PROGRAM UPDATES AND BUDGET CHALLENGES

The City of Oak Creek has sought and received thoughtful public input on several priority initiatives. These initiatives include; the redevelopment of nearly 250 acres of former lakefront industrial property east of 5th Avenue between Bender Park and the MMSD water reclamation facility and the former Delphi manufacturing facility located on the southwest corner of Howell and Drexel Avenues. The City will also be continuing planning efforts along the 27th Street corridor.

Annual Independence Day celebrations remind us that participation and involvement is critical to helping elected officials, administrators, planners and others take the steps needed to create the kind of places and community you wish to live in. Those citizens, who take the time to attend meetings, correspond with their thoughts, and answer surveys are owed all our gratitude as they help make our democracy work.

Reflection, and more importantly participation, is essential to democratic principles and ideals. The future is created and crafted by those citizens who take the time to participate in their government. This responsibility cannot be delegated. Thank you to those who volunteer and participate in their local school, government, and civic organizations.

Plans for redevelopment are well underway for the two previous mentioned locations. You can expect to see construction progress on these important community projects in the coming years. This work will reflect the input of your fellow citizens and be guided by professionals who have experience in this type of work paying attention to local economic and market realities. Investment in Oak Creek is essential to help meet the needs of our citizens and to create attractive conditions for our residents as well as to create a climate for local businesses to invest and prosper. Challenges are present today just as they always have been. Those communities which face the challenges directly, believe in their future, and are willing to invest in themselves have always been and will remain those that prosper through adaptation and constant improvement.

City officials are in the process of making adjustments to City operating costs made necessary to provide taxpayer relief in these difficult economic times. The City of Oak Creek is now in the third year where it has had no growth in revenues from taxes (local and State shared). It is certain this condition will continue for two more years through at least 2013.

Evaluation of costs, services, programs, and fees has marked budget reviews and discussions over the last several years and will continue as preparation of the 2012 budget is now underway. Public meetings on the City's budget will begin on September 20th. Let your elected officials know your thoughts. Try to keep in mind as you raise issues, you might also wish to suggest solutions.

Recently the Common Council voted to solicit bids for City refuse service from private firms to determine if garbage collection can be performed at lower cost through privatization. This review came about as a result of development of the current year budget. Also, as a result of State legislative action, \$350,000 in pension costs for non-police and fire employees will be borne by City employees rather than City of Oak Creek residents and businesses. If these same pension contributions were to be applied to police and fire employees, a further shift of \$488,000 in pension costs would occur. Fairness should dictate these pension contributions should be made by all employees not just some. Adjustments to employee and retiree health care are being reviewed which would shift over \$700,000 in costs to employees and reduce City future health care liabilities by \$15-30 million dollars. Employee pick up of these additional pension and health care contributions will have the effect of reducing their pay by 8-10%. Council members understand how important employees are to operations but they also realize the City must work to control costs and operate within its means. These actions are also part of the adaptation necessary to meet current economic conditions and realities as we continue to strive for meeting the service needs of the community.




Halloween Safety



With Halloween just around the corner, the Police Department would like to remind parents of a few tips to keep your children safe while trick-or-treating:

- •Children should always trick-or treat with an adult or older sibling.
- •Costumes should be reflective, flame retardant, and should fit properly to prevent trips and falls.
- Consider wearing makeup instead of a mask which may hinder or restrict your child's vision.
- ◆Stay in neighborhoods with people whom you are familiar with.
- Remind children not to eat their goodies before an adult can check them.
- •Eat only unopened candies and those in original wrappers only.
- Put your outside house light on to show that your family is participating in Trick-or-Treating.
- •Remove objects from your yard that might present a hazard to trick-or-treaters.
- •Keep an eye out for suspicious activities or persons in your neighborhood.

