## A LETTER FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Residents of the City of Oak Creek,

As summer winds down and fall fast approaches, the City of Oak Creek has had many things to celebrate and has much to look forward to in fall of 2017.

On the community side, this summer Oak Creek added some new events throughout the City. The Celebrations Commission held its first annual Drexel Town Square (DTS) Summer Soulstice. It featured live music, food, and drink. They also put on the City's single largest event, the annual Fourth of July parade. Our Tourism Commission added events to our City calendar. We also helped Master Lock unlock their new world headquarters here in Oak Creek, we celebrated GE and PPG expansions, and broke ground for the new longawaited IKEA. Our City staff continues daily to look at new potential businesses and developers considering Oak Creek as their next potential location. Work will continue through the summer on the first wave of amenities at Lake Vista Park with many of the facilities set for completion sometime this fall. Residents will have the opportunity to access and enjoy Oak Creek's lakefront for the first time in decades. Lake Vista Park serves as the latest example of how Oak Creek is reinvesting in itself and adding and preserving green space to better serve our community for years to come.

# 2017 PROPERTY TAX BILLS

2017 property tax bills will be mailed on or before the third Monday of December. Please be sure to read the brochure included with your tax bill or check the City's website for changes and payment information.

# LOTTERY AND GAMING CREDIT

Applications are available on our website. If you received the 2016 Lottery and Gaming Credit on or before January 31, 2017, you do NOT need to recertify for 2017. Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

2016: The 2016 Lottery and Gaming Credit is \$112.49. If you qualify and did not receive the credit, mail a completed LATE Lottery and Gaming Credit application, with a copy of your tax bill, to the State of Wisconsin Department of Revenue at the address shown on the application by OCTOBER 1, 2017. You must also complete and return the 2017 Lottery and Gaming Credit application.

2017: Complete and return the 2017 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office by November 30, 2017 for the credit to appear on your 2017 and future Real Estate Tax bills.

### WINTER PARKING

### **SCHOOL BUS LIGHTS**

School is starting! Motorists are reminded to use caution when approaching school buses. Motorists should stop their vehicle not less than 20 feet in front of or behind a bus when it is displaying flashing red warning lights and remain stopped until the bus resumes motion or extinguishes the flashing lights. This does not apply to vehicles traveling in the opposite direction on a divided highway with a median. School bus operators may submit a written report to the Police Department of those vehicles illegally passing a school bus with its red warning lights flashing. Upon receipt of this information, the Police Department will prepare a traffic citation and serve it upon the owner of the vehicle in violation. The fine for such violation is \$240. Help keep our children safe this school year-stop when you approach a bus flashing its red warning lights!

### NATIONAL NIGHT OUT -THANK YOU

The Oak Creek Police Department and National Night Out Committee would like to thank all of the citizens who attended this year's Oak Creek National Night Out at the American Legion Post 434. ### HALLOWEEN SAFETY

With Halloween just around the corner, we would like to remind parents of a few tips to keep your children safe while trick-or-treating:

- Children should always trickor-treat with an adult or older sibling.
- Costumes should be reflective, flame retardant, and should fit properly to prevent trips and falls.
- Consider wearing makeup instead of a mask which may hinder or restrict your child's vision.
- Stay in neighborhoods with people whom you are familiar with.
- Remind children not to eat their goodies before an adult can check them.
- Eat only unopened candies and those in original wrappers only.
- Put your outside house light on to show that your family is participating in trick-or treating.

- Remove objects from your yard that might present a hazard to trick-or-treaters.
- Keep an eye out for suspicious activities or persons in your neighborhood.

