# CITY ADMINISTRATOR GERALD PETERSON



The City of Oak Creek is seeing signs of an improving local economy. Significant interest from mixed use developers at Drexel Town Square (DTS) is expected to result in construction commitments and announcements throughout the spring and summer of 2014. Infrastructure work for DTS will begin in May, and is

expected to be completed by summer of next year. The City has issued \$23.5 million in debt for this work, which is expected to be paid out of the Tax Increment Funds generated from new development at the project site. A new city hall and library will be under construction at DTS in May 2014, with occupancy in the summer of 2015. A new fire station to replace the obsolete building on Puetz Road will also be under construction this May. The new fire station will be constructed on Centennial Drive across the street from the U.S. Post Office.

The City has had discussions with a number of significant retail businesses about several sites in the City. We are also in discussions with a number of warehouse and manufacturing businesses seeking to locate here. The increase in job opportunities within the City that will come from location decisions to Oak Creek by these companies will be welcomed and will help to drive positive economic spinoffs to other parts of the local economy.

The City is well positioned to serve manufacturing and warehouse needs. Lease space is available in existing buildings, and new development sites, including the 220 acre Oakview Business Park, will be available for new buildings.

Much of the basis for delivering a positive business climate in the City comes from its six active TIF districts. The City has a history of providing infrastructure to generate activity and create local jobs within these districts. In 2014, tax increments from these districts are expected to produce \$1.43 million in tax payments, enabling the City to meet all of its financial obligations for the districts.

Since 2012, City staff, working with select consultants, has been successful in applying for and receiving grants of nearly \$6.5 million to help complete priority projects. This summer, you will see the construction of Lakeshore Boulevard begin on City Lake Vista property north of Milwaukee County's Bender Park. This work will be supported with funds from a variety of grant sources and will begin to ready the property for public use and enjoyment. A variety of grants will help the City implement best stormwater management practices and energy conservation at the City Hall, Library, and Fire Station. Grant funds, will also help the City rebuild several bridges.

The library will be located directly in the heart of Drexel Town Square, connected by a large public area to the new City Hall. meat on a clean platter, rather than back on the one that held the raw meat. Always wash your hands after handling raw foods of animal origin. Separate: Always keep cold foods cold and hot foods hot. When you're finished eating, refrigerate leftovers promptly. Don't let food sit out for more than two hours. On a hot day (90°F or higher), reduce this time to one hour. Cook: When grilling, always use a meat thermometer to ensure that meats reach the minimum internal cooking temperature. Chill: Put perishable items in a cooler or insulated bag. HINT: One is at a stop sign and the other is near the sidewalk as you walk to the beach close to the

RADON KITS - REDUCE YOUR RISK OF LUNG CANCER FROM RADON IN YOUR HOME. Radon is colorless and odorless and has been proven to increase the risk of lung cancer over a lifetime of exposure. The only way to know if you are at risk is to have your home tested. The Health Department has test kits available to residents for a minimal fee: \$5.25 for a short-term kit and \$10 for a long-term kit.



#### **ANIMAL HEALTH AND SAFETY**

Be courteous to others with your pets during the warm weather months.

- Dog bites are reportable to the police department, please be cautious with your animal as they may come into contact with more people as the weather warms.
- Please remember that when walking your pet, animal waste must be immediately picked up (when off your personal property).
- It's illegal to allow an animal to run at large. Using an extended leash, such as a reel that reaches beyond 10 ft. is deemed allowing an animal to be running at large.
- Don't allow accumulations of animal waste to occur in your yard to the extent that it causes odors or a breeding area for flies.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

#### **GRILLING SAFETY**

There is nothing better than a barbecue on a warm summer night. The Oak Creek Fire Depart-

ment would like to make sure that residents keep safety in mind when they fire up their grills.

#### GAS GRILL SAFETY TIPS

- Check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes, and leaks. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the hose or tubing.
- 2. Move gas hoses as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease.
- 3. Always keep propane gas containers upright.
- 4. Never store a spare gas container under or near the grill or indoors.
- 5. Never store or use flammable liquids, like gasoline, near the grill.
- Never keep a filled container in a hot car or car trunk. Heat will cause the gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape.

