HEALTH DEPARTMENT

BOARD OF HEALTH OPENING

The Oak Creek Board of Health has an opening for a citizen member, which is a three year appointment. The role of the Board of Health is to enact or recommend policies that serve the interest of the public's health. Medical or environmental background is preferred. Interested parties must fill out the City of Oak Creek Board/Commission/Committee Application. An application is available at the Clerk's Office, on the website at www.oakcreekwi.org, or by calling the Health Department at 768-6525.

COMMUNITY HEALTH PLAN

The Oak Creek Health Department is mandated to conduct a community assessment and develop a health plan. The Oak Creek Health Department, in partnership with Aurora Health Care, conducted a community health survey to learn more about the general health of Oak Creek residents & their health-related behaviors. The next step is to develop a health plan. We are now recruiting Oak Creek residents to assist the Health Department in identifying health priorities for 2009-2013 Oak Creek Health Plan. OAK CREEK HEALTH DEPARTMENT WILL BE OFFERING FREE SHORT-TERM RADON KITS IN LATE JANUARY 2008

Radon is a radioactive gas. It comes from the natural decay of uranium that is found in nearly all soils. It typically moves up through the ground to the air above & into your home through cracks & other holes in the foundation. Your home traps radon inside, where it can build up. Any home may have a radon problem. This means new & old homes, well-sealed & drafty homes, & home with our without basements. Testing is the only way to know if you & your family are at risk from radon. If you are interested in obtaining a free radon kit, please stop in the Oak Creek Health Department; proof of residency is required.

DID YOU KNOW...?

STAPH or Staphylococcus aureus is a bacterium that is commonly found in the nose & on the skin of healthy people. It is estimated that 30 percent of the population carry staph, but may not cause an infection. Any break in the skin, including a scrape, scratch or cut can allow Staph to enter into the body & may cause an infection. Staph bacteria are one of the most common causes of skin infections in the United States (www.cdc.gov). Most of these skin infections are minor, such as pimples or boils, however staph infections can also be red, painful, swollen, or have pus or other drainage. It is up to your doctor to decide your treatment. Unfortunately, some staph infections are resistant to antibiotics such as methicillin. This resistant staph infection is called Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus (MRSA).

TO HELP PREVENT STAPH OR MRSA INFECTIONS:

- Keep your hand clean by washing with soap & water or use hand sanitizers
- ▼ Keep cuts & scrapes clean &covered with a bandage until healed
- ✓ Avoid contact with other people's wounds or bandages
- Avoid sharing personal items such as towels, razors, or soap bars

IF YOU HAVE A STAPH INFECTION:

- ✓ Cover your wound
- ✓ Put dirty dressings in the garbage unless dressing is saturated with drainage, then place it in a plastic bag before placing in your garbage
- If you are given an antibiotic, take all of the doses, even if the infection is getting better, unless your doctor tells you to stop taking it

FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT

FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT: PROTECT YOURSELF!

Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding and keeping housing much more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity – the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford – is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- RaceColor
- Sex

• Disability

- National origin/Ancestry
- ReligionMarital status
- Sexual orientationLawful source of income
- Age
- Family status (household composition, including presence of children)

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

METROPOLITAN MILWAUKEE FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL

In this day & age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle & difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, because they have kids or because they have a disability.

The following are some possible "red flags" that may indicate illegal discrimination:

- You called about an apartment for rent. You were told that it has been rented, but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, & the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along.

- A landlord or apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- You are told of extremely long waiting lists.
- You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibility criteria, but the provider won't tell you what the eligibility requirements are.
- A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent reason.
- Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are ways to address the problem. Victims of housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court.

If you have any questions regarding housing discrimination, fair housing laws & what your options may be for pursuing a complaint of housing discrimination, call the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council at 278-1240.

The Fair Housing Council offers many helpful services, including:

- Counseling for persons alleging housing discrimination.
- Investigations on behalf of victims of housing discrimination.
- Assistance in filing fair housing complaints with an administrative agency or in a court of law.

In addition, the Fair Housing Council provides educational presentations to neighborhood groups, civic & religious organizations, social service agencies, community centers & other groups that are interested in learning more about fair housing law & housing discrimination.

