

FORESTRY

Rebecca Lane, City Forester **Doug Schachtner, Director** Emerald Ash Borer Update: Get Out The Binoculars

As you have likely heard, emerald ash borer (EAB) was found in Oak Creek in late 2009. While it is probably hiding just about everywhere that ash trees can be found, the concentration that we know of is roughly centered within a mile and a half radius of I-94 and W. Ryan Road.

The local woodpecker population has really helped us to locate infested ash trees! The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) did an initial survey for us and also trained us to find infested ash trees by following woodpecker damage. While woodpecker damage is not an absolute sign of EAB, it is a great indicator, often times leading to positive identification.

Take a pair of binoculars when surveying for EAB damage. They help determine whether patches of lightwood are caused by animals, especially squirrels, climbing and scraping (flecking) or actual woodpecker damage. Check the upper crowns of trees exposed to the sun, especially the south side. Go out at a time of day when the glare will not reduce visibility.

If woodpecker damage is notable, check for additional signs of EAB. Bark splits on the trunk and branches can often be probed to find the galleries of the young, damaging larva. A trunk examination may reveal small (only 1/8") D-shaped exit holes which will be unmistakably EAB.

After positive identification of EAB there are but two good choices: remove the tree or treat the tree with an appropriate insecticide specifically used on EAB.

We would like to keep Oak Creek ash wood in Oak Creek. It is the finest thing we can do for our neighbors. If you bring infested ash wood to the yard, let the attendants know. We will handle that wood by double chipping it or making sure it stays in Oak Creek for other purposes.

Ways you can help with the EAB invasion:

We are looking for more firewood users within the city – not firewood processors that ship wood outside the city. We would also like to locate individuals and businesses that can split the wood of large tree parts.

We are looking for woodchip burning contacts/users, preferably within the city.

Please hang out suet to help attract more woodpeckers. They have been called the number one enemy of emerald ash borer.

Please plant a lot of trees as soon as possible!

MOSOUITO CONTROL

- Wear long pants and shirts with long sleeves.
- Limit outdoor activities after dusk
- Eliminate standing water in your yard when possible
- Change water in wading pools every 3-4 days.
- Use a mosquito repellant with DEET do not apply directly to the face.
- The current CDC and American Academy of Pediatrics recommendation for children over 2 months of age is to use 30 percent DEET. DEET should not be used on children under 2 months of age.

Some mosquitoes transmit diseases such as West Nile Virus. The City will be applying larvacide to sewer catch basins that contain mosquito larvae.

WISCONSIN GOES SMOKE-FREE on **JULY 5, 2010!**

Effective July 5, 2010, Wisconsin indoor workplaces, restaurants and bars will be smoke-free. Wisconsin is the 27th state restricting smoking in public places to reduce exposure to second hand smoke. The Wisconsin Quit Line offers free, confidential, telephone counseling and free limited nicotine replacement

ADULTS NEED SHOTS TOO!

Through the Wisconsin Immunization Program, with funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), the Oak Creek Health Department is temporarily expanding the use of vaccines to adults during the regularly scheduled immunization clinics and special "adults only" clinics throughout the year. The vaccines offered to adults 19 years and older are Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, HPV (Gardasil to age 26; males and females), MMR (for adults born after 1957), Td, Tdap (through age 64) and Varicella. There is a \$10 administration fee per visit. Adults with health insurance should go to their primary health care provider for these vaccines if possible.

FIRE DEPARTMENT TRAINING VENUES

HEART ATTACK

A heart attack can be one of the most frightening experiences of a person's life. Recognizing the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and contacting 911 to facilitate emergency medical




care can greatly improve a person's chances for a positive outcome. Emergency medical personnel will provide critical prehospital treatment and contact the receiving hospital to expedite further care once the patient arrives.