SUMMARY OF MAJOR IMPACTS OF THE NEW VOTER PHOTO ID BILL





- ✓ Electors must sign a poll book before being issued a ballot; there are certain exemptions for those electors with a disability and who cannot sign.
- Voters casting a provisional ballot have until 4 PM the Friday after the election to provide the required documentation (previously 4 PM Wednesday).
- Residency requirement is 28 consecutive days (previously 10 days).
- ✓ An elector can no longer use a corroborating witness.
- ✓ Electors are required to provide their most recent address where they were previously registered to vote.
- ✓ College students, in addition to using documents that all voters may use to provide proof of residency, may also establish residency for registration by using the combination of a college ID with a photo and a fee payment receipt that contains the student's residential address dated no earlier than 9 months before the election; or if the Clerk receives a certified list from the college containing the names, residential addresses & indicating which students are US citizens.
- ✓ In-person absentee voting begins the third Monday before the election not before.
- ✓ In-person absentee voting ends at 5 PM, or the close of business, the Friday before the election. No in-person voting can take place on the Saturday, Sunday or Monday before the election.
- ▼ There are other voter registration and absentee voting changes not listed here. Please contact the City Clerk's Office, visit the City's website, www.oakcreekwi.org, or the state at http://gab.wi.gov/elections-voting/photo-id for complete and current information from the Government Accountability Board (GAB) on the effects of this bill.

Fire Prevention Week is October 9-15

This annual event raises awareness for fire safety throughout the country. Following a declaration by President Woodrow Wilson in 1920, Fire Prevention Week has been recognized each year since 1922. It commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. However, on the same days, the largest forest fire in American history occurred in Peshtigo, Wisconsin. By the time the Peshtigo fire was completely extinguished, 16 towns were burned down and 1,152 people were killed.

This year, as in years past, the Oak Creek Fire Department will be visiting Oak Creek grade schools to spread the fire prevention message to the "Junior Firefighters." This year's theme is "It's Fire Prevention Week. Protect your Family from Fire." See you in October!

Meet the Fire Department

Tom Jonson began his firefighting career with the Town of Waukesha Fire Depart-

ment. During that time, Tom earned his Firefighter Levels One and Two and Driver Operator certifications. After six years with the



Town of Waukesha, he found himself with the opportunity to be hired in his hometown of Oak Creek. On February 12, 1995, Tom was officially hired by the Oak Creek Fire Department.

Tom continued his education as his career progressed with Oak Creek. He obtained his Fire Officer certification, his Associates Degree from MATC and was among the first Oak Creek paramedics to graduate from the Milwaukee County Paramedic program. Tom eventually was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in July of 2002 and then to Battalion Chief in February of 2010. He is currently finishing his Bachelor's Degree of Science in Emergency Management.

Throughout his career, Tom has seen numerous changes within the City of Oak Creek. Of those changes, he counts Oak Creek's advancement into the paramedic level of emergency medical service as the largest. Tom offers the following advice to anyone looking to enter into the fire service, "Get as much education as you possibly can. It's something that can never be taken away from you."


Tom still lives in Oak Creek with his wife Lisa. They have three children; Tyler, Alex and Emily.

Carbon Monoxide Safety

Carbon monoxide, an odorless, colorless gas, is a byproduct of the combustion of fossil fuels. When appliances such as furnaces, water heaters, dryers and stoves malfunction or are improperly vented, a buildup of carbon monoxide gas can occur. As this gas builds up in a home, occupants may experience headaches, nausea, dizziness, fatigue and confusion. At higher levels, carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms include vomiting, loss of consciousness, and even death. As the winter months draw upon us, the Oak Creek Fire Department would like to remind residents that carbon monoxide detectors should be placed on each level of their home. In addition, they should have appliances inspected by a licensed professional.

Burning Regulations

Outdoor burning on commercial and multifamily properties is prohibited without authorization from the Fire Chief or his/her designee.