CITY TREASURER'S OFFICE

2007 REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX BILLS

Avoid delays in processing your payment, which could result in delinquent tax, by reading this important information. Also, please take the time to read the brochure you receive with your tax bill for more up to date information. Additional information and FAQ's is available on our website (www.oakcreekwi.org, City Departments, Treasurer's Office). For questions call the Treasurer's Office at (414) 768-6501.

PERMANENT ADDRESS CHANGES call our Assessor's Office at (414) 768-6506. No changes are made by the Treasurer's Office.

SPECIAL MAILING ADDRESS call the Treasurer's Office by DECEMBER 3rd (must be done annually, even if you requested a special mailing in the past).

CHECK(s) make payable to Treasurer or City of Oak Creek. No third party checks accepted (exception – escrow checks made payable to, and endorsed by, taxpayers). DO NOT STAPLE to, or send correspondence with, your payment and DO NOT COMBINE with other payments. Checks not properly completed or endorsed may be returned unprocessed and your taxes could become delinquent. Checks returned from the bank for any reason are subject to a \$25.00 recovery fee and payment is void. A full replacement payment plus separate recovery fee, with cash or certified funds, must be received by the original due date to avoid interest and penalties. ESCROW ACCOUNTS - check your agreement or call your bank to verify timely payments.

PAYMENT OPTIONS - CREDIT CARD

We are pleased to announce the availability of credit card payments for payment of real estate taxes and personal property taxes. In cooperation with the City of Oak Creek, Official Payments Corporation offers individuals and businesses the opportunity to pay property tax by way of a credit card by telephone or directly over the Internet. This service is safe, reliable, and in accordance with all state and government regulations. In order to process your payment, Official Payments Corporation, the credit card service provider, charges a convenience fee based on the amount of the transaction, currently 2.75% (\$1.00 minimum fee) subject to change without notice.

Easy Payment via Telephone or Internet (We <u>cannot</u> accept credit card payments in person; however, we will have a computer available at City Hall).

To pay by telephone call toll-free 1-800-272-9829 (Please enter Jurisdiction Code 6717 when prompted) or visit www.officialpayments.com to pay taxes over the Internet (link also available on the City's website at www.oakcreekwi.org). You will be asked to enter information such as: type of tax (Real Estate - 7 to 10 digit parcel

numbers) or (Personal Property -6 digit parcel numbers, for businesses only), total of your payment, parcel number (located in the upper right hand corner of your tax bill), and credit card information. Please have your tax bill and credit card available.

The system will tell you the total of your payment, including the appropriate fee; obtain approval of the charge and issue an onscreen confirmation number and a printable digital receipt. Confirmation is emailed to users who request it. The charge will also appear on your credit card statement: the tax amount will appear on one line and the convenience fee amount on a separate line.

ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31 ONLY to: City of Oak Creek, P.O. Box 1042, Milwaukee, WI 53201. DO NOT use the green envelope from previous years and DO NOT mail to the P.O. BOX AFTER JANUARY 31 or it will be returned to sender unprocessed and your taxes could become delinquent.

ON OR AFTER FEBRUARY IST to: Treasurer, City of Oak Creek, 8640 S. Howell Ave., Oak Creek, WI 53154. Payments by mail are TIMELY if ALL of the following criteria are met:

- * it is mailed to the City of Oak Creek in a <u>properly addressed</u> envelope,
- *postmarked before midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment,
- * with postage prepaid, and
- * is received by the proper official not more than 5 days after the prescribed date for making the payment.

Payments postmarked by December 31st but received January 1st or later will be receipted as January; the receipt note will reflect a December Postmark.

DRIVE-UP 24-HOUR DEPOSITORY, located at City Hall on the east side of the south parking lot. NO CASH PLEASE!

To receive a RECEIPT for payment made via US mail or depository, please include your original tax bill, a copy of your tax bill or a self-addressed envelope with your payment. Your tax bill and receipt will be mailed to the address on the tax bill unless a self-addressed envelope is enclosed with payment.

IN PERSON AT THE FOLLOWING FIVE TRI CITY BANK LOCATIONS THROUGH JANUARY 31ST ONLY. You will receive a RECEIPT from the bank. With proper identification, IMMEDIATE REFUND FOR OVERPAYMENT is given at the bank.