Please contact 911 if you experience any of the following:

- 1. Chest discomfort, pressure or pain.
- 2. Pain that radiates into the arms, jaw, back or neck
- 3. Unexplained shortness of breath with or without chest pain
- 4. Other signs include nausea, vomiting, and lightheadedness

SAFE GRILLING



Gas Grill Safety Tips

- 1. Check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes, and leaks. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the hose or tubing.
- 2. Move gas hoses as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease.
- 3. Always keep propane gas containers upright.
- 4. Never store a spare gas container under or near the grill or
- 5. Never store or use flammable liquids, like gasoline, near the
- 6. Never keep a filled container in a hot car or car trunk. Heat will cause the gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape.

Charcoal Grill Safety Tips

- 1. Never burn charcoal inside of homes, vehicles, tents, or campers.
- 2. Charcoal should never be used indoors, even if ventilation is
- 3. Since charcoal produces CO fumes until the charcoal is completely extinguished, do not store the grill indoors with freshly used coals.
- 4. Allow charcoal and ashes to completely cool prior to disposal.

ASK THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

"I HAVE SEEN SOME STORIES ON THE LOCAL TV NEWS ABOUT FIRE DEPARTMENTS AND SOMETHING CALLED MABAS. WHAT EX-**ACTLY IS MABAS?"**

"MABAS" stands for Mutual Aid Box Alarm System. It is an agreement between fire departments to assist each other when an emergency incident requires more personnel than a specific municipality can provide. The structure of the system allows for neighboring departments to respond directly to the emergency scene, and the next closest departments to backfill the fire stations vacated by those departments. This predetermined response plan prevents any one municipality from being overburdened while they provide assistance.

The fire department ambulance crew will obtain your contact information from your mother's facility. In many cases, the facility will contact you as the ambulance is providing care. However, if necessary, the ambulance crew will contact the patient's family to provide appropriate care and transport information.

WARM WEATHER REMINDERS

- With the warm weather comes more activities outside. There are more car windows down and gatherings at residences. Please be courteous of your neighbors with regard to loud noise and music levels. The Oak Creek Police Department responds to complaints at all times of the day, but the main hours of enforcement for loud noise/music (per City Ordinance) is between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. The Noise Ordinance also designates that lawn care equipment cannot be operated between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- Rummage sale, garage sale, advertising or other such signs cannot be placed on streets, sidewalks or other public right-of-ways, nor can they be attached to public utility poles. Illegally posted signs will be removed by police personnel.
- City Ordinance prohibits the sale, possession or use of illegal fireworks, except paper caps, snakes and sparklers. However, keep in mind that sparklers can get as hot as 1,200 degrees and can cause serious injury to young hands and eyes.

HOME SECURITY

- Do not allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers, or flyers to build up while you are away. Arrange for a friend or neighbor to pick up these items or stop your mail at the post office.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended period of time.
- Never leave keys under doormats, flowerpots, mailboxes or other "secret" hiding places. Burglars know where to look for hidden keys.
- Keep a detailed inventory of your valuables, including a description of the items, date of purchase, original value, and serial numbers, and keep a copy in a safe place away from home. Etch personal identification codes on your valuables with an engraving tool. You can also make a photographic or video record of items in your home.
- Be a good neighbor. Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other. If you notice anything suspicious, call 9-1-1 immediately and report it to the police.

CONCERNED PARENTS PROGRAM

Did you know that you are responsible and can be held civilly liable for any underage person that is at your residence consuming alcoholic beverages—even if you are on vacation and unaware of the party? Police officers are concerned for the safety of all of our residents, and it is often better to confront an underage drink-



ing party before something of a serious nature occurs, such as a car accident.

With the Concerned Parents Program, residents may leave a key with the Police Department and give permission for officers to gain entry to their home during their absence, in the event that there is a party or other illegal activity on the premises. An underage person cannot deny police officers' entry into your residence once you have given this consent. To register for this program, stop at the Oak Creek Police Department during business hours and sign a consent form. Make sure to bring an extra key.

TAX BILLS ARE MAILED "RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED" AND ARE NOT FORWARDED.

PERMANENT ADDRESS CHANGES - If your mailing address has changed please contact the Assessor's Office at (414) 768-6506.

TEMPORARY MAILING ADDRESS – To have your tax bill mailed to a temporary address please call the Treasurer's Office by December 1st (must be requested annually, even if requested in the past.)