The following safe burning guidelines should be followed:

- a. Wind velocity must be less than 10 miles per-hour.
- b. The size of the burning pile shall not exceed four (4) feet by four (4) feet and three (3) feet in height.
- c. Flammable or combustible liquids shall not be used to ignite or accelerate the fire at any point.
- d. The fire must be constantly supervised by a competent person, at least sixteen (16) years of age, until the fire is extinguished.
- e. The person supervising the fire shall have a means to extinguish the fire, such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher.
- f. The pile to be burned shall be a minimum of fifty (50) feet from a building or vehicle and twenty-five (25) feet from a roadway, highways, or other thoroughfares.
- g. If the smoke travels in such a manner to obscure any public roadway, highway, or other public thoroughfare the fire shall be extinguished.
- h. If the fire or smoke from the fire becomes a hazard or nuisance to your neighbors you will be required to extinguish the fire.
- i. Please consult with the Wisconsin
 Department of Natural Resources for burning regulations:

http://www.dnr.state.wi.us/org/caer/cs/licenses.htm

- j. Wisconsin law prohibits anyone from burning the following materials:
 - 1. Recyclable paper or cardboard
 - 2. Wet, combustible rubbish, such as wet cardboard or paper
 - 3. Oily substances, such as oily or greasy rags, oil filters, etc.
 - 4. Asphalt such as asphalt shingles or tar paper.
 - 5. Plastics of any kind, including platic bottles and plastic bags.
 - 6. Rubber products, including tires and hoses.
 - 7. Painted or treated wood.
- Remember the person starting the fire is legally responsible for any damage caused by the fire.



REMINDER: WINTER PARKING



Winter parking begins again December 1 & runs until April 1. During this time, there is no parking allowed on the streets in the

City of Oak Creek during the following hours:

SCHOOL BUS LIGHTS

With the start of the new school year, motorists are reminded to use caution when approaching school buses. Motorists should stop their vehicle not less than 20 feet from the bus when it is displaying flashing red warning lights and remain stopped until the bus resumes motion or extinguishes the flashing lights. This does not apply to vehicles traveling in the opposite direction on a

divided highway with a median. School bus operators may submit a written report to the



Police Department of those vehicles illegally passing a school bus with its red warning lights flashing. Upon receipt of this information, the Police Department will prepare a traffic citation and serve it upon the owner of the vehicle in violation. The fine for such violation is \$240. Help keep our children safe this school year—stop when you approach a bus flashing its red warning lights!

RECYCLING INFORMATION



I alaaa Daaa

On April 18th, 2011, a \$2/per day/per vehicle yard fee became effective. Your receipt is needed for multiple entries on the same day.

A window decal may be purchased for \$20 to allow for unlimited use of the recycling yard for the remainder of 2011. No fee will be collected if picking up free mulch or firewood.

Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill and has City pickup of garbage may use the recycling yard. Occupants of condos or trailer parks that have private garbage pickup may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste ONLY with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

The recycling yard will be **closed** on the following holiday dates:

Labor Day	Monday, September 5
Thanksgiving	Thurs., November 24
	Friday, November 25
Christmas	Friday, December 23
	Saturday, December 24
	Monday, December 26
New Years	Fri., December 30, 2011
	Sat., December 31, 2011
	Mon., January 2, 2012

The recycling yard hours are Monday through Saturday, 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. In addition to the regular hours, the yard is open Tuesday evenings ONLY until 8 p.m. starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September.

NO items may exceed 4' in length with the exception of branches, furniture, appliances & metals.

All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15 fee.

Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$3 per tire will be charged.

FINAL BRANCH PICK-UP

The last branch pick up for 2011 will begin Monday, October 3rd. Residents are reminded that branches should be placed at the curb or roadside prior to the 3rd to guarantee a pick up but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until April 2, 2012.

Reminder, branches are to be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pickup brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard, any time of the year, at 720 W. Puetz Road.

