

#### **DOWNTOWN OF THE FUTURE ~ Drexel Town Square**



As we move closer to the opening of the new City Hall and Library components of the Drexel Town Square development, it's also important to highlight the restoration of natural wetlands on the west side of the property. Previously the site of a railroad spur for the AC Delco Corporation, the area is being restored to its natural state as part of the overall site plan for Drexel Town Square.

This natural area is part of an environmentally-conscious water management system designed to reduce runoff and naturally filter storm water on the site, reducing the impact to our environment. The wetland area encompasses seventeen acres in total, with 8 devoted to wetland including wooded wetland, shallow marsh, deep water marsh, and 2.9 acres of open water. The remaining 9 acres will be classified as an upland natural area including deciduous hardwood forest, tall prairie and short prairie mixed with native shrubs.

An asphalt-paved path will allow public access to the wetlands area, giving residents the opportunity to walk through and around the site, which will also include highlighted destination points, honoring our city's history and some of our achievements. As part of our city's Fitness Challenge initiative, it is hoped that residents will use these areas as walking and running paths, linking them to our new downtown.

Much of the cost of the project has been mediated by grants that the City of Oak Creek has received, significantly reducing the impact on the infrastructure costs for the Drexel Town Square development. In addition to the wetland restoration Oak Creek has received a significant grant from the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewer District (MMSD) for pervious pavers in the

parking areas of the streets of Drexel Town Square, including Main Street, Market Street, Town Square Way, W. Clock Tower Place, and portions of 6th Street. These pavers allow water to slowly permeate the surface, helping to filter out pollutants as the water moves through the gravel underneath. The pavers also reduce icing issues during the transitional seasons, because as the snow melts, the water drains away down through the pavers rather than collecting in puddles that refreeze overnight and require salting the next day.

Work on the wetlands and paver projects will be ongoing, with the work expected to be completed in 2015. It's an exciting opportunity to link the environmental stewardship to new development, and will be another reason why Drexel Town Square will be a downtown of the future.



#### WARM WEATHER REMINDERS

- Noise: With the warm weather comes more activities outside. There are more car windows down and gatherings at residences. Please be courteous of your neighbors with regard to loud noise and music levels. The Oak Creek Police Department responds to complaints at all times of the day, but the main hours of enforcement for loud noise/music (per City Ordinance) is between the hours of 10 pm and 8 am. The Noise Ordinance also designates that lawn care equipment cannot be operated between the hours of 10 pm and 7 am.
- Signs: Rummage sale, garage sale, advertising or other such signs cannot be placed on streets, sidewalks or other public right-of-ways, nor can they be attached to public utility poles. Illegally posted signs will be removed by police personnel.
- Fireworks: City Ordinance prohibits the sale, possession or use of illegal fireworks, except paper caps, snakes and sparklers. Keep in mind that sparklers can get as hot as 1,200 degrees and can cause serious injury to young hands and eyes.

#### **SUMMERTIME HOME SECURITY**

The Oak Creek Police Department would like to remind homeowners of a few simple tips to protect your home during this ever-popular "vacation" time of year:

- Residents can request a "vacation watch" of their home by the Oak Creek Police Department. Prior to leaving for vacation, call the Department at 762-8200 (press "0" for Dispatch) and provide the dispatcher with information (i.e., your departure/return date, whether lights will be left on and when, if vehicles will be left in the driveway, any designated keyholders, etc.). Our Police Aides will conduct periodic checks of your home while you are gone.
- Do not allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers, or flyers to build up while you are away. Arrange for a friend or neighbor to pick up these items or stop your mail at the post office.
- Give your house a lived-in appearance. Put automatic timers on several lights, a radio, and a television. Set the timers so that the lights and appliances will turn on and off at random times. Leave shades and blinds in a position that you would normally leave them. Ask your neighbor to use your driveway and garbage cans.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended period of time.
- Make sure all locks on the doors and windows function properly, and use them. Don't leave keys under door-

mats, flowerpots, mailboxes or other "secret" hiding places. Burglars know where to look for hidden kevs.

- Make sure smoke and burglar alarms function properly and are armed.
- Turn the ringer on your telephone down low or off and leave a normal message on your answering machine.
- Keep a detailed inventory of your valuables, including a description of the items, date of purchase, original value, and serial numbers. Keep a copy in a safe place away from home. Etch personal identification codes on your valuables with an engraving tool. You can also make a photographic or video record of items in your home.
- Be a good neighbor. Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other. If you notice anything suspicious, call 9-I-I immediately and report it to the police.