PAYMENT DEADLINE - THIRD INSTALLMENT – 25% of net real estate tax due on or before May 31, 2010. **WE DO NOT SEND REMINDER NOTICES**.

Please include your tax bill(s) with all payments. It will be returned to you with a receipt to the address on the tax bill, unless a self-addressed envelope is enclosed.

CHECKS - make payable to Treasurer or to City of Oak Creek. Checks are processed and deposited the same day, even if post dated. Personal Checks must include Name and Address. DO NOT STAPLE or send correspondence and DO NOT COMBINE with other payments. Checks not properly completed or endorsed may be returned unprocessed and your taxes could become delinquent. Checks returned from the bank for any reason are subject to a \$25.00 recovery fee and payment is void. Full replacement payment, plus separate recovery fee, in the form of cash or certified funds, must be received by the original due date to avoid interest and penalties.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

BY MAIL, to: Treasurer, City of Oak Creek, PO Box 27, Oak Creek, WI 53154-0027. DO NOT use the blue return envelopes from February 1st through November 30th; payments may be returned to sender unprocessed or delayed and your taxes may become delinquent. Postmarks from these <u>improperly addressed</u> envelopes will not be honored.

Payment by mail is TIMELY if ALL of the following criteria is met:

* it is mailed to the City of Oak Creek in a <u>properly addressed</u> envelope,

- *postmarked before midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment,
- * with postage prepaid, and
- * is received by the proper official not more than 5 days after the prescribed date for making the payment.

DRIVE-UP 24-HOUR DEPOSITORY, located at City Hall on the east side of the south parking lot. NO CASH PLEASE! Payments placed in the depository by midnight of the due date are considered timely.

IN PERSON AT CITY HALL, Mon. thru Fri., 8 am to 5 pm (closed for Memorial Day on Monday, May 31, 2010).

OVERPAYMENTS AT CITY HALL,

- * Cash refunds may be given <u>up to \$20</u> on Escrow Checks only (when funds are available)
- * All other overpayments, a refund is mailed three to four weeks from payment
- * Refund checks are made payable to the Payer, even if your mortgage company makes a payment after you have paid in full.

BY CREDIT CARD, We are pleased to announce the availability of credit card payments for payment of real estate and personal property taxes. In cooperation with the City of Oak Creek, Official Payments Corporation offers individuals and businesses the opportunity to pay property tax by way of a credit card by telephone or directly over the Internet. This service is safe, reliable, and in accordance with all state and government regulations. In order to process your payment, Official Payments Corporation, the credit card service provider, charges a convenience fee based on the amount of the transaction, currently 2.75% (\$1.00 minimum fee) subject to change without notice.

Easy Payment via Telephone or Internet - We <u>cannot</u> accept credit card payments in person.

To pay by telephone call toll-free 1-800-272-9829 (enter Jurisdiction Code 6717 when prompted) or visit

www.officialpayments.com to pay taxes over the Internet (link also available on the City's website). You will be asked to enter information such as: type of tax (real estate-7 to 10 digit parcel #) or (personal property-6 digit parcel #, for businesses only), total of your payment, parcel number (located in the upper right hand corner of your tax bill), and credit card information. Please have your tax bill and credit card available.

The system will tell you the total of your payment, including the appropriate fee; obtain approval of the charge; and issue an onscreen confirmation number and a printable digital receipt. Confirmation is emailed to users who request it. The charge will also appear on your credit card statement: the tax amount will appear on one line and the convenience fee amount on a separate line.

DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX

Payment not received or *post-marked before midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment is delinquent. DELIN-QUENCY results in forfeiture of the installment option and accumulates INTEREST AND PENALTY charges from February 1st at 1½ percent per month on the entire unpaid principal balance, regardless of when it becomes delinquent. The *postmark governs the date of payment – NOT the date on your check.

Delinquent notices for 2009 Real Estate Property Tax will be mailed to the address on record in June 2010. Payment of delinquent 2009 Real Estate Property Tax will be accepted by the City of Oak Creek through July 31, 2010, after which will be turned over to Milwaukee County for collection.