#### CHARCOAL GRILL SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Never burn charcoal inside of homes, vehicles, tents, or campers.
- 2. Charcoal should never be used indoors, even if ventilation is provided.
- 3. Since charcoal produces CO fumes until the charcoal is completely extinguished, do not store the grill indoors with freshly used coals.
- 4. Allow charcoal and ashes to completely cool prior to disposal

#### **SMOKING SAFETY**

The National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) has released its latest statistics regarding fires involving the misuse of smoking materials. In 2011, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 90,000 smoking-material fires. These fires resulted in an estimated 540 civilian deaths, 1,640 civilian injuries, and \$621 million in direct property damage.

Please keep these precautions in mind if you intend to smoke in your home:

- If you smoke, smoke outside.
- Whenever you smoke, use deep, wide, sturdy ashtrays. Ashtrays should be set on something sturdy

and hard to ignite, like an end table.

- Before you throw out butts and ashes, make sure they are out.
   Dowsing in water or sand is the best way to do that.
- Check under furniture cushions and in other places people smoke for cigarette butts that may have fallen out of sight.
- Smoking should not be allowed in a home where medical oxygen is used.
- To prevent a deadly cigarette fire, you have to be alert. You won't be if you are sleepy, have been drinking, or have taken medicine or other drugs.

#### **DIAL 911**

It may seem like a simple task, but in the event of an emergency, dial 911 to reach fire, rescue and emergency medical services. Time is of the utmost importance in the event of an emergency and every second counts. For example, fires double in size every minute. Fires that start out small can easily grow to engulf entire buildings. Serious medical conditions like a heart attack, stroke, or traumatic injury require immediate attention by medical personnel. The Oak Creek Fire Department provides not only fire suppression, but also Paramedic level emergency medical care. With three stations strategically located throughout the city, the Fire Department is only minutes away.

#### MOVE OVER FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES

Every year in the U.S., there are almost 16,000 collisions involving fire department emergency vehicles while responding to or returning from incidents. These collisions result in over 1,000 firefighter injuries and almost 50 deaths.

Many people panic or simply don't adhere to

the rules of the road for approaching emergency vehicles. The law is very specific; drivers must yield the right-ofway to an emergency vehicle, and failure to do so can cause serious accidents or delays in ambulances, fire engines, and fire trucks arriving at the scene of an emergency. Firefighters are careful to avoid vehicle collisions by driving slowly when traveling against traffic, or coming to a complete stop at intersections. However, the cooperation of ALL vehicles on the roadway is essential. There are some simple rules to follow when you're on the road and encounter an emergency vehicle:

#### DO:

- · Stay calm.
- Pull to the right and come to a complete stop.
- If you're traveling on a high-speed road or if there is no room to stop, slow down as much as possible.
- If you are in the left lane, pull over into the right lane as traffic in the lane to your right moves over.
- When an emergency vehicle approaches you from behind while you are stopped at an intersection, stay where you are unless you can pull to the right.
- Be careful when driving by or around a motor vehicle accident or any situation where emergency vehicles are parked and the firefighters are working.
- Drivers should stay at least 500 feet behind emergency vehicles.

#### DON'T:

- Don't panic.
- Don't play your radio so loudly that you are unable to hear sirens.
- Don't stop in the middle lane when there is room to pull to the right.
- Don't pull to the left in the center lane or left turn lane.
- Don't race ahead to make the green light or turn before the emergency vehicle gets there.
- Don't drive through a red light or stop sign when an emergency vehicle approaches from behind.
- Don't disregard the presence of the emergency vehicle by continuing to drive.
- Don't pass emergency vehicles that are traveling with their lights and siren on.

#### **WARM WEATHER REMINDERS**

- With the warm weather comes more activities outside. There are more car windows down and gatherings at residences. Please be courteous of your neighbors with regard to *loud noise and music levels*. The Oak Creek Police Department responds to complaints at all times of the day, but the main hours of enforcement for loud noise/music (per City Ordinance) is between the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m. The *Noise Ordinance* also designates that lawn care equipment cannot be operated between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Rummage sale, garage sale, advertising or other such signs cannot be placed on streets, sidewalks or other public right-of-ways, nor can they be attached to public utility poles. Illegally posted signs will be removed by police personnel.
- City Ordinance prohibits the sale, possession or use of illegal *fireworks*, except paper caps, snakes and sparklers. Keep in mind that sparklers can get as hot as 1,200 degrees and can cause serious injury to young hands and eyes.