#### FIREARMS SAFETY

As hunting season approaches, it is important to remind residents of the importance of firearms safety. The majority of accidents that involve a firearm occur in the house and are a result of negligent handling, improper storage and carelessness. The accidents usually end tragically with serious injuries or even death. Firearms accidents are preventable by following these few simple rules:

- KNOW how your firearm operates and PRACTICE safe handling procedures.
- TREAT every firearm as if it were loaded.
- ALWAYS point a firearm in a safe direction.
- Use your firearm only for its intended purpose.
- NEVER rely on the firearm's safety latch.
- NEVER leave a firearm unattended.
- LOCK, TRANSPORT and STORE your firearm(s) properly.
- NEVER use your firearm after consuming alcohol or drugs.
- Make sure that each family member takes a firearms safety course offered by the Wis. DNR.

# RAKING OF LEAVES INTO THE STREET IS PROHIBITED



The City of Oak Creek prohibits property owners from placing leaves, grass, yard waste or rubbish in the street, alley or sidewalk areas (Ordinance No. 1984, Municipal Code Section 8.40/ Wis. Statutes Sec. 66.66(16).

#### **LEAF DISPOSAL**

Oak Creek **does NOT** pick up leaves curbside. Residents may bring their leaves to the drop-off site at 720 W. Puetz Road, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday from 8 a.m. - 3 p.m. or Tuesday evenings until 8 p.m. through September.

#### **MULCH**

Mulch is often available for **free pickup** at the Recycling Yard. Residents may **call 570-5682** to be put on a list for delivery of mulch for \$25 per load (approximately 5 yards) or to check availability. \$5 administration fee may apply.

# GARBAGE & RECYCLING COLLECTION INFO FOR UPCOMING HOLIDAYS

When there is a holiday during the regular collection days of Monday through Thursday, from the holiday day forward, Advanced Disposal will be doing your pickups one day later than normal, for the holiday week ONLY. The regular schedule will then resume the next week. Reminder signs are no longer being placed street side.

#### RECYCLING YARD INFORMATION

Location: 720 W. Puetz Road

**Hours:** Tuesday, Fridays & Saturdays, 8 a.m. - 3 p.m. In addition to the regular hours, the yard is open Tuesday evenings ONLY until 8 p.m. starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September when the hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. .

Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill may use the recycling yard. Occupants of manufactured home parks that have private garbage pickup may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste ONLY with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

#### **Recycling Yard Does Not Accept:**

- NO items may exceed 4' in length with the exception of branches, furniture, appliances & metals.
- NO contractor vehicles will be allowed in to the yard.
- The yard does NOT accept shingles, roofing materials, grass, gas, medical or hazardous waste, paints or vehicle salvage.

#### **BRANCH PICK-UP DATES FOR 2017**

Branches will be picked up beginning at 6:45 a.m. on the following dates:

- Friday, September 1
- Wednesday, November 1

#### To guarantee that your branches are picked up:

- You must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above, but no earlier than 2 weeks prior.
- Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until the next date listed.
- Branches are to be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road.
- Roots should be separate from the brush pile.
- The Street Department WILL NOT pickup brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

**Note:** Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard at 720 W. Puetz Road during the time/hours listed.

## **FALL CLEAN-UP BEGINS NOVEMBER 15, 2017**

Fall Clean-Up by the Street Department will begin on Wed., November 15, 2017, for residential homes and condos that have City provided garbage/recycling pick up. There is **no charge** for this pick up.

Items that will be picked up are:

- Garden Clippings (excluding leaves, grass and branches)
- Furniture
- Wood
- Appliances (Remove doors from refrigerators & freezers).
- Construction Materials (not resulting from a contractor)
- Metal
- Mattresses
- **Televisions**
- Carpeting/Rugs

Items that will not be picked up are:

- **Paints**
- **Tires**
- **Batteries**
- Hazardous Materials
- Grass Clippings
- Leaves/Branches
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Concrete/Stone/Dirt

#### Fall Clean Up Information:

- Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on November 15 in order to be guaranteed a pick up.
- Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick-ups until the spring cleanup.

Spring clean-up begins Tuesday, May 15, 2018

#### SPECIAL PICK UPS

In addition to the fall & spring cleanups that are provided at no charge, the City provides special pick-ups for residential homes or condos that have City provided garbage & recycling pickup.