Payment of PRIOR YEAR(S) DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX must be made to MILWAUKEE COUNTY. Call the County Treasurer's Office at (414) 278-4033 for information.

Wis. Stats. 74.09 Property tax bill and related information – (6) EFFECT OF FAILURE TO RECEIVE. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not affect the validity of the general property taxes, special taxes, special charges and special assessments levied or the collection of delinquent general property taxes, special taxes, special charges and special assessments.

LOTTERY AND GAMING CREDIT

If you received the 2009 Lottery and Gaming Credit on or before January 31, 2010, you do not need to recertify for 2010.

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

2009: The 2009 Lottery and Gaming Credit is \$69.88. If you did not receive this credit and are eligible, complete a 2009 Late Lottery and Gaming Credit application and return it, along with a copy of your tax bill, to the State of Wisconsin Department of Revenue (address is shown on the application) by October 1, 2010.

2010: If you first qualify for the Lottery and Gaming Credit beginning in 2010, or if you applied for the 2009 <u>Late</u> Lottery and Gaming Credit, complete and return the 2010 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office by November 15, 2010; the credit will appear on your 2010 Real Estate Tax Bill. For applications received between November 15, 2010 and January 31, 2011, you may deduct the credit from your first payment. The 2010 Lottery and Gaming Credit amount will be determined in December 2010.

Lottery and Gaming Credit applications are available on our website or at the Treasurer's Office.

OTHER INFORMATION

There is a \$.25 charge for additional copies of tax bills. You may print them free of charge off the internet. Computers with internet service are available at the Oak Creek Public Library (north of City Hall); you may print a copy for \$.15 at the Library. Enjoy your summer!

ILLICIT DISCHARGES

As part of a permit required and issued by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the City of Oak Creek has implemented a program to detect and eliminate illegal connections or discharges to the storm water management system.

Many people do not realize that whatever enters catch basins and storm water inlets is carried directly to waterways and the lake without treatment. This is why it is so important to keep illicit substances out of the storm sewer system.

As part of this program, City staff will be inspecting storm water outfalls for certain things that may indicate an illicit discharge. The inspections are conducted during dry weather, since wet weather results in run off that makes it difficult to check for illicit discharge. If a flow is present during dry weather, staff will use some simple field tests to evaluate if substances such as detergent or copper are in the water. This will help to determine if the flow is a legal flow, such as water from sump pumps, or an illegal discharge. If the discharge is a type that is prohibited, the City will conduct additional investigation to determine where the discharge is coming from, and work with the owner to eliminate the discharge.

Residents can help prevent pollution by not dumping down the storm drain. Chlorinated water from a swimming pool cannot be discharged down the storm drain unless the water has been de-chlorinated. Proper disposal of liquids is essential for the health of our waterways. Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District has several mobile and year round collection sites where you can properly dispose of items such as driveway sealer, antifreeze, or pool chemicals.



RECYCLING YARD INFORMATION

The recycling yard will be **closed** on the following holiday dates:

Memorial Day Monday, May 31, 2010 4th of July Monday, July 5, 2010 Labor Day Monday, September 6, 2010

The recycling yard hours:

Monday through Saturday 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Tuesday evenings ONLY** until 8:00 p.m. (**starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September.)

NO items may exceed 4' in length except for branches, furniture, appliances & metals.

NO contractor vehicles will be allowed in to the yard.

The yard does NOT accept shingles, roofing materials, grass, gas, medical or hazardous waste, paints or vehicle salvage.

All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15.00 per unit fee.

Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$2.00 per tire will be charged.

BRANCH PICK-UP DATES

Branches will be picked up beginning on the following dates: June 1st August 2nd

To guarantee that your branches are picked up, you must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above, but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until the next date listed.



Reminder, branches are to be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pickup brush that is the result of a

contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard, any time of the year, at 720 W. Puetz Road.