Next branch pick up will be April 2, 2012

FALL CLEAN-UP BEGINS NOVEMBER 15, 2011

The Street Department will conduct its fall clean up beginning Tuesday, November 15, 2011. There is no charge for this pick up (except for freon appliances). Items that will be picked up are as follows:

- · Yard Waste (excluding leaves, grass and branches)
- Furniture
- Wood •Appliances (Freon appliances-refrigera-
- tors, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers & water coolers, require a \$15 per item fee to be paid prior to pick-up).
- Construction Materials (not resulting from a contractor)
- Metal
- Mattresses
- Televisions · Carpeting/Rugs

Items that will not be picked up are as follows:

- Paints • Tires
- Batteries • Hazardous Materials
- Grass Clippings Leaves
- Fluorescent Tubes Branches

Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on November 15 in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick ups until the spring clean-up, May 15, 2012. See Special Pick-Ups section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you miss the Fall Clean-Up date.

SPECIAL PICK UPS

In addition to the fall & spring clean-ups that are provided at NO CHARGE, the City of Oak Creek provides special pickups for residents for a fee of \$25 for the following items:

- * Appliances (A \$15 additional fee will be charged for Freon appliances - refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers)
- * Furniture
- * Mattresses
- * Carpeting/Padding
- * Televisions
- * Metals of any kind

Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings ONLY. Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45 a.m. on the scheduled Friday. Residents requesting special pick ups must prepay their fees before noon on Thursday prior to pick up, in order to be put on that Friday's pick up schedule.

Please note that special pick ups will not be done for the following items:

- * Branches
- * Yard Waste
- * Recyclables
- * Tires
- * Contractor generated materials
- * Hazardous Waste * Concrete

- No third party checks accepted, other than from mortgage companies or banks specifically in payment of property tax.

 DO NOT COMBINE with other payments.
- CHECKS RETURNED from the bank

for any reason are subject to a \$25.00 recovery fee and payment is void.

PAYMENT DEADLINES

PAID IN FULL – PAYMENT IS DUE JANUARY 31st

INSTALLMENT OPTION, failure to pay at least the minimum amounts shown on the tax bill by each of their due dates will result in delinquency, forfeiture of the installment option plus interest & penalty charges as of February 1st. WE DO NOT SEND REMINDER NOTICES

- FIRST INSTALLMENT 50% of net real estate tax plus all special charges due on or before January 31st
- **SECOND INSTALLMENT** 25% of net real estate tax due on or before March 31st
- THIRD INSTALLMENT 25% of net real estate tax due on or before May 31st

PAYMENT OPTIONS

TRI CITY BANK - In Person at the five Oak Creek locations through JANUARY 31ST ONLY. A RECEIPT and IMMEDIATE REFUND for OVERPAYMENT (with proper ID) is given at the bank.

BY MAIL – Your tax bill will be returned with a receipt to the address on the tax bill, unless a self-addressed envelope is enclosed.

- ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31st ONLY: Please use the return envelope (to West Allis PO Box) enclosed with your tax bill.
- ON OR AFTER FEBRUARY 1st to: Treasurer, City of Oak Creek, PO Box 27, Oak Creek, WI 53154-0027.
- DO NOT use the return envelope after January 31st or it may be returned to sender unprocessed or delayed in delivery to the City of Oak Creek. The City is not responsible for returned or delayed mail, for taxes not immediately processed or that become delinquent or for interest and penalties on delinquent taxes. Postmarks from improperly addressed envelopes will not be honored. Payment by mail is TIMELY if:
- it is mailed to the City of Oak Creek in a properly addressed envelope,
- <u>postmarked</u> before midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment,
- with postage prepaid, and

• is received by the proper official not more than 5 days after the prescribed date for making the payment.

Payment postmarked by December 31st and received within 5 business days will be receipted as January but will reflect a December Postmark.

DRIVE-UP 24-HOUR DEPOSITORY,

located at City Hall on the east side of the south parking lot. CHECKS, CASHIER CHECKS OR MONEY ORDERS ONLY. Payment placed in the depository by midnight of the last date prescribed for making the payment is considered timely. Your tax bill will be returned with a receipt to the address on the tax bill, unless a self-addressed envelope is enclosed.