- * Cash refunds will be given <u>up to \$20</u> on escrow checks only.
- * All other overpayments, a refund check is mailed three to four weeks from payment (Immediate refunds given at Tri City Bank).
- * Refund checks are made payable to the Payer, even if your mortgage company makes a payment from your escrow account after you made payment in full.

Please, if at all possible, take advantage of the U.S. Mail, drive-up 24-hour depository, Tri City bank or the Credit Card option, to avoid long lines at City Hall.

SECOND INSTALLMENT – 25% of net real estate tax due on or before March 31st

THIRD INSTALLMENT – 25% of net real estate tax due on or before May 31^{st}

Wis. Stats. 74.09 Property tax bill and related information – (6) EFFECT OF FAILURE TO RECEIVE. Failure to receive

a property tax bill does not affect the validity of the general property taxes, special taxes, special charges and special assessments levied or the collection of delinquent general property taxes, special taxes, special charges and special assessments.

DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX

Payment of 2006 and prior years DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX must be made to MILWAUKEE COUNTY. Call (414) 278-4033 for more information.



DELINQUENT TAX accumulates INTEREST & PENALTY charges from February 1st at 1½ percent per month on the entire unpaid principal balance, regardless of when it becomes delinquent. **The postmark governs**

the date of payment - NOT the date

on your check.

Delinquent notices for 2007 Real Estate Property Tax will be mailed to the address on record in June 2008. Payment of delinquent 2007 Real Estate Property Tax will be accepted by the City of Oak Creek through July 31, 2008, after which will be turned over to Milwaukee County for collection.

LOTTERY AND GAMING CREDIT

If you received the 2006 Lottery and Gaming Credit on or before January 31, 2007, you do not need to recertify for 2007.

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

If you qualify for the Lottery and Gaming Credit beginning in 2007, or if you applied for the 2006 <u>Late</u> Lottery and Gaming Credit, complete and return the 2007 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office with your payment by January 31, 2008. Please check our website for the 2007 credit amount to deduct from your first payment. Lottery and Gaming Credit applications are available on our website (www.oakcreekwi.org, City Departments, Treasurer's Office, 2007 Lottery Credit Form) or at the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office.

There is a \$.25 charge for additional copies of tax bills. Beginning with 2003, tax information is available on the Oak Creek website (www.oakcreekwi.org, GCS Land Records Search). Search by parcel number, name, or address. Computers and copy machines are available at the Oak Creek Public Library (north of City Hall). Thank you and have a wonderful Holiday Season!

FIRE DEPARTMENT

CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY



With the holiday season now upon us, homes across the area are displaying Christmas tress. However, the most widely recognized symbol of the holidays is also one of the most common causes of residential fires. According to the National Fire Protection Agency, fires originating in Christmas trees accounted for 14 deaths, 21 injuries, and

over 16.8 million dollars in property damage in 2000-2004. The most common causes of these fires was a malfunction of electrical equipment on the tree itself, or portable heating devices placed too close to the tree. There are a few simple things to remember when setting up your tree that will keep your holidays safe.

- Use only lights approved by an underwriter's laboratory when decorating your tree.
- Always unplug your tree when you leave the house or are going to bed.
- NEVER use candles to decorate your tree.
- Keep your tree at least three feet from heat sources such as fireplaces or radiators.
- Properly dispose of your tree when it begins to drop its needles. More than 2/3 of Christmas tree fires occur in January when trees have dried out.

Chris Kopplin joined the Oak Creek Fire Department in 1991 as a paid-on-call firefighter. During that time,





Although he has many fond memories of the city garage, Chris says he wouldn't trade his career as a firefighter for any other job in the world. "I love being able to make a difference every day. Each day brings something new to the table." Chris offers some advice to any person looking into a career as a firefighter. "Spend time at the firehouse, talk to the crews, ask them questions, listen to their stories and then decide what career path you would like choose."

ASK THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

There is a smell of rotten eggs in my home. It gets worse when I get into the kitchen. Is this a cause for concern?

Absolutely! There could be a natural gas leak in your house. **DO NOT** turn on any light switches or attempt to solve the problem yourself. Exit the house immediately and dial 911 from a cell phone outside or from a neighbor's house. The Fire Department has devices that can determine the cause of the leak and will work with WE Energies to correct the problem.