SPRING CLEAN-UP BEGINS MAY 17, 2010

The Street Department will conduct a spring clean up beginning on Monday, May 17, 2010. There is NO CHARGE for this pickup (except for freon appliances). Items that WILL be picked up are as follows:

- * Yard Waste excluding leaves, grass and branches
- * Furniture * Wood * Metal
- *Appliances (Freon appliances- refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers, require a \$15 pre-payment for pick-up).
- * Construction Materials **NOT resulting from a contractor**
- * Mattresses * Televisions * Carpeting/Rugs

Items that **WILL NOT** be picked up are as follows:

- * Paints * Tires
 - * Batteries
- * Hazardous Materials
- * Grass Clippings * Leaves
- * Branches
- * Fluorescent Tubes

Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on Monday, May 17th in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick-ups until the fall clean-up on November 15th. See Special Pick-Up section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you should miss the Spring Clean-Up date.

SPECIAL PICK UPS

In addition to the fall & spring clean-ups that are provided at NO CHARGE, the City of Oak Creek provides special pick-ups for residents for a fee of \$15 for the following items:

- * Appliances (A \$15 additional fee will be charged for freon appliances – refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers)
- * Metals of any kind
- * Televisions

- * Furniture
- * Mattresses
- * Carpeting/Padding

Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings ONLY. Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45 a.m. on the scheduled Friday. Residents requesting special pick-ups must prepay the fees due by noon, the Thursday prior, in order to be put on that Fridays pick up schedule.

Please note that special pick ups will not be done for the following items:

- * Branches
 - * Yard Waste
- * Recyclables
- * Contractor generated materials
- * Hazardous Waste

- * Tires
- * Concrete

Using portable storage structures: "Pods", dumpsters, shed-like containers

Did you ever have the need to use a portable storage unit such as a "pod" or dumpster? If so, you will need to follow City regula-

tions pertaining to portable storage units. According to Municipal Code Section 17.0204(d)(8), one portable storage unit such as a dumpster or storage unit, shedlike container or other portable structure, other than an accessory building or shed



can be stored on a property for no more than 30 days in a calendar year. The only exception to this rule is when a building permit has been issued for construction on a particular property.

Parking cars, trucks, and recreational vehicles in residential districts:

According to Municipal Code Section 17.0405, all cars, trucks, and motor recreational vehicles must be parked on an impervious surface such as asphalt, concrete, or gravel on private property. Parking of any motor vehicle on a front lawn or public right-of-way is not permissible.

The parking of boats, boat trailers, campers, utility trailers, snowmobiles and their trailers, all terrain vehicles, and kayaks are allowed to be stored outside in residential districts if they comply with the following regulations:

- 1. They are located in the rear or side yard and not closer than two feet to the rear or side lot line.
- 2. If parked in the front yard, they will be parked on a driveway closest to the home as possible.
- 3. They should be located outside of all rights-of-way, vision triangle and drainage and utility easements.
- 4. The recreational vehicle should be maintained and in operable condition.
- 5. Recreational vehicles requiring registration be properly registered.
- 6. Only ONE major recreational vehicle can be stored outside in the rear or side yard provided it does not exceed 8.5 feet in width, 13 feet in height, and 32 feet long.
- 7. No semi-trailers are allowed to be parked in any residential zoning district
- 8. Semi tractors are only allowed in residential districts that have driveway access to a state highway (i.e. Howell Avenue, S. Chicago Road).



Selling of vehicles from residential properties:

Although your property may be located in a prime location for the selling of motor vehicles, there are regulations limiting the number of sales per year and lo-

cation. According to Municipal Code Section 10.41, the selling of motor vehicles from a residential property is limited to one motor vehicle for sale at a time. In addition, no more than three motor vehicles can be sold from a property in a calendar year. If a resident wishes to sell a vehicle from their home, he/she should park the vehicle on their privately owned paved driveway and NOT on their front lawn or in the driveway approach.

WATER & SEWER UTILITY

50 Years Later, Utility Remains Vision of Success

This year marks the golden anniversary for the Utility. The idea of forming a water and sewer utility back in 1960, however, was anything but a shared vision by Oak Creek's several thousand residents. Local leaders saw the need for providing clean, safe, reliable water supply to a community on the verge of consistent growth. Nevertheless, convincing residents was challenging at best—especially considering manufacturer AC Sparkplug would consume 97 percent of the water supply in those early years.