# ON-LINE CHILD DEVELOPMENT SCREENING!

Developmental screenings such as the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) ensure your child is meeting important milestones before age five. It is a simple set of questions that focuses on gross motor, fine motor, personal social, problem solving, and communication skills. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that ALL children are screened at 9, 18, and 24 months of age or any time there is a concern. # GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING & COOKING POTENTIALLY HAZARDOUS FOODS

When preparing raw meat or poultry use the following minimum

internal cook temperature guidelines to protect you and others from potential food borne illness:

**Raw poultry**- 165 degrees F. for 15 seconds

Raw animal foods in microwave – 165 degrees F. rotated, stirred and held for 2 minutes covered

Comminuted meats (ground, chopped, restructured or combined)

155 degrees for 15 seconds
 Raw Shell eggs prepared for immediate service: 145 degrees for 15 seconds

# DID YOU KNOW? DISTRACTED DRIVING

- "In 2011, nearly one in five crashes (17%) in which someone was injured involved distracted driving" (Centers for DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION, 2014).
- "Studies show that drivers who send or receive text messages focus their attention away from the road for an average of 4.6 seconds. At 55 mph, this is equivalent to driving the length of a football field blindfolded" (GJEL Accident Attorneys, 2012).
- "In 2010, 3,092 people were killed in a crash involving a distracted driver" (American Safety Council, Inc., 2015).
- "In December 2012, more than 171 billion text messages were sent or received in the US." (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2014).
- "Drivers in their 20's make up 27 percent of the distracted drivers in fatal crashes" (NHTSA, n.d.).
- "Each day in the United States, more than 9 people are killed and more than 1,153 people are injured in crashes that are reported to involve a distracted driver" (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2014).
- "An additional, 421,000 people were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving a distracted driver in 2012, a 9% increase from the 387,000 people injured in 2011" (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2014).

#### **DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX**

DELINQUENCY results in forfeiture of the installment option and accumulates INTEREST AND PENALTY charges from February 1st at 1 ½ % per month on the entire unpaid principal balance, regardless of when it becomes delinquent.

Delinquent notices are mailed in June. Payment will be accepted by the City of Oak Creek through July 31, 2015.

#### LOTTERY AND GAMING CREDIT

Applications are available on our website or at the Treasurer's Office. Before applying, please be sure the credit does not already appear on your tax bill.

Those who qualify are owners of a home in Wisconsin who used the home as their primary residence on January 1 (Certification Date) of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year.

2014: Lottery and Gaming Credit is \$100.25. If you qualify and did not receive the credit, submit a 2014 Late Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the State by October 1, 2015, with a copy of your tax bill. Also submit the 2015 Lottery and Gaming Credit application as shown below.

2015: Submit the 2015 Lottery and Gaming Credit application to the Oak Creek Treasurer's Office by November 30, 2015; the credit will appear on the 2015 and future Real Estate Tax Bills.

#### PET LICENSING



Wisconsin State Statutes, Section 174 makes it mandatory for dogs and cats to be licensed.

#### LICENSING REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. For dogs (limit 2) & cats over 5 months of age
- 2. A current certificate of rabies vaccination showing the tag number & the expiration date (will be returned with the license), unless dates on the postcard are current 3. License year of January 1 through December 31 is due by MARCH 31.

Beginning April 1, a late fee will be charged except for A New Resident or New Pet Owner who licenses within 30 days of:

- residency
- obtaining a dog or cat on or after April 1
- when a dog or cat reaches 5 months of age on or after April 1

- 1. Check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes, and leaks. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the hose or tubing.
- Move gas hoses as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease.
- 3. Always keep propane gas containers upright.
- 4. Never store a spare gas container under or near the grill or indoors.
- 5. Never store or use flammable liquids, like gasoline, near the grill.
- 6. Never keep a filled container in a hot car or car trunk. Heat will cause the gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape.

#### **Charcoal Grill Safety Tips**

- 1. Never burn charcoal inside of homes, vehicles, tents, or campers.
- 2. Charcoal should never be used indoors, even if ventilation is provided.
- 3. Since charcoal produces CO fumes until the charcoal is completely extinguished, do not store the grill indoors with freshly used coals.
- 4. Allow charcoal and ashes to completely cool prior to disposal



#### SAFE SUMMER SWIMMING

Warmer weather means children spend much of their summer vacations in the water. Whether it's a backyard pool or open water such as a river or lake, parents can take several steps to keep their children safe this summer.