BY CREDIT CARD - We offer the availability of credit card payments for payment of real estate taxes and personal property taxes. In cooperation with the City of Oak Creek, Official Payments Corporation offers individuals and businesses the opportunity to pay property tax by way of a credit card by telephone or directly over the Internet. This service is safe, reliable, and in accordance with all state and government regulations. In order to process your payment, Official Payments Corporation, the credit card service provider, charges a convenience fee based on the amount of the transaction, currently 2.75% (\$1.00 minimum fee) subject to change without notice.

IN PERSON AT CITY HALL – Last year IMPORTANT CHANGES took place so please check the website and tax pamphlet you receive with your tax bill for specific dates and times for tax collection.

DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX

Payment not received on or before the last date prescribed for making the payment is delinquent. DELINQUENCY results in forfeiture of the installment option and accumulates INTEREST AND PENALTY charges from February 1st at 1 ½ percent per month on the entire unpaid principal balance, regardless of when it becomes delinquent. The USPS postmark governs the date of payment – NOT the date on the check.

LOTTERY AND GAMING CREDIT

If you received the 2010 Lottery and Gaming Credit on or before January 31, 2011, you do not need to recertify for 2011.

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

2010: The 2010 Lottery and Gaming Credit is \$77.71. If you qualify and did not receive the credit, mail a completed Late Lottery and Gaming Credit application, with a copy of your tax bill, to the State of Wisconsin Department of Revenue at the address shown on the application, by October 1, 2011. You must also complete and return the 2011 Lottery and Gaming Credit application (see below).

2011: Complete and return the 2011 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office by November 30, 2011 for the credit to appear on your 2011 and future Real Estate Tax Bills.

Lottery and Gaming Credit applications are available on our website or at the Treasurer's Office.

OTHER INFORMATION

There is a \$.25 charge for additional copies of tax bills, payable in advance. You may print them free of charge off the internet. Computers with internet service are

available at the Oak Creek Public Library (north of City Hall); you may print a copy for \$.15 at the Library.

CONTROL STORMWATER RUNOFF WITH TREES

Trees are part of the solution for reducing stormwater runoff in our region. According to the American Forests, a healthy tree




canopy can reduce stormwater runoff, saving a community mllions of dollars in storm sewer infrastructure. Trees improve a city's ability to absorb rainfall in two ways:

- Raindrops cling to leave and branches slowing their fall and giving the ground more time to absorb excess water. Some raindrops evaporate from trees, never hitting the ground.
- 2) Tree roots break up soil, which allows more water to be absorbed instead of running directly into rivers and lakes, picking up pollution along the way. During light rains, more water drains into the soil, which helps replenish aquifers for drinking water.

Additionally, trees can help reduce noise in urban areas, create habitat for birds and wildlife, provide natural, aesthetic, and recreational benefits. Rainfall interception is influenced by the intensity and duration of the rainfall event the tree species (deciduous, broadleaf evergreen, or conifer), tree architecture (size, number and arrangement of leaves and branches), and weather (temperature, relative humidity, net solar radiation, and wind speed).

Trees store more water during a small oneinch rainfall event that lasts two days versus one that last only two hours. Small

The larger the tree, the more stormwater it can manage.



storms are responsible for most of the annual pollutant loading of our streams, rivers and lakes. Urban forests play an important role in protecting water quality by intercepting rainfall and snow-ice melt and reducing runoff pollution. A medium-sized tree can intercept as much as 2,380 gallons of rainfall per year.

Strategies to enhance the urban forest and improve the control of stormwater runoff, include:

- Plant more trees in appropriate places,
- Improve the maintenance of existing trees,
- Plant species with a higher rate of growth where appropriate,
- Plant species with architectural features that maximize interception
- Plant trees in groves where possible,
- Use native trees, which, once established.

can easily withstand summer dry seasons and reduce the need for supple-



mental irrigation.