The fee for this service is \$25 and includes pick up of the following items:

- Appliances (\$15 additional fee will be charged for freon appliances)
- Furniture
- Mattresses
- Carpeting/Padding
- Metals of any kind
- Televisions (\$7/each TV)
- Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings ONLY.
- Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45 a.m. on the scheduled Friday.
- Doors must be removed from refrigerators & freezers.
- Residents requesting special pick-ups must prepay their fees before noon on Thursday prior to pick up by cash or check only in order to be put on that Friday's pick up schedule.

- 4. Include any additional fees for freon appliances & televisions.

Please note that special pick-ups will **not** be done for the following items:

- Branches
- Yard Waste/Garden Clippings
- Recyclables
- Contractor generated materials
- Hazardous Waste
- Tires
- Concrete/Stone/Dirt

Refer to the Ordinance, Municipal Code or State Statute listed for more information on the below topics.

#### **USAGAIN**

There is a bin located at the recycling yard for depositing textile items such as clothing, shoes, bedding, towels, curtains, handbags, backpacks, etc. It is located at the end of the garbage compactor. See yard attendant if you have any questions.



### SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

The blowing and/or shoveling of snow onto City streets is a violation of the Oak Creek Municipal Code and is subject to a ticket and fine (Section 6.24(c)/Wis. Statutes Sec. 66.60(16).

Property owners are also required to keep the mailboxes and fire hydrants located on their property clear of snow and ice (Municipal Code Section 6.24(d)).

# GARBAGE & RECYCLING CART INFORMATION

- Household combined garbage not placed in a container provided by the City or its contractor, will not be collected.
- All containers shall be stored upon private property & shall not be stored in the front yard setback (Section 8.41).
- Garbage shall be placed for collection no later than 6:45 a.m. of the morning of collection (Section 8.42).
- No carts shall be placed at the curb any earlier than 6:45 p.m. on the day prior to the scheduled collection day.
- Resident shall restore containers to their original storage location after collection on the same day as the collection (Section 8.43).

#### **OAK CREEK URBAN FOREST**

An urban forest is a complex resource with multiple owners, a variety of landscape types and site-specific management objectives. The Oak Creek Urban Forest can be viewed as a puzzle wherein individual canopy contributions are the puzzle pieces.

The Oak Creek Urban Forest is comprised of:

- Original native trees and woodlands
- Trees naturally established since settlement (ca. 1840)
- Trees planted on private properties (residential or commercial i.e.)
- Municipal trees including street, park, rural right-of-way and woodland trees

As trees in groups one and two are lost, the importance of trees in groups three and four are increased.

# FORESTRY VISION STATEMENT

To increase community value through building appreciation and awareness of the urban forest, modeling high quality tree care, demonstrating sustainable, long-term urban forestry practices, and establishing and preserving a quality urban tree canopy enriched with natural heritage features.

# VALUE OF THE URBAN FOREST

Trees in Oak Creek affect the lives of those that live, work and visit the city, both directly and indirectly. Tree lined streets leave positive impressions about communities.

Commonly, we expect city trees to provide the following benefits:

- clean air
- clean water
- general shade, shade over streets/paved areas
- reduced urban temperatures
- increased aesthetic enjoyment/ relaxation

- reduced energy use/save money
- reduced noise
- reduced glare and reflection/ screening
- reduced greenhouse gases
- increased wildlife habitat
- reduced runoff and erosion
- increased educational opportunities
- increased emotional and spiritual wellbeing

Less commonly realized benefits of urban trees include:

- increased real estate values up to 25 percent
- decreased storm water management costs (enough to be considered part of the storm water management plans for many cities)
- opportunity to model high standards for tree care
- decreased driving speeds
- decreased crime
- decreased medical costs
- increased job satisfaction
- reduced VOC's (volatile organic compounds caused from evaporation of substances from cars baking in the sun)
- increased sense of community
- increased commerce (strategically placed trees in shopping areas keep people shopping longer and willing to pay more for items offered within)

Finally, the urban forest has measurable values of its own. Some statistics site values in terms of savings (i.e. air conditioning, heating, storm water management, medical cost savings) while others reference a per tree figure often compiled with an equation. Single specimen or historic trees have been known to be valued at upwards of \$35,000.