DIABETES AWARENESS

One of the most common diseases among Americans today is diabetes. Diabetes affects more than 21 million Americans. Although genetics are thought to play a role, the exact cause is not fully understood. The early warning signs of diabetes are subtle and are frequently mistaken for other diseases or illnesses. These signs include increased fatigue, excessive hunger or thirst, blurry vision, and frequent urination. Unfortunately, there is no cure for diabetes. However, the disease can be managed with proper diet and insulin regimen.

Diabetic emergencies are commonly seen by the Oak Creek Fire Department. Symptoms of diabetic emergencies include sweating, dizziness, weakness, confusion, and a potential loss of consciousness. Any diabetic experiencing any of these symptoms should immediately dial 911. Diabetic emergencies can be life threatening if left untreated.

TAX DAY FIRES

April 15th marks the 5th anniversary of Oak Creek's "Tax Day Fires." That day more than 230 firefighters from 15 departments worked together to contain a series of fires that began when sparks



from a train ignited dry grass along the railroad tracks. That grass fire eventually spread to engulf a house. Firefighters worked feverishly to prevent the spread of fire to several neighborhoods that bordered the fire area. Further adding to the workload for the day was a three-alarm house fire that began late that afternoon.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter parking restrictions are in effect from December 1st until April 1st. During this time, there is no parking allowed on the streets in the City of Oak Creek during the following hours:



Monday thru Friday from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday from 2:30 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

Permission may be granted by the Police Department (on a day-to-day basis) for exceptions on the restriction during emergencies, if a vehicle becomes disabled, or if there is an overnight guest. Please us the non-emergency number if you need permission - (414) 762-8200.

UTILITY PROBLEMS

During severe weather, the Police Department receives an abundance of telephone calls from residents wishing to report utility problems. These problems should be reported directly to the respective utility company at their 24-hour phone numbers:. **See back cover** of *Acorn* for Utility Phone Number Listings.

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

The blowing and/or shoveling of snow onto City streets are in violation of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code, Section 6.24(c) as follows: "Prohibited Placement. No person except the State, County or City shall deposit or cause to be deposited, upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public land, any snow or ice taken or removed from his premises. No person except the State, County, or City shall use private or public lands within the City as a place for the disposal or dumping of snow or ice from public or private property or from another municipality except with the permission of the owner. The deposit of any snow or ice upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public lands of the City, contrary to the provisions of this Chapter, shall be & is hereby declared to be a nuisance. The City may remove any snow & ice so deposited & cause the costs of such removal to be charged to the owner or occupant of the property from which said snow or ice was removed & illegally deposited, pursuant to Section 66.60(16), Wis. Stats."

Property owners are also required to keep clear their mailboxes & fire hydrants on their property per Section 6.24(d) as follows: "Hydrants & Mailboxes. Every property owner or occupant shall keep all fire hydrants & mailboxes abutting his/her property free & clear of all snow & ice."

Sidewalks are also required to be cleared of ice and snow per Section 6.24(a) "The owner or occupant of any real property abutting or fronting upon a paved public sidewalk shall

remove and clear away or cause to be removed and cleared away, all snow and ice to the full-paved width of such sidewalk within twenty-four (24) hours after such snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. When ice has formed on any sidewalk, such that it cannot be removed, then the person responsible shall prevent such ice from presenting a hazard to pedestrian traffic by the use of ashes, sawdust, sand, salt, or any other similar substance."

WOMEN'S DANGER AWARENESS & SELF DEFENSE COURSE

The Oak Creek Police Department will be sponsoring a FREE, two-evening course on Women's Danger Awareness and Self Defense. The goal of this course is to present information that will help to reduce the risk of an assault and survive a deadly encounter. A portion of this course includes a physical self defense component (participation is optional).

Two courses will be offered at the Police Department from 6:00-8:30 p.m.--

- * The first course will be held on Monday & Tuesday, February 11 & 12, 2008.
- * The second course will be held Monday & Tuesday, March 17 & 18, 2008.

Registration is open to residents of Oak Creek only or those employed in the City of Oak Creek.