#### **SUMMERTIME HOME SECURITY**

The Oak Creek Police Department would like to remind homeowners of a few simple tips to protect your home during this ever-popular "vacation" time of year:

• Residents can request a "vacation watch" of their home by the Oak Creek Police Department. Prior to leaving for vacation, contact the Department at 762-8200 (press "0" for Dispatch) and

provide the dispatcher with information (i.e., your departure/return date, whether lights will be left on and when, if vehicles will be left in the driveway, any designated keyholders, etc.). Our Police Aides will conduct periodic checks of your home while you are gone.

- Do not allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers, or flyers to build up while you are away. Arrange for a friend or neighbor to pick up these items or stop your mail at the post office.
- Give your house a lived-in appearance. Put automatic timers on several lights, a radio, and a television. Set the timers so that the lights and appliances will turn on and off at random times. Leave shades and blinds in a position that you would normally leave them. Ask your neighbor to use your driveway and garbage cans.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended period of time.
- Make sure all locks on the doors and

windows function properly, and use them. Don't leave keys under doormats, flower-



pots, mailboxes or other "secret" hiding places. Burglars know where to look for hidden keys.

- Make sure smoke and burglar alarms function properly and are armed.
- Turn the ringer on your telephone down low or off and leave a normal message on your answering machine.
- Keep a detailed inventory of your valuables, including a description of the items, date of purchase, original value, and serial numbers, and keep a copy in a safe place away from home. Etch personal identification codes on your valuables with an engraving tool. You can also make a photographic or video record of items in your home.
- Be a good neighbor. Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other.



If you notice anything suspicious, call **9-1-1** immediately and report it to the police.

#### WATER FRIENDLY LANDSCAPING

Owners of property near a detention pond, ditch, creek, lake, or other waterway have some unique landscaping opportunities and challenges. Many natural landscape techniques offer appealing habitat to help attract butterflies and songbirds, while also helping protect the water.



A landscaped, more natural buffer zone along the water's edge, rather than traditional lawn, has many benefits, including less mowing and maintenance.

Planting native flowers and decorative grasses can improve habitat. It also helps water quality by reducing the amount of pollutants getting into the water. A vegetated buffer zone can be created in a number of ways, many of which actually reduce time and effort needed to maintain the area.

- Native plants can provide food and habitat to attract songbirds and butterflies to your yard. Information on native shoreland plant species is available from the UW-Extension at www.cleanwater.uwex.edu/pubs/index.htm.
- A buffer zone can be created simply by establishing a "no-mow" zone along the water's edge. Turf grasses will grow 12-24 inches tall before going to seed
- For creating or maintaining a view of the water, consider selective removal of branches, trees, shrubs and ground cover to create clear areas while maintaining vegetation in other areas.
- Please note that City ordinance requires natural lawns to be maintained at a height of 12 inches or less, and certain areas, such as platted subdivisions with buildings on 50% or more of the lots, are required to maintain the grass at six inches or less. Additionally, noxious weeds such as ragweed are excluded from the definition of natural lawn. If you have a question, please check with the City Inspection department to determine specific requirements for your property prior to establishing a vegetated buffer area.

Some homeowners dump grass clippings on the bank of a pond, ditch, waterway, or wetland adjacent to their property. Unfortunately, as these clippings break down, they will add nitrogen and other compounds to the water, which contributes to algae growth and odors. Disposal of grass clippings or other yard waste on the banks of a waterway is prohibited by Section 8.23(b) of the Municipal Code.

#### **OUTDOOR BUILDING PROJECTS**

Now that spring has finally arrived, homeowners may be considering doing outdoor building proj-



ects that require permits. The City website has information, brochures and permit application forms to help you get started. They can be found under the Inspection Department tab at this online address:

The City requires permits for the following structures: fence, deck, pool, shed (greater than 120 square feet), detached garage, gazebo, pergola.

#### **SETBACKS**

The first step, is to map out where in your yard the structure will be built. The distance from a lot line or house to the accessory structure is called a setback. Setback information is required for all accessory structures except fences. Fences can usually be built on the lot line. There are exceptions if a property has certain types of easements. More information on setbacks can be found in the Oak Creek Municipal Code, Chapter 17. Zoning Code, at this online address:

To assist property owners in determining setbacks, the City may provide a copy of the "plat of survey" or map of the lot, if one is on file. If no survey is on file, a printout from the City's Geographical Information System may be used when applying for a permit.

#### **PLANS**

A detailed drawing is required showing how the structure will be built, except for sheds, fences and pools. The



plan may be one that is drawn by the homeowner or a professional architect. Most home improvement stores offer customized building plans for decks and other structures. If a hot tub is to be installed on a raised deck, structural calculations are required.