#### **FIRE PREVENTION WEEK**

#### October 8-14

This annual event raises awareness for fire safety throughout the country. Following a declaration by President Woodrow Wilson in 1920, Fire Prevention Week has been recognized each year since 1922. It commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. However, on the same days, the largest forest fire in American history occurred in Peshtigo, Wisconsin. By the time the Peshtigo fire was completely extinguished, 16 towns were burned down and 1,152 people were killed.

This year, as in years past, the Oak Creek Fire Department will be visiting Oak Creek grade schools to spread the fire prevention message to the "Junior Firefighters." This year's theme is "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!". Everyone needs to have and escape plan. See you in October!

#### SHOVEL YOUR HYDRANTS

Please shovel snow from around fire hydrants located on your property. The Fire Department needs 3 feet of clearance on all sides of the hydrants to properly connect fire hoses. When there is a fire, time is of the utmost importance. Each minute that firefighters have to spend shoveling around a hydrant is another minute that could be spent fighting the fire.

# CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY

Carbon monoxide, an odorless, colorless gas, is a byproduct of the combustion of fossil fuels. When appliances such as furnaces, water heaters, dryers and stoves malfunction or are improperly vented, a buildup of carbon monoxide gas can occur. As this gas builds up in a home, occupants may experience headaches, nausea, dizziness, fatigue and confusion. At higher levels, carbon monoxide poisoning

symptoms include vomiting, loss of consciousness, and even death. As the winter months draw upon us, the Oak Creek Fire Department would like to remind residents that carbon monoxide detectors should be placed on each level of their home. In addition, they should have appliances inspected by a licensed professional.

# OPENING BURNING REGULATIONS



Prior to the ignition of any open burning you are required to notify the Oak Creek Fire Dispatch Center at (414) 762-8200 and provide the

following information:

- Responsible party telephone number
- Address of open burning
- Beginning time of burning
- Ending time of burning

The following safe burning guidelines must be followed:

- Wind velocity must be less than 10 miles per-hour. (Weather information 936-1212)
- The size of the burning pile shall not exceed 4 feet by 4 feet and 3 feet in height.
- Flammable or combustible liquids shall not be used to ignite or accelerate the fire at any point.
- The fire must be constantly supervised by a competent person, at least 16 years of age, until the fire is extinguished.
- The person supervising the fire shall have a means to extinguish the fire, such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher.
- The pile to be burned shall be a minimum of 50 feet from a

- building or vehicle and 25 feet from a roadway, highways or other thoroughfares.
- If the smoke travels in such a manner to obscure any public roadway, highway, or other public thoroughfare, the fire shall be extinguished.
- If the fire or smoke from the fire becomes a hazard or nuisance to your neighbors you will be required to extinguish the fire.
- Please consult with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for burning regulations:

 Remember the person starting the fire is legally responsible for any damage caused by the fire.

# Wisconsin law prohibits anyone from burning the following materials:

- Recyclable paper or cardboard
- Wet, combustible rubbish, such as wet cardboard or paper
- Oily substances, such as oily or greasy rags, oil filters, etc.
- Asphalt such as asphalt shingles or tar paper.
- Plastics of any kind, including plastic bottles and plastic bags.
- Rubber products, including tires and hoses.
- Painted or treated wood.

#### **FERAL CATS**

Feral cats are a manmade problem caused by owners who fail to spay or neuter their pet, abandon them, or allow them to become lost. Some people consider them nuisances while others view them as animals that need to be cared for.

Feral cat populations can be dealt with in one of four ways: 1. trap and kill, 2. trap and remove, 3. trap, neuter, and return (TNR); and 4. doing nothing or withholding food from the cats. According to the Humane Society, there are many benefits to TNR including reducing the number of free-roaming cats by ending breeding, and stopping many nuisance cat behaviors like spraying, yowling and fighting. Through TNR, cats are vaccinated and sterilized, and unhealthy cats are removed.