You must be 17 years or older to participate. To register contact the Oak Creek Police Department, Community Resource Bureau, at (414) 766-7624.

CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT)

CIT - Problem solving in the field - The Oak Creek Police Department has a team of officers who have volunteered for training in dealing with people who have mental health issues who are in a crisis. This group is referred to as CIT Officers. The mission of our Crisis Intervention Team is to use understanding and skills gained through specific training to identify and provide the most effective and compassionate response possible to police situations involving people experiencing a mental health crisis. After identifying the crisis, a list of resources located in the county are offered to help the person gain better mental health and a stable lifestyle.

LANDSCAPE INVESTMENT IMPACTS SUMMER WATER SEASON

As the days grow longer and the sun begins to warm the Earth, thoughts will turn to summer rituals such as gardening and lawn mowing. Homeowners, in fact, are increasing their investments in exterior landscapes, which require significant amounts of water.

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency,



one-quarter of water usage irrigates landscapes of home and business owners. Lawn watering accounts for about 8 billion gallons of water a day nationwide, or the equivalent of 14 billion six packs of beer, writes engineer Amy Vickers in the

AWWA Journal when describing America's biggest drinking problem to her readers.

Part of those landscapes, according to the article, includes about 4 million homes with water features growing to 16 million in 2003. Waterscapes also can impact the level of water used during a typical watering season. Some municipalities have implemented conservation measures, such as limiting the number of water days, restricting the area allowed for turf, and promoting natural lawns and landscapes that require only rainwater to survive.

While Oak Creek does not rely on such methods due our plentiful supply of clean, safe drinking water, we can only

benefit from conservation of water. The benefits would manifest in the form of reduced electrical costs for pumping and reduced infrastructure costs. For more information on what you can do to reduce the amount of water used and save

Poll Worker Recruitment

We are currently seeking applicants who would like to be considered for duty as Poll Workers for the 2008 elections, particularly for the February and November Elections.

Here are some of the most commonly asked questions:

Are Poll Workers compensated?

Yes, Poll Workers are compensated for working at polling places at a rate determined by the Common Council, and are compensated for attending any required training sessions. The rate of pay for 2007 for beginning assignments is \$7.00 per hour.

What are the hours of work?

Polling places are open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM. Poll Workers work a full day, generally from 6:00 AM to approximately 10:00 PM, or later in the case of November elections. In some cases, Poll Workers may be scheduled for late afternoon/early evening shifts, depending on availability and the number of workers assigned.

What are the responsibilities of a Poll Worker?

Poll Workers conduct assigned duties at one of the six Oak Creek polling sites on Election Day. Duties can include issuing ballots to registered voters, registering voters, monitoring the voting equipment, explaining how to mark the ballot or use the voting equipment, guiding voters to the proper areas, or counting votes.

What are the training requirements for Poll Workers?

The City Clerk will provide approximately two hours of initial general training, and approximately one hour of specific training prior to each election.

What are the specific qualifications to be a Poll Worker? *A person must:*

- Be a <u>qualified elector</u> of the City of Oak Creek (that is, an adult citizen of the United States who has resided in the city for 10 days and is not otherwise disqualified to vote)
- Be able to speak, read and write fluently in the English language
- Have strong clerical skills
- Be able to solve problems
- Be an effective communicator
- <u>NOT</u> be a candidate for any office to be voted on at the polling place at that election
- Be able to sit or stand for long periods of time

Note: The permit holder receives priority for the facility.

PERMIT REFUND POLICY

Permits are non-refundable, non-exchangeable, non-transferable and may be revoked in the interest of Department sponsored activities or the failure of the permit holder to comply with Department standards & policies. Facilities are permitted "as is". Permits are valid only for the date/time specified on the permit.



VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

Due to the expected large voter turnout at the February 19th Spring Primary & Presidential Preference Primary Election, those residents not currently registered are encouraged to register early to vote. To see if you are currently registered, you can check the City's website at <u>oakcreekwi.org</u> for the Registered Voter listing.

A qualified elector must be at least 18 years of age, a U.S. citizen, & a resident of the City for at least 10 days prior to registering to vote. You must present a driver's license or Wisconsin ID card for identification, showing a current & complete name, including both the given & family name, & a current & complete residential address, including a numbered street address & a municipality name.