- Actively supervise children wherever they are
- Enroll children in swimming lessons as soon as possible to get them comfortable with the water.
- Small children should always swim with an adult and older children who are more experienced swimmers should swim with a buddy.

- Make sure that children only swim in designated swimming areas.
- Teach children that open water swimming is much different that swimming in a pool. Current/undertow, uneven bottom surfaces and weather conditions can have an effect on their experience in the water.
- Consider building a fence with a gate around your pool.
- •Install an alarm on the gate to alert you if a child enters the swimming pool area without your knowledge.

#### **TRAINING**

The Oak Creek Fire Department utilizes many venues for training purposes. Some of these venues may be located in areas that are in full view of the public. All department training will be indicated by the presence of a large roadway sign. When approaching these training sites, please observe the same precautions that you would if there was an actual emergency scene. If you have an idea for a training location, please contact Battalion Chief Joseph Pulvermacher at 414-570-5629.

#### **DIAL 911**

It may seem like a simple task, but in the event of an

emergency, dial 911 to reach fire, rescue and emergency medical services. Time is of the utmost importance in the event of an emergency and every second counts. For example, fires double in size every minute. Fires that start out small can easily grow to engulf entire buildings. Serious medical conditions like a heart attack, stroke, or traumatic injury require immediate attention by medical personnel. The Oak Creek Fire Department provides not only fire suppression, but also Paramedic level emergency medical care. With three stations strategically located throughout the city, the Fire Department is only minutes away.

# MOVE OVER FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES

Every year in the U.S., there are almost 16,000 collisions involving fire department emergency vehicles while responding to or returning from incidents. These collisions result in over 1,000 firefighter injuries and almost fifty deaths.

Many people panic or simply don't

adhere to the rules of the road for approaching emergency vehicles. The law is very specific; drivers must yield the right-of-way to an emergency vehicle, and failure to do so can cause serious accidents or



delays in ambulances, fire engines and fire trucks arriving at the scene of an emergency. Firefighters are careful to avoid vehicle collisions by driving slowly when traveling against traffic, or coming to a complete stop at intersections. The cooperation of ALL vehicles on the roadway is essential.

There are some simple rules to follow when you're on the road and encounter an emergency vehicle:

#### DO:

- · Stay calm.
- Pull to the right and come to a complete stop.
- If you're traveling on a high-speed road or if there is no room to stop, slow down as much as possible.
- If you are in the left lane, pull over into the right lane as traffic in the lane to your right moves over.
- When an emergency vehicle approaches you from behind while you are stopped at an intersection, stay where you are unless you can pull to the right.
- Be careful when driving by or around a motor vehicle accident or any situation where emergency vehicles are parked and the firefighters are working.
- Drivers should stay at least 500 feet behind emergency vehicles.

#### DON'T:

- · Don't panic.
- Don't play your radio so loudly that you are unable to hear sirens.
- Don't stop in the middle lane when there is room to pull to the right.
- Don't pull to the left in the center lane or left turn lane.
- Don't race ahead to make the green light or turn before the emergency vehicle gets there.
- Don't drive through a red light or stop sign when an emergency vehicle approaches from behind.
- Don't disregard the presence of the emergency vehicle by continuing to drive.
- Don't pass emergency vehicles that are traveling with their lights and siren on.

720 W. Puetz Road Tuesdays, Fridays & Saturdays 8 am until 3 pm

#### In addition:

Starting 1st Tuesday in April through last Tuesday in September Tuesday evenings only until 8 pm

Any residence that receives an individual property tax bill may use the recycling yard. Occupants of trailer parks that have private garbage pickup may use the recycling yard for disposal of yard waste only with the exception of grass clippings, which are not accepted.

The recycling yard will be **CLOSED** on:

Friday, July 3 & Saturday, July 4

- NO items may exceed 4' in length except for branches, furniture, appliances & metals.
- NO contractor vehicles will be allowed in to the yard.

The yard does **NOT** accept shingles, roofing materials, grass, gas, medical or hazardous waste, paints or vehicle salvage.

All freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers) brought to the recycling yard will be charged a \$15 per unit fee. Doors need to be removed from refrigerators & freezers.

A fee of \$7 per TV will be charged for drop off of same.

Tires brought to the recycling yard should be free of rims. A fee of \$3 per tire will be charged.



USAGAIN now has a bin located at the yard for depositing textile items such as clothing, shoes, bedding, towels, curtains, handbags, backpacks,

etc...It is located at the end of the garbage compactors. See yard attendant if you have any questions.

their spring clean-up beginning on Friday, May 15, 2015, for residential homes or condos that have City provided garbage & recycling pickup. There is **NO CHARGE** for this pick-up. Items that will be picked up are:

Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 am on Friday, May 15 in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick-ups until the fall clean-up on Monday, November 16. See Special Pick-Up section for information on how to make arrangements for a prepaid special pick-up for other times of the year or if you should miss the Spring Clean-Up date.

#### **SPECIAL PICK UPS**

In addition to the fall & spring clean-ups that are provided at NO CHARGE, the City of Oak Creek provides special pickups for residential homes or condos that have City provided pickup of garbage & recycling. The fee for this service is \$25 and includes pick up of the following items:

- · Appliances (\$15 additional fee will be charged for freon appliances - refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners & water coolers)
- Furniture
- Mattresses

- Carpeting/Padding
- · Metals of any kind
- Televisions (\$7 additional fee will be charged for each TV)

Special pick-ups are done on Friday mornings ONLY. Items for pick up must be at the road by 6:45 am on the scheduled Friday. Residents requesting special pick-ups must prepay the fees due by noon, the Thursday prior, in order to be put on that Friday's pick up schedule.

Please note that special pick ups will not be done for the following items:

- Branches
- Yard Waste
- Recyclables
- Tires
- Contractor generated materials
- · Hazardous Waste · Concrete/Stone



#### **BRANCH PICK-UP DATES**

Branches will be picked up beginning on the following dates:

Monday, June 1 Monday, August 3 Thursday, October 1

To guarantee that your branches are picked up, you must have them at the roadside BY the dates listed above. but no earlier than 2 weeks prior. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not be back until the next date listed.

Reminder, branches are to be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Roots should be separate from the brush pile. The Street Department WILL NOT pick up brush that is the result of a contractor doing work on your property. It is their responsibility to dispose of the brush properly.

Branches may also be brought to the recycling yard at 720 W. Puetz Road. The hours of operation are Tuesdays, Fridays & Saturdays, 8 am to 3 pm There are extended hours on Tuesdays from the first Tuesday in April through the last Tuesday of September when the hours are 8 am to 8 pm. #### **BASKETBALL STANDARDS**



There has been an ongoing problem with residents placing basketball standards in the

right-of-way (Terrace Area). This area is defined as that area between the curb and the sidewalk, and where no sidewalk exists, that area between the street pavement and the right-ofway/property line.

Section 6.25 Terrace Areas, Section (d) of the Municipal Code states: "No structures or fixtures shall be placed in the terrace area. Examples of prohibited items would be basketball backstops, statuary, flagpoles and other objects. The exception to this subsection is the installation of a mailbox as specified by the United States Postal Service."

#### **GARBAGE & RECYCLING CART INFORMATION**

Per Section 8.41 of the City of Oak Creek Municipal Code, household combined garbage not placed in a container provided by the City of Oak Creek or its contractor, will not be collected. Also, all containers shall be stored upon private property & screened from public view and shall not be stored in the front yard setback.

Also per Section 8.42, garbage shall be placed for collection no later than 6:45 am of the morning of collection. Then per Section 8.43, no carts shall be placed at the curb any earlier than 6:45 pm on the day prior to the scheduled collection day. Also, resident shall restore containers to their original storage location after collection on the same day as the collection.

As of January 1, 2015, Advanced Disposal collects both the garbage & the recycling for the City of Oak Creek. You should continue to use the carts you have in the same way. If you have collection issues, need additional carts, replacement carts or a repair to either of your carts, please contact Advanced Disposal at (262) 679-0860.

Effective, January 1, 2015, when there is a holiday within the week, from the holiday day forward, Advanced Disposal will be doing your pickups one day later than normal, for the holiday week only. The regular schedule will then resume the next week. Reminder signs are no longer placed street side.