#### **APPLICATIONS**

The 'City of Oak Creek Building Permit Application,' form is used for the above listed projects, except for sheds and garages. Sheds and garages require a completed 'Accessory Building Permit Application.' The shed information provided by the homeowner on the form will be accepted in lieu of plans. Homeowners who are doing the work themselves must sign a 'Cautionary Statement to Owners Obtaining Building Permits.' Contractors doing work in the City must provide their Dwelling Contractor Certification number or BCR number, and their Dwelling Contractor Qualifier number.

#### SUBMITTAL AND APPROVAL

When you are ready to apply, present application form, plans and copy of survey to the Inspection Department. Fees are listed under the department's tab on the City website. Fees may be paid at the time of application or after the permit is approved. The City accepts checks or cash for payment. Processing of the permit can take up to two weeks, and applications are reviewed in the order in which they are received.

Any electrical work, such as wiring for swimming pool pumps, requires a separate electrical permit. Either a homeowner or a contractor may obtain an electrical permit.

#### **INSPECTIONS**

Required inspections will be listed on the approved permit or an attached memo. The cost of inspections is included in the permit fees.







#### STREET TREE PRUNING - PART I

Street trees are planted for two main reasons: aesthetics and the many positive environmental benefits they provide. Specifically, street trees are placed along the roadways where they can:







Increase property values,

And much, much more...

Often times large growing trees are selected for street tree planting because the larger the street tree size, the greater the impact on the surrounding environment and the sense of place. Large growing trees can easily be 50 to 70 feet tall at maturity. Ideally, a street tree that is 60 feet tall will have at least 1/3 trunk to 2/3 canopy (a 20:40 ratio).

Street trees require a special type of pruning that is often misunderstood. In general, tree pruning is a misunderstood science: some of the concepts are not ob-

vious. Pruning is a semester long class and a lifetime of reflection ever after. In a series of articles, I will discuss some of the basic pruning concepts for street trees which, by the way, can be applied to most landscape trees to achieve a lasting form. Street trees are pruned for the following reasons:

- 1. Crown raising/Clearance over the street and sidewalk
- 2. Lasting, safe structure i.e. a straight central leader with adequate branch
- 3. Deadwood removal

#### **GENERAL TREE GROWTH**

It helps to understand how trees grow when anticipating the response a tree will have to pruning. Each year that a tree grows it puts a layer (which we read as a ring) around the outside of the trunk and every branch and twig. The oldest growth is on the inside of the trunk and branches. The second type of growth is at the end of each branch, both terminal (end) and lateral (side). New branches will also begin from lateral branch buds. Other buds become flowers or leaves. Contrary to common misunderstanding, a branch never moves up higher on a stem as a tree grows taller. In the forest, due to shading, branches and stems "stretch" and grow toward the light in the upper canopy or at the sides of the forest. Most lower branches will be cut off from

nutrients and "selfprune."

The only way for lower branches to be removed when a tree grows in full sun is by pruning. Commonly this type of pruning is called "crown raising." Even in full

squeeze out lower or internally



shaded branches.

#### **TIMING**

We sometimes get calls inquiring as to why we were in the neighborhood but didn't prune all of the trees. Different species of trees have dramatically different growth rates. For that reason, with information from our most recent inventory (2012), we direct our pruning schedule by species.

There is also a seasonal timing that is appropriate for many trees. For instance, to avoid insect/disease invasion, it is recommended that certain trees only be pruned during the dormant (non-growing) season. Elm is a winter-only prune due to Dutch Elm Disease. After the onset of Oak Wilt, oak was added to that list. Now we have added ash due to Emerald Ash Borer. And, we try to prune as many honeylocusts as possible in the winter to avoid the Nectria canker fungus. In general, winter is an acceptable time to prune most trees.

Other seasonal considerations are to prune fruit trees, such as crabapple, in March but they can be pruned at other times of the year. And, maple is best pruned in August and early September but specifically not later into the fall.

Good times to avoid pruning, if possible, are when trees are expending a lot of energy such as during leaf-out, flowering, early seasonal growth (through June) and leaf-drop.

In our next issue, we will continue with the technical details of training/structural pruning.

#### MULCH

Generally, from mid-April through mid-November, mulch is often available for free pick-up at the

recycling yard. Residents may call the Street Department at 570-5682 to check availability and/or to be put on a list to have mulch delivered to their homes for a fee of \$25 per load (approximately 5 yards).