AVOID BINGE

DRINKING During the Labor Day weekend and other holidays, people tend to consume even higher quantities of alcohol, endangering themselves and others around them. Binge drinking, defined as five or more drinks on a single occasion for men or four or more drinks on a single occasion for women, generally within about two hours, is a dangerous pattern of alcohol consumption. Binge drinking is associated with motor vehicle crashes, drowning, personal violence, unintended pregnancy, high blood pressure, and affects other medical condition. In addition to the problems mentioned above, youth who binge drink may experience sexual assaults, school, social, and legal problems, memory problems, changes in brain development, and increased risk of alcohol problems. Celebrate the holiday with limited alcohol consumption to keep your family safe and healthy.

SEASONAL FLU VACCINATION CLINICS

One of the best ways to prevent seasonal flu is to receive the influenza vaccine each year. The Centers for Disease Control recommends that all persons 6 months and over receive flu vaccine. In addition to vaccination, cover your cough and wash your hands frequently to reduce influenza illness. Flu clinic dates and information will be on our website and on the City Hall reader board once scheduled. www.oakcreekwi.org/health.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT)

Following a major disaster, first responders who provide fire and medical services may be overwhelmed.

LYME DISEASE PREVENTION WHEN HUNTING OR HIKING

Lyme disease is an infection transmitted by the bite of a deer tick commonly found on vegetation and animals. Symptoms of the disease include fever, chills, headache, stiffness in joints, weakness and fatigue.

To prevent contracting the disease wear long sleeves and pants. Also, apply an insect repellant containing the chemical commonly known as DEET (in a concentration of 20 to 30%). Brush off clothing before going inside and immediately remove any attached tick with a tweezers by grabbing the head and pulling it straight out. Contact your health care provider if you suspect that you have been exposed.

FALLS AMONG OLDER ADULTS

Falls can be prevented! Don't let the fear of falling rule your life. There are many simple things you can learn to reduce the risk of falling. The Oak Creek Health Department offers a Fall Prevention Program called Stepping On. Please call for more information. WIC WORKS WONDERS

PRECAUTIONS FOR HANDLING & CONSUMING CANTALOUPE

Improperly handling of fresh cantaloupe can increase your risk of food borne illness. Over the past five years there have been five outbreaks linked to cantaloupe, according to outbreakdatabase.com.

As precautionary measures the following handling procedures are recommended:

1) Thoroughly clean knives and cutting

- surfaces after cutting the melon open and prior to scooping out the seeds.
- 2) Wash your hands after handling the exterior of the melon.
- 3) Refrigerate the cut slices of melon to

prevent the potential growth of harmful bacteria.



For Your Information . . .

RAKING OF LEAVES IS PROHIBITED

The City of Oak Creek has adopted Ordinance No. 1984, which prohibits



property owners from placing leaves, grass, yard waste or rubbish in the street, alley or sidewalk areas. For your convenience, the ordinance reads as follows:

"No owner or occupant shall allow the street, alley or sidewalk pavements abutting his premises to be littered with rubbish, dirt, grass, leaves or yard waste as defined in S. 8.40. If such owner or occupant shall refuse or fail to remove any such rubbish, dirt, grass, leaves or yard waste as defined in S.8.40 when notified to do so by the Common Council or designee, the City may cause it to be done and the cost thereof shall be reported to the City Clerk who shall spread the cost on the tax roll as a special tax against the premises, pursuant to Sec. 66.66(16), Wis. States. or such cost may be covered in action against the owner or occupant."

The City of Oak Creek **does NOT pick up leaves curbside.** Residents may bring their leaves to the drop-off site located at 720 West Puetz Road, Monday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. or Tuesday evenings until 8 p.m. through the month of September.

SNOW AND ICE
REMOVAL
The blowing and/or shoveling of snow onto City

streets is a violation of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code & is subject to a ticket which carries a \$114 fine. Section 6.24(c) reads as follows: "Prohibited Placement. No person, except the State, County or City shall deposit or cause to be deposited, upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public land, any snow or ice taken or removed from his premises. No person, except the State, County, or City shall use private or public lands within the City as a place for the disposal or dumping of snow or ice from public or private property or from another municipality except with the permission of the owner. The deposit of any snow or ice upon any street, alley, sidewalk, parkway, or public lands of the City, contrary to the provisions of this Chapter, shall be and is hereby declared to be a nuisance. The City may remove any snow and ice so deposited and cause the costs of such removal to be charged to the owner or occupant of the property from which said snow or ice was removed and illegally deposited, pursuant to Section 66.60(16), Wis. Stats."