#### DON'T TOP! WHAT IS TREE TOPPING?

Topping is reducing the size of a tree, using a very incorrect method. Technically, topping is cutting branches between nodes or cutting all branches off leaving only a trunk. Nodes are where stems and leaves attach to trunks or branches. Internodes are those stretches of stem between branch or leaf attachments.

#### Why do people top trees?

Trees are unwisely topped to reduce their size or remove dangerous branches. The irony is topping creates dangerous, fast-growing branches that can soon make trees taller and more hazardous than they were before topping!

#### Topping by any other name is still a crime.

Topping is also known as "tipping," "hat-racking," "heading," "rounding over," "de-horning," "stag-heading" or just plain "ugly."

#### How does a tree respond to topping?

#### How does topping hurt trees (and sometimes people!)?

To begin with, vigorous sprout growth robs a tree of underground reserves. At the same time, a tree loses some

ability to photosynthesize. In this state of shock and depletion, a tree is vulnerable to attack by insects and fungi; it is also open to sunscald.

Unlike natural branches, topping sprouts are weakly attached to the branch or trunk they arise from. Because topping sprouts often grow vigorously and close to each other, they can become squeezed together as they grow. Topping sprouts often decay rapidly and break out easily as they gain size.

Frequently, the stem that was topped begins to decay (or had structural defects before topping). A dangerous combination exists when weakly attached sprouts, heavy with vigorous growth, sit on top of a decaying branch or trunk!

#### When is topping particularly dangerous?

When a tree is located under utility lines, near homes, neighbors' property, roadways or other highly trafficked areas – any place that presents as a target from branch or tree failure.



Trees that have been topped may become hazardous and

#### What can you do to prevent topping?

- 1. Hire an arborist who can provide a professional opinion or do correct crown reduction pruning. Be aware that crown reduction is a last resort measure on large trees. Large pruning wounds become a race between wound closure and wound rot.
- 2. Consider removal and replacement with a lower-growing species.
- 3. At tree selection, consider the mature size of a tree and the site obiectives.
- 4. Learn to make correct pruning cuts. Your City Forester is happy to provide proper pruning information-

#### **NEW SOFTWARE TO PLAY A BIG PART IN CITY'S FUTURE**

The City has purchased

and implemented a new software package that will be instrumental in processing development projects, from the initial Plan Commission meeting to final building occupancy. BS&A Software will link the processes of the Planning, Engineering and Inspection departments, and also provide tracking for code enforcement of zoning and property violations

The software went live on March 10th and will allow staff in the Development Services area to receive updates on the progress of project submittals. The installation package included having trainers sit with staff members for two weeks to enable them to get a handson experience with real projects. The trainers worked with staff to customize the program to meet the City's needs.

Processes that are being handled by the new software include site plan reviews, rezoning applications, certified survey maps, building projects, plumbing and electrical permits, as well as code enforcement. Staff will be able to see updates and notes made by other departments, and to work collaboratively on approving permits and fulfilling requests.

The company markets BS&A Software as a, "tightly integrated system of software products designed specifically for municipalities that demand leadingedge, feature-rich solutions at a value

price." "BS&A is ahead of the curve with its building department software, which will allow the City to become even more efficient," said Matthew Kirwin, BS&A trainer. "Not only is it going to be beneficial in the short term, but it puts the City of Oak Creek in a place where most municipalities will strive to be at in the years to come. BS&A will be an invaluable tool for the City as it continues to fulfill the needs of developers and residents on current and future projects."

Once the software is fully implemented, residents, business owners and contractors will be able to submit applications online, see the status of their submittal and receive their approved permit by email. In the future, complaints about property code violations also will be able to be registered through the City's website.

The new software provides for field documentation of code enforcement actions, and generates reports to inform elected officials of the status of violations in their districts. "When BS&A is fully implemented, residents will be able to look online to see the status of a complaint about any property in the City, and will be able to see what the City is doing to correct the problem," said Zoning Administrator Pete Wag-

In April, the City will begin phase two of the implementation, when all the financial components begin to go live.

Internally staff will be able to streamline processes and gain

efficiency in payroll, accounts payable, accounts receivable, budgeting, fixed assets and human relations. Externally, staff and residents will notice a positive change with cash receipting. work order management and citizen request for action modules. The upgraded system will be a vast improvement over the old system due to the integration of citywide processes and increased capabilities geared toward the public.