The following constitute acceptable proof of residence if the document contains the elector's current & complete name & current & complete residential address:

- 1. A current & valid Wisconsin driver's license
- 2. Wisconsin identification card issued by the Dept. of Transportation
- 3. Any other official ID card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit
- 4. Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business & bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
- 5. A real estate tax bill or receipt, for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election
- 6. A residential lease which is effective for a period that includes election day (Not for first-time voters registering by mail)
- 7. A university, college or technical institute fee card (must include photo)
- 8. A university, college or technical institute identification card (must include photo)
- 9. A gas, electric or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before election day
- 10. Bank statement
- 11. Paycheck
- 12. A check or other document issued by a unit of government

If no acceptable proof of residence is available, a person may have his or her residence corroborated by an elector who resides in the municipality. A corroborator shall provide acceptable proof of residence.

- * Oak Creek Public Library during regular business hours
- * By Mail

ILLICIT CHARGES

As part of a permit required and issued by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the City of Oak Creek has implemented a program to detect and eliminate illegal connections or discharges to the storm water management sys-

Many people do not realize that whatever enters catch basins and storm water inlets is carried directly to waterways and the lake without treatment. This is why it is so important to keep illicit substances out of the storm sewer system.

As part of this program, City staff will be inspecting storm water outfalls for certain things that may indicate an illicit discharge. The inspections are conducted during dry weather, since wet weather results in run off that makes it difficult to check for illicit discharge. If a flow is present during dry weather, staff will use some simple field tests to evaluate if substances such as detergent or copper are in the water. This will help to determine if the flow is a legal flow, such as water from sump pumps, or an illegal discharge. If the discharge is a type that is prohibited, the City

will conduct additional investigation to determine where the discharge is coming from, and work with the owner to eliminate the discharge.

Residents can help prevent pollution by not dumping down the storm drain. Chlorinated water from a swimming pool cannot be discharged down the storm drain unless the water has been de-chlorinated. Proper disposal of liquids

is essential for the health of our waterways. Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District has several mobile and year round collection sites where you can properly dispose of items such as driveway sealer, antifreeze, or pool chemicals.



If you notice something being illegally discharged to the storm drain, you can report it to the Engineering **Department at (414)768-6541.**

DID YOU KNOW - IDENTIFY THEFT

While Internet identity theft is definitely a hot topic in the media today, Internet identity theft actually accounts for only a *small percentage* of the total identity theft fraud cases.

A recent survey by Javelin Strategy & Research of Pleasanton claims that 90 percent of identity theft takes

place through traditional offline channels and not through the Internet.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

BE PREPARED: PREPARATION FOR OLDER AND SPECIAL NEEDS AMERICANS

In the past two Acorn Guide/Newsletters, Oak Creek Emergency Management along with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security urged families to be better prepared through an informational series. In the last two articles, Americans were asked to think about plans and supplies that would be needed during a dis-







aster. Families should be prepared for 3 to 5 days without assistance from governmental and outside agencies. This Acorn article will focus on making plans for Older and Special Needs Americans. Remember that disasters and emergencies can strike quickly and without warning and anywhere, at anytime, and affect anyone of us, so it is important to Be Prepared.

Each person's needs and abilities are unique, but every individual can take important steps to prepare for all kinds of emergencies and put plans in place. By evaluating your own personal needs and making an emergency plan, you can be better prepared for any situation. A commitment to planning today will help you prepare for any emergency situation.

Preparation Basics

- Consider how a disaster might affect your individual needs.
- Plan to make it on your own, at least for a period of time. It's possible that you will not have access to a medical facility or even a drugstore.
- Identify what kind of resources you use on a daily basis and what you might do if they are limited or not available.
- Prepare an emergency kit and inventory the contents regularly.
- If you must evacuate, take your pets with you, if possible. However, if you are going to a public shelter, it is important to understand that animals may not be allowed inside. Plan in advance for shelter alternatives that will work for both you and your pets; consider loved ones or friends outside of your immediate area who would be willing to host you and your pets in an emergency.

