment is weak and far more likely to fail. Sometime after we have high winds note that the branches that tear often come from tight attachments or less than 90 degree angles. Some trees tend to produce poor branch angles by genetic predisposition. Green ash, silver maple and littleleaf linden are noted for branch failure due to week unions (and fast growth).

The intensely crowded branch structure of this tree will result in multiple problems that cannot be corrected.

Early crown thinning (removal of select branches in the tree crown)



could have corrected this type of crowding. Notice the poor pruning cuts that have not properly closed over?

Branches with strong attachments create a ridge of raised bark at the intersection of the branch and the trunk called the branch bark ridge. In weak attachments, the ridge rolls inward and the bark grows into the branch attachment, under the surface. A branch bark ridge that grows upward (excluded) tends strong whereas a branch bark ridge that



grows inward (included) tends week. (PHOTO DIA-GRAM 3; USDA Brochure NA-FR-01-95)

Two competing branches or codominant branches, should not be allowed to compete. The long-term result is tension that eventually produces included bark. Eventually the pressure causes the wood to separate. It is a matter of time before a cracked tree fails.

Many people like the appearance of a forked or multi-stemmed tree. It seems insignificant when a tree is young but when a tree matures it will likely cause early decline.

This tree was in perfect health when removed except for the decayed wood in the seam. A large heavily-branched crown helped to put pressure on poor branch attachment until the included bark accumulated and caused the stem to separate.