We receive complaints from homeowners about feral cats using flower and vegetable gardens as litter boxes, yowling, feeding stations attracting wildlife, the growth of the feral cat population, and fighting with smaller domesticated animals such as dogs. To address complaints we follow Oak Creek City Ordinances 7.49 and 8.03. If you are caring for feral cats in the neighborhood, we encourage you to speak with the WI Humane Society for help and talk/work with your neighbors. Many neighborhoods have adopted strategies to create a balance between providing care for feral cats and decreasing the feral cat population.

#### **NATIVE PLANTS**

A native plant is one that grew naturally in southeastern Wisconsin before Europeans settled the area. Landscaping with native wildflowers and grasses is better for the environment since, once they're established, they do not need fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides or watering.

Native plants' deep roots help your garden absorb water - some roots go down 25 feet! These fantastic roots form deep channels that absorb rainwater. Some of the roots die each year and new roots grow. Decomposing roots make the soil more fertile and absorbent. The root systems hold soil together and help prevent erosion. Deep plant roots also create additional channels for stormwater to filter into ground.

Examples of native plants include flowering plants such as Asters, Coreopsis, Purple Coneflowers, Sunflowers, Blazing Stars, Black-eyed Susans. Also, native grasses such as Bluestems and Prairie Dropseed can be an attractive low maintenance alternative and can add seasonal interest to a planting.

# ASSESSOR'S OFFICE UPDATE-2017 REVALUATION

The Assessor's Office conducted another citywide revaluation for 2017. The City began performing annual revaluations starting with the 2014 assessment year, and will be conducting another revaluation for the 2018 assessment year. These annual revaluations help to eliminate large changes in assessed values and shifts in tax burdens that may result if the City performed revaluations every three to four years.

Changes in the real estate market occur naturally and the amount of this natural change varies differently between property types and classes of property. For example, single family homes may appreciate or depreciate in value two or three percent per year while commercial properties may appreciate/ depreciate at a greater or lesser rate. In this scenario, if residential single family homes appreciated two percent per year over four years, and commercial properties appreciated one percent a year over four years, and the City did not perform a revaluation until that fourth year, residential properties would receive an eight percent increase in value while commercial properties would receive a four percent increase. By performing annual revaluations, the City avoids these large shifts in tax burden in a single year after a four year waiting period.

The 2017 revaluation was conducted using current sales that occurred in the last half of 2015 through December 2016. The goal of the 2017 revaluation was to estimate each property's fair market value as of January 1, 2017 based on current sales of comparable properties. For commercial properties, current income (current market rents) and expense information was also used to estimate the fair market value.

Property owners were mailed a Notice of Assessment in April 2017.

That Notice of Assessment displayed the new 2017 assessed value as well as the 2016 assessed value and instructions on how to contact the Assessor's Office if one wished to discuss the 2017 value. The Notice of Assessment also included instructions on how to appeal the assessment to the Board of Review which met on June 21, 2017.

The impact of property taxes on individual properties as a result of the revaluation was not known at the time this article was written. Please see below for some important notes relating to property taxes in the year of a revaluation.

- There are six taxing authorities on the tax bill; The State of Wisconsin, Milwaukee County, City of Oak Creek, Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC), The Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and the Oak Creek-Franklin Joint School District.
- Each taxing authority establishes their budget during the summer and fall months annually.
- An increase in assessed value does not necessarily mean an increase in property taxes in the year of a revaluation. In a hypothetical scenario, if all assessments in the City increased by 5% for the January 1, 2017 assessment year and each taxing authority needed

the same amount of money to operate in 2017 as they did in 2016, the tax rate would decrease by 5% resulting in no change in taxes. Likewise, overall decreases in assessed value do not necessarily equate to decreases in taxes.