Property owners are also required to keep the mailboxes and fire hydrants located on their property clear of snow and ice per Section 6.24(d) as follows: "Hydrants and Mailboxes. Every property owner or occupant shall keep all fire hydrants and mailboxes abutting his/her property free and clear of all snow and ice."

FAIR HOUSING IS YOUR RIGHT

Seeking housing is never an easy task. For many Milwaukee County residents, illegal discrimination makes finding & keeping housing much more difficult than it should be. Housing discrimination is common, yet most people remain unaware of its prevalence. Equal housing opportunity – the idea that all people should have equal access to all the housing they can afford – is still an elusive dream for our community.

Fair housing laws make it illegal for housing providers (landlords, real estate agents, apartment managers, etc.) to discriminate based on any of the following categories:

- * Race * Sex * Color * Disability
- * National origin/Ancestry
- * Religion *Marital Status *Age
- * Family status (household composition, including presence of children)
- * Sexual orientation
- * Lawful source of income

Housing discrimination appears in many different forms. Sometimes housing providers discriminate overtly by making statements to applicants such as "we only rent to working people," "no kids allowed," or "we don't rent to single moms."

METROPOLITAN MILWAUKEE FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL

In this day and age, however, housing discrimination is often subtle & difficult to detect. Sometimes people leave an interaction with a housing provider not knowing that they were treated differently than other people because of their race, because they have kids or because they have a disability.

The following are some possible "red flags"

- that may indicate illegal discrimination:

 * You called about an apartment for rout
- * You called about an apartment for rent. You were told that it has been rented, but you continue to see that apartment advertised in the newspaper or with a "for rent" sign.
- * You ask to make an appointment to see an apartment, & the landlord tells you that you must bring your entire family along
- * A landlord or apartment manager gives you confusing or contradictory information.
- * You are told of extremely long waiting lists.
- * You are told that you don't meet a housing provider's eligibility criteria, but the provider won't tell you what the eligibility requirements are.
- * A landlord, rental manager, or real estate agent doesn't return your phone calls.
- * Your lease is non-renewed for no apparent reason.
- * Your landlord refuses to allow you to make modifications to your apartment to make it physically accessible for you.

If you're concerned that you may have experienced a violation of fair housing law, there are ways to address the problem. Victims of housing discrimination have the right to pursue complaints in public administrative agencies, such as the Wisconsin Equal Rights Division. People with housing discrimination complaints may also file lawsuits in state or federal court. If you have any questions regarding housing discrimination, fair housing laws and what your options may be for pursuing a complaint of housing discrimination, call the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council at **278-1240.**

IS SHE/HE OLD ENOUGH?

For all programs, age requirements will be as of the date of the first class, unless otherwise specified. Please do not request to

have your child put in a class he/she does not belong in. All age requirements are set to benefit the children and make instruction more consistent for the program leader. In some in- Happy Birthday stances, the requirements have been set for the child's safety.



HOW MUCH IS IT?

Fees and charges are assessed according to the cost of the program. The Department does not want to exclude children who are unable to pay fees due to financial hardship. Resident families unable to pay all or part of the fees should contact the office.

NEED TO TRANSFER?

Transfers will be made at no charge.

NEED A REFUND?

Refunds will be made upon request up until 1/3 of the scheduled classes have been held (i.e. 3 classes of a 10 week session) except as noted in class descriptions. You may expect your refund check 2 to 4 weeks after your request is received.

A \$3 service fee will be charged on each refund initiated by the participant.

OPEN HOUSE

You are welcome to discuss your child's progress after each class and attend the open house held during the final class session.

MAKEUPS?

Classes missed for individual absences (i.e. illness, vacations, etc.) are not "made up" nor may participants attend classes other than the one they are registered for.