Looking back, the vision of forming a water and sewer utility was the correct course of action. This vision has crossed generations of Utility leadership, producing one of the nation's most respected, forward-thinking water and sewer utilities. Over five decades, the Utility has gone from several customers to more than 60,000 customers who now use nearly 3 billion gallons of water annually.

Along the way, the Utility has been recognized with numerous awards for water quality, taste and financial reporting excellence among others. Investment in new technology to ensure the cleanest, safest, most reliable water possible flowed to its customers has been part of the Utility's pioneering spirit. Those investments have led to Utility recognition by the Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Natural Resources, Government Financial Officers Association, and countless other national, regional, state and local accolades.

Focus on Energy & Federal Grants Benefit Utility Construction Project

The Utility recently received federal stimulus dollars to construct a new water pumping station on Orchard Way near 27th Street and Puetz Road. Focus on Energy also provided grant funds based on the Utility's plan to install in the new station energy-efficient pumps projected to save \$80,000 a year in electricity costs.

"Our master plan called for constructing the new pumping station in the future, but the availability of grant funding allowed the project to move forward sooner," Utility Engineer Mike Sullivan said. "Increasing our pumping capacity now allows us to benefit from lower construction costs and more efficient use of our existing storage facilities without building more storage capacity."

Utility Rescues South Milwaukee Water

South Milwaukee recently experienced a water main break that put the neighboring city's water operations out of service. As part of a collaborative agreement with South Milwaukee, Oak Creek was able to supply water through several inter-city hook-ups to ensure the supply of safe public drinking water and fire protection water.

"Effectively, we supplied South Milwaukee with water over 12 hours until they were able to fix their 20-inch water main," Utility General Manager Steve Yttri said. "Without this arrangement to provide a back-up water supply to them, essential services such as fire protection would have been severely compromised during this emergency."

FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT

Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding & keeping housing much more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity – the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford – is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- * Race
- * Sex
- * National origin/Ancestry

- * Color
- * Disability
- * Religion
- * Family status (household composition, including presence of children)
 - * Sexual orientation
- * Marital status
- * Lawful source of income

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

In this day and age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle & difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, because they have kids or because they have a disability.

The following are some possible "red flags" that may indicate illegal discrimination:

- * You called about an apartment for rent. You were told that it has been rented, but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- * You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, & the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along
- * A landlord or apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- * You are told of extremely long waiting lists.
- * You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibiity criteria, but the provider won't tell you what the eligibility requirements are.
- * A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- * Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent reason.
- * Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are ways to address the problem. Victims of housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court.

If you have any questions regarding housing discrimination, fair housing laws and what your options may be for pursuing a complaint of housing discrimination, call the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council at 278-1240.

The Fair Housing Council offers many helpful services, including:

- * Counseling for persons alleging housing discrimination
- * Investigations on behalf of victims of housing discrimination
- * Assistance in filing fair housing complaints with an administrtive agency or in a court of law

In addition, the Fair Housing Council provides educational presentations to neighborhood groups, civic and religious organizations, social service agencies, community centers and other groups that are interested in learning more about fair housing law and housing discrimination. BICYCLE LICENSE



The Oak Creek Police Department would like to remind all cyclists to license their bikes. A bicycle license can be obtained from the Police Department during normal business hours at a nominal \$3.50 fee.

The license is non-expiring and will enable the police to locate the owner of lost or stolen bikes which are retrieved or turned in.

BASKETBALL STANDARDS

There has been an ongoing problem with residents placing basketball standards in the right-of-way (Terrace Area). This area is

defined as that area between the curb and the sidewalk, and where no sidewalk exists, that area between the street pavement and the rightof-way/property line.

Section 6.25 Terrace Areas, Section (d) of the Municipal Code states: "No structures or fixtures shall be placed in the terrace area. Examples of prohibited items would be basketball backstops, statuary, flagpoles and other objects.