Create a Support Network

- If you anticipate needing assistance during a disaster talk to family, friends, and others who will be part of your personal support network.
- Write down and share each aspect of your emergency plan with everyone in your support network.
- Make sure everyone knows how you plan to evacuate your home or workplace and where you will go in case of a disaster.
- Make sure that someone in your local network has an extra key to your home and knows where you keep your emergency supplies.
- Teach those who will help you how to use any lifesaving equipment, administer medicine or oxygen in case of an emergency.

Practice your plan with those who have agreed to be part of your network.

Medications and Medical Supplies

- If you take medicine or use a medical treatment on a daily basis, be sure you have what you need to make it on your own for at least a week, maybe longer.
- Make a list of prescription medicines including dosage, treatment and allergy information.
- Talk to your pharmacist or doctor about what else you need to prepare.
- If you undergo routine treatments administered by a clinic or hospital, or if you receive regular services such as home health care, treatment or transportation, talk to your service provider about their emergency plans. Work with them to identify back-up service providers and incorporate them into your personal support network.
- Consider other personal needs such as eyeglasses, hearing aids and hearing aid batteries, wheelchair batteries, and oxygen.

Emergency Documents

- Include copies of important documents in you emergency supply kits such as family records, medical records, wills, deeds, social security number, charge and bank account information and tax records.
- Have copies of your medical insurance and Medicare cards readily available.
- Keep a list of the style and serial number of medical devices or other life-sustaining devices. Include operating information and instructions.
- Make sure that a friend or family member has copies of these documents.
- Include the names and contact information of your support network, as well as your medical providers.
- If you have a communication disability, make sure your emergency information notes the best way to communicate with you.
- Keep these documents in a water proof container for quick and easy access.

Be prepared to adapt this information to your personal circumstances and make every effort to follow instructions received from authorities on the scene. With these simple preparations, you can be ready for the unexpected. Take the time now to get yourself and your loved ones prepared.

FINE PRINT: THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

IS SHE/HE OLD ENOUGH?

For all programs, age requirement will be as of the date of the first class, unless otherwise specified. Please do not request to have your child put in a class he/she does not belong in. All age requirements are set to benefit the children & make instruction more consistent for the program leader. In some instances, the requirements have been set for the child's safety.

HOW MUCH IS IT?

The policy of the Department is that those who participate must help defray the overall cost of the activity. Fees and charges are assessed according to the cost of the program.

Note:

The Department does not want to exclude children who are unable to pay these fees due to financial hardship. Resident families unable to pay all or part of the fees should contact the office to arrange for their participation.

NEED TO TRANSFER?

Transfers will be made at no charge, upon request, for persons who meet the age/skill level requirements of the class requested, provided there is space available at the time of the request.

NEED A REFUND?

Refunds will be made upon request up until 1/3 of the scheduled classes have been held (i.e. 3 classes of a 10 week session) except as noted in individual class descriptions. You may expect your refund check 2 to 4 weeks after your request is received.

A \$3 service fee will be charged on each refund requested.

If an activity is cancelled, persons registered will be offered a full refund or transfer to another activity.

OPEN HOUSE

You are welcome to discuss your child's progress after each class, and attend the open house held during the final class of the session.

MAKEUPS?

Classes missed for individual absences (i.e. illness, vacations, etc.) are not "made up" nor may participants attend classes other than the one they are registered for.

Activities cancelled by the Department will be rescheduled if possible. If a class is unable to be rescheduled, no refunds will be issued.

CAN I WATCH?

In an effort to avoid distractions and interruptions in instruction, relatives, friends and/or other children are not permitted in classrooms or the pool during instruction.

We also feel it is most beneficial for your child to have recreational time with his/her peers, and for adults to have time in an adults-only atmosphere.

HAVE A COMPLAINT?

If, after you begin a class it does not meet your expectations, please contact the Oak Creek Parks, Recreation & Forestry Department at 768-6515 to discuss your concerns.

DO YOU HAVE INSURANCE?

Insurance coverage for program participants is not provided by the Department or by the School District for Department sponsored activities. Please obtain your own insurance coverage for the duration of the activity.

AMIA RESIDENT?

The non-resident fee applies to any person whose primary residence is not within the Oak Creek city limits at the time of registration. Attendance in the Oak Creek-Franklin School District does not constitute residency. Current proof of City residency is required at each registration. If proof of residency is not provided, the non-resident fee will apply.

WHAT IF?