- In the above scenario, property owners whose assessed value increased more than 5% would be paying more tax in 2017 and those with values that increased less than 5% or had a decrease in assessed value would be paying less.
- State Statutes indicate that property taxes should be based on the current market value of each property (agricultural use land excluded). A revaluation redistributes taxes based on the current market value of each property. Paying more or less in property taxes in the year of the revaluation does not mean the assessment is incorrect. The assessor's role is to estimate the fair market value of each property based on current sales. If current sales support the 2017 assessed value, an owner is paying only their fair share of taxes for 2017 regardless of what they paid in 2016.

## NEW ONLINE CITY MAPPING & INFORMATION SYSTEMS

Have you wanted to find out what zoning district your house was in? How about where a sewer or water line may be located? Or maybe find out what Aldermanic District you reside. The Oak Creek Information Technology Department and Ruekert-Mielke have worked in tandem to create a new Geographic Information System (GIS) Web application. This application allows residents to search for information based on a parcel number, owner name, or address and produce a map illustrating the information.

This allows city staff and citizens to more easily access a wealth of information about any parcel of land in Oak Creek such as zoning, value, utility service areas and aerial views. Specific property information can be retrieved, such as Certified Survey Maps and legal descriptions. Information can be accessed from the comfort of your home, computer or mobile device.

# CITY ZONING REGULATIONS ARE GOING ONLINE

Ever since Oak Creek adopted zoning regulations in 1956 to guide growth and development, they have been in paper format. That's about to change.

Recognizing that zoning regulations can be somewhat confusing and hard to navigate, the City teamed up with Ce Planning Studio, a local planning consultant, to build an online zoning portal using the ZoningHub platform.

"Although the site is not online yet, we are eager to launch the new site which highlights the key parts of the zoning code in a user-friendly and interactive platform" said Carolyn Esswein of Ce Planning Studio. LLC.

Doug Seymour, Director of

Community Development notes, "Even though the zoning requirements aren't changing, the website improves how the key parts of the code are presented and accessed."

The website will be easy to use because it focuses on those parts of the zoning code that matter the most to most of the people.

The interactive zoning map is especially powerful. Residents, property owners, realtors, and others can use this feature to easily find where they can locate a new business in the City, or how a parcel can be used or further developed.

With just a few clicks, anyone can quickly answer these most commonly asked questions.

The website will also be a great resource for residents to keep track of development projects as they move through the various review procedures. Residents and others can sign up to get eAlerts when a new development application is submitted for local review. Subscribers will get automated emails that match their criteria.

"We expect customer satisfaction will improve and people will see our commitment to transparency in the decision-making process," said Doug Seymour. "We also hope the website will help people move ahead with development projects to build our local economy while protecting Oak Creek's special character."

The site is expected to launch this fall.



## Is he/she old enough?

Age requirements are as of the date of the first class, unless otherwise specified and are designed to provide the best and safest environment for the children. Please do not request to have your child put in a class he/she does not meet the age requirement for.

#### How much is it?

Fees and charges are assessed based on the cost of the program. Resident families needing financial assistance for their children to participate are encouraged to contact the office at 766-7920.

The resident fee applies to any person whose primary residence is within the Oak Creek city limits at the time of registration and children in the Oak Creek-Franklin School District.

#### **Transfers and Refunds**

Transfers will be made at no charge.

Refunds will be made upon request until 1/3 of the scheduled classes have been held, except as noted. Refunds are issued based on your original payment method. A \$3 service fee will be charged on each refund. Avoid the service fee by requesting credit to your account in place of a refund.

## Can I stay and watch?

Only registered participants are permitted in classrooms during instruction. This avoids distractions and interruptions in instruction, and allows adults to participate in an adult-only atmosphere.

You are welcome to discuss your child's progress before or after each class and attend the open house held on the final class date.

## Make ups and cancellations

Make up for missed classes is not available nor may participants attend classes other than the one they are registered for.

Activities cancelled by the Department will be rescheduled, if possible. If a class is unable to be rescheduled, no refunds will be issued.