#### FOR YOUR INFORMATION

#### CITY WIDE REVALUATION FOR 2015

The Assessor's Office will be conducting a citywide revaluation for 2015. As part of the new agreement with the City of Oak Creek, the Assessor's Office will be updating the values this year and also for 2016.

The current revaluation will be considering sales that occurred during 2013 and 2014. This leads to more equitable assessments for each property owner based on current sales and other market data gathered by the assessor. The goal of this year's revaluation will be to estimate each property's fair market value as of January 1, 2015 based on current sales of comparable properties. For commercial properties. current income (current market rents) and expense information was also used to estimate the fair market value.

#### Property owners will be mailed a Notice of Assessment in early June 2015. That Notice of Assessment will



display the new 2015 assessed value as well as the 2014 assessed value and instructions on how to

contact the Assessor's Office if they wish to discuss the 2015 value. The Notice of Assessment also includes instructions on how to appeal the assessment to the Board of Review (tentatively scheduled to meet August 12, 2015 at 5:30 p.m.)

The impact of property taxes on individual properties as a result of the revaluation will not be known until later this year. Please see below for some important notes relating to property taxes in the year of a revaluation.

- There are 6 taxing authorities on the tax bill; State of Wisconsin, Milwaukee County, City of Oak Creek, Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC), Metro Milwaukee Sewer District (MMSD) & the Oak Creek School District.
- · Each taxing authority establishes their budget during the summer and fall months annually.
- · A decrease in assessed value does not necessarily mean a decrease in property taxes in the year of a revaluation. In a hypothetical scenario, if all assessments in the City decreased by

5% in 2015 & each taxing authority needed the same amount of money to operate in 2015 as they did in 2014, the tax rate would increase 5% resulting in no change in taxes.

- In the above scenario, property owners registered at the Police whose assessed value decreased more than 5% would be paying less tax in 2015 and those that decreased less than 5% or had an increase in assessed value would be paying more.
- State Statutes indicate that property taxes should be based on the current market value of each property (agricultural use land excluded). A revaluation redistributes taxes based on the current market value of each property. Paying more or less in property taxes in the vear of the revaluation does not mean the assessment is incorrect. The assessor's role is to estimate the fair market value of each property based on current sales. If current sales support the 2015 assessed value, an owner is paying only their fair share of taxes for 2015 regardless of what they paid in 2014.

If you are planning to hold a "block party", please be aware that City officials require approval. You can either visit the City's website, www.oakcreekwi.org - City Clerk's Office, to download or complete a fill-in application, or stop at the City Clerk's office approximately two weeks (or more) in advance to fill out an application, along with a map detailing where the party is to be held. The Police, Fire and Street Departments, along with the Alderperson of your district, require approval. There is no fee.

If barricades will be needed to block off a portion of the street, you will be responsible for pickup and delivery from the Street Department, 800 W. Puetz Rd., 570-5682, before 3 p.m. Friday.

#### TRANSIENT MERCHANTS

According to the Municipal Code, all persons going door-to-door soliciting must be licensed by the City of Oak Creek

and must wear a photo ID badge. Non-profit and charitable organizations are not required to be licensed, but must be Department.



If you are aware of someone soliciting without proper identification, contact the Police Department at 762-8200.

#### **WEED. GRASS & BRUSH ORDINANCE**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

(a) In addition to the weeds mentioned

to be noxious under s. 66.0407(b). Wisconsin Statutes, the following



weeds are also declared to be noxious weeds within the boundaries of the City of Oak Creek: Bull Thistle, Wild Carrot, Sour Dock, Wild Mustard, Chickory, Poison Oak, Poison Ivy, Sow Thistle, Burdock.

(b) Except as provided in Sub. (c), all weeds & grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on more than 50% of the lots in the subdivision, in multi-family apartments and complexes, planned developments and mobile home districts shall be cut to and maintained at a height not to exceed six (6) inches. All weeds and grass in platted subdivisions which have buildings on 50% or less of the lots or which are not located in platted subdivisions and all weeds and grasses in business and manufacturing zoning districts shall be cut to a height not to exceed one foot (12 inches).

The City may cause all weeds, grass and brush to be cut and removed. in accordance with this subsection and the cost thereof shall be charged to the property owner pursuant to Section 66.0627 Wis. Stats.

(c) The provisions for destruction of noxious weeds and cutting of all weeds and grass as provided above shall not apply to areas which are designated by the Common Council as nature centers or wildlife preserves.