#### **GARBAGE & RECYCLING INFORMATION**

Per Section 8.41 of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code, household combined garbage not placed in a container provided by the City of Oak Creek, will not be collected. Also, all containers shall be stored upon private property & screened from public view and shall not be stored in the front yard setback.

Also per Section 8.42, garbage shall be placed for collection no later than 6:45 a.m. of the morning of collection. Then per Section 8.43, no carts shall be placed at the curb any earlier than 6:45 p.m. on the day prior to the scheduled collection day. Also, resident shall restore containers to their original storage location after collection on the same day as the collection.

If you find your **BLUE** garbage cart is always overflowing, you may purchase an additional cart from the Street Department. These carts will become your property. Contact the Street Department at 570-5682 for pricing.

Also contact the Street Department for any repairs or replacements needed for your **BLUE** garbage carts.

#### RECYCLING YARD INFORMATION

The recycling yard is located at 720 W. Puetz Road & is open Tuesdays, Fridays & Saturdays 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. Rethink

In addition to the regular hours, the yard is open Tuesday evenings ONLY until 8 p.m. starting the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday in September.



Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill and has City pickup of garbage may use the recycling yard. Occupants of condos or trailer parks that **NOT** pickup brush have private garbage pickup may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste ONLY with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

The recycling yard will be **closed** on the following holiday:

Friday, July 4, 2014

- ✓ NO items may exceed 4' in length except for branches, furniture, appliances & metals.
- ✓ NO contractor vehicles will be allowed in to the yard.

The yard does **NOT** accept shingles, roofing materials, grass, gas, medical or hazardous waste, paints or vehicle salvage.

All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15 per unit fee. Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers.

Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$3 per tire will be charged.

\*\*\*USAgain now has a bin located at the yard for depositing textile items such as clothing, shoes, bedding, towels, curtains, handbags, backpacks, etc...It is located at the end of the garbage compactors. See yard attendant if you have any questions.

#### **BRANCH PICK-UP DATES**

Branches will be picked up beginning on the following dates:

Monday, June 2 Friday, August 1 Wednesday, October 1

To guarantee that your branches are picked up, you must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above, but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. #### **BASKETBALL STANDARDS**

Section 6.25 Terrace Areas, Section (d) of the Municipal Code states: "No structures or fixtures shall be placed in

the terrace area. Examples of prohibited items would be basketball backstops. statuary, flagpoles and other objects. The exception to this subsection is the installation of a mailbox as specified by the United States Postal Service."

#### OAK CREEK POLICE - CONCERNED PARENTS PROGRAM

Did you know that you are responsible and can be **BUSTED**: held civilly liable for any underage person that is at your residence consuming alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs—even if you are on vacation and unaware of the party? Police officers are con-

cerned for the safety of all of our residents, and it is often better to confront an underage drinking party before something of a serious nature occurs, such as a car accident.

With the Concerned Parents Program, residents fill out a consent form and leave a key to their residence with the Police Department which will be held until their return. The signed consent form gives officers permission to enter their home during their absence, upon receipt of a complaint from a citizen or neighbor, in order to investigate suspected illegal activity such as underage drinking or drug use. An underage person cannot deny police officers' entry into your residence once you have given this consent. To register for this program, stop at the Oak Creek Police Department during normal business hours.

#### \*\*OFFICIAL NOTICE\*\* CITY OF OAK CREEK **Noxious Weed Ordinance**

#### PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

- (a) In addition to the weeds mentioned to be noxious under s. 66.0407(b), Wisconsin Statutes, the following weeds are also declared to be noxious weeds within the boundaries of the City of Oak Creek: Bull Thistle, Wild Carrot, Sour Dock, Wild Mustard, Chickory, Poison Oak, Poison Ivy, Sow Thistle, Burdock.
- (b) Except as provided in sub. (c), all weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on more than 50% of the lots in the subdivision, in multi-family apartments and complexes, planned developments and mobile home districts shall be cut to and maintained at a height not to exceed six (6) inches. All weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on 50% or less of the lots or which are not located in platted subdivisions and all weeds and grasses in business and manufacturing zoning districts shall be cut to a height not to exceed one foot (12 inches). The City may cause all weeds, grass and brush to be cut and removed, in accordance with this subsection and the cost thereof shall be charged to the property owner pursuant to Section 66.0627 Wis. Stats.

(c) The provisions for destruction of noxious weeds and cutting of all weeds and grass as provided above shall not apply to areas which are designated by the Common Council as nature centers or wildlife preserves.