The exception to this subsection is the installation of a mailbox as specified by the United States Postal Service."





FACILITIES LIST: Parks, Playgrounds & Schools



FACILITIES MAP: Parks, Playgrounds & Schools










WATER FRIENDLY LANDSCAPING

Owners of property near a detention pond, ditch, creek, lake, or other waterway have some unique landscaping opportunities and challenges. There are things a property owner can do to help improve the

quality of the water near their property.



tenance. A buffer can also improve habitat and help water quality by reducing the amount of pollutants getting into the water. A vegetated buffer zone can be created in a number of ways, many of which actually reduce time and effort needed to maintain the area.

- Native plants can provide food and habitat to attract songbirds and butterflies to your yard. Information on native shoreland plant species is available from the UW-Extension at: www.clean-water.uwex.edu/pubs/index.htm.
- ✓ A buffer zone can be created simply by establishing a "no-mow" zone along the water's edge. Turf grasses will grow 12-24 inches tall before going to seed
- For creating or maintaining a view of the water, consider selective removal of branches, trees, shrubs & ground cover to create clear areas while maintaining vegetation in other areas
- ✓ Please note that City ordinance requires natural lawns to be maintained at a height of 12 inches or less, and certain areas, such as platted subdivisions with buildings on 50% or more of the lots, are required to maintain the grass at six inches or less. Additionally, noxious weeds such as ragweed are excluded from the definition of natural lawn. If you have a question, please check with the City Inspection Department to determine specific requirements for your property prior to establishing a vegetated buffer area.

Some homeowners dump grass clippings on the bank of a pond, ditch, waterway, or wetland adjacent to their property. Unfortunately, as these clippings break down, they will add nitrogen and other compounds to the water, which contributes to algae growth and odors. Disposal of grass clippings or other yard waste on the banks of a waterway is prohibited by Section 8.23(b) of the Municipal Code.

Reducing the application of chemical fertilizers and weed killers can further help the water quality of the rivers and lakes around us. Additional information on managing yard waste and reducing yard chemical use is available from the Engineering Department or on-line at http://clean-water.uwex.edu/index.htm,

PET LICENSE INFORMATION

The City of Oak Creek requires a license for dogs (limit two) and cats over five months of age. You can license your pet online, by mail or at the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office (options below). Residents must provide a current certificate of rabies vaccination (showing the tag number and the expi-

ration date) at the time of licensing. The license year commences January 1st and ends December 31st.



Beginning April 1st, a late fee will be assessed except for: New Residents and New Pet Owners:

- ✓ A new resident who owns a dog or cat over five months of age, and who licenses such pet within 30 days of residency or,
- resident who obtains a dog or cat on or after April 1st, and who licenses such pet within 30 days or,
- ✓ resident who owns a dog or cat that is not five months of age on or before March 31st, and who licenses such pet within 30 days from the date in which it reaches five months of age.

Renewals:

If you licensed your pet for 2009 on or before October 31, 2009, you should have received a 2010 renewal postcard from Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission (MADACC) in December. You may not have received a postcard from MADACC if licensed on or after November 1, 2009.

Whether or not you receive a renewal postcard from MADACC, it is your responsibility to license your pet on or before March 31st each year.

BY MAIL, to Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission, 3839 W. Burnham St, West Milwaukee, WI 53215. Include the postcard (for renewals), current certificate of rabies vaccination (will be returned with license) and check made payable to MADACC. Call (414) 649-8640 for questions. Add \$1 to License fee when mailing directly to MADACC.

AT CITY HALL, mail or bring the postcard (for renewals) and current certificate of rabies vaccination (will be returned with license) to 8640 S Howell Avenue, PO Box 27, Oak Creek, WI 53154-0027. Checks must be separate from all other payments and made payable to Treasurer or City of Oak Creek.

If your license is considered late you must include the applicable late fee with your payment.

WEED ORDINANCE

OFFICIAL NOTICE CITY OF OAK CREEK

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

- (a) In addition to the weeds mentioned to be noxious under s. 66.0407(b), Wisconsin Statutes, the following weeds are also declared to be noxious weeds within the boundaries of the City of Oak Creek: Bull Thistle, Wild Carrot, Sour Dock, Wild Mustard, Chickory, Poison Oak, Poison Ivy, Sow Thistle, Burdock.
- (b) Except as provided in sub. (c), all weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on more than 50% of the lots in the subdivision, in multi-family apartments and complexes, planned developments and mobile home districts shall be cut to and maintained at a height not to exceed six (6) inches. All weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on 50% or less of the lots or which are not located in platted subdivisions and all weeds and grasses in business and manufacturing zoning districts shall be cut to a height not to exceed one foot (12 inches).

The City may cause all weeds, grass and brush to be cut and removed, in accordance with this subsection and the cost thereof shall be charged to the property owner pursuant to Section 66.0627 Wis. Stats.

(c) The provisions for destruction of noxious weeds and cutting of all weeds and grass as provided above shall not apply to areas which are designated by the Common Council as nature centers or wildlife preserves.





FINE PRINT: Things You Should Know

Is She/He Old Enough?

For all programs, age requirements will be as of the date of the first class, unless otherwise specified. Please do not request to have your child put in a class he/she does not belong in. All age requirements are set to benefit the children and make instruction more consistent for the program leader. In some in-

stances, the requirements have been set for the child's safety.

How Much Is It?

Fees and charges are assessed according to the cost of the program. The Department does not want to exclude children who are unable to pay fees due to financial hardship. Resident families unable to pay all or part of the fees should contact the office.

Need To Transfer?

Transfers will be made at no charge.

Need A Refund?

Refunds will be made upon request up until 1/3 of the scheduled classes have been held (i.e. 3 classes of a 10 week session) except as noted in individual class descriptions. You may expect your refund check 2 to 4 weeks after your request is received

A \$3 service fee will be charged on each refund initiated by the participant.

Open House

You are welcome to discuss your child's progress after each class and attend the open house held during the final class session.

Makeups?

Classes missed for individual absences (i.e. illness, vacations, etc.) are not "made up" nor may participants attend classes other than the one they are registered for.

Activities cancelled by the Department will be rescheduled, if possible. If a class is unable to be rescheduled, no refunds will be issued.

Can I Watch?

In an effort to avoid distractions and interruptions in instruction, for your child to have recreation time with his/her peers, and for adults to have time in an adult-only atmosphere, relatives, friends and/or other children are not permitted in class-rooms or the pool during instruction.

Have A Complaint?

If a class does not meet your expectations, please contact the Oak Creek Parks, Recreation & Forestry Office at 768-6515 to discuss your concerns.

Do You Have Insurance?

Insurance coverage for program participants is not provided by the Department or by the School District for Department sponsored activities.

DEERFIELD: Front entrance to school.

ST. JOHN'S SCHOOL: 2525 W. Oakwood Road. Please enter using the driveway located behind the church, between the church and cemetery

Am I A Resident?

The resident fee applies to any person whose primary residence is within the Oak Creek city limits at the time of registration and children in the Oak Creek-Franklin School District. Current proof of City residency is required once per year (August 1-July 31) to receive resident fees.

What If?

My child wants to be on the same team or in a class with a friend or sibling.

Siblings who meet the requirements for the same class section or sports league will be placed together unless otherwise requested in writing by the parent or guardian. All other requests for unrelated children to be placed together:

- are not guaranteed
- will be for a maximum of 3 persons
- may result in the entire group being placed on the waiting list
- must be in writing and signed by parents/guardians of both children

I want to register with my adult friend:

- ◆ If one person is placed on the wait list, the entire group will be placed on the wait list
- ◆ If one person is a non-resident, the entire group will be processed during non-resident registration (if space is available)

Note: All "Buddy Link" Requests:

◆ If you request a buddy link and "the buddy" does not register by lottery deadline, you will be wait listed for the class.

Proof of Date of Birth

- ◆ Proof of date of birth for all children is required at their first registration.
- ◆ If the child's name does not match the parent who is presening proof of residency, proof of residency in the child's name will be required at their first registration.
