Recommendation:	That the Common Council adopt Resolution No. 12061-050719, a Resolution Amending the 2019 Budget
Fiscal Impact:	The budget amendment reduces the General Fund revenues and expenditures by \$2,392 each. Additionally, it allows the City to retain \$297,520 in state aid by remaining in the expenditure restraint program.

Background: During each budget year the Common Council and Staff determine if the City should continue to participate in the state's expenditure restraint program. The expenditure restraint program offers an incentive in the form of state aid to municipalities that keep expenditure increases (budget year over budget year) under the allowed maximum set by the state. In order to receive our 2020 expenditure restraint revenue payment of \$297,520, the City could increase our expenditures by a maximum of 4.4%.

Upon entering in the budget information into the DOR online expenditure restraint worksheet for the City to qualify for the expenditure restraint program, Staff discovered a 0.01% rounding correction that needs to be completed. The attached budget amendment resolution reduces the general fund revenue offset line item by \$2,392 and the general fund contingency expenditure line item by \$2,392. This reduction will allow us to be at 4.39% and the online DOR form will accept the adjustment and the City will qualify for the expenditure restraint program.

Options/Alternatives: If the Council chooses not to amend the 2019 budget the City will need to find a one time revenue source of \$297,520.

Background: The City's policy on the handling of delinquent personal property tax is established through resolution no. 11637-081815. Item 5 of the policy states: By the following June 1, regardless of whether in collection or in legal proceedings will be noticed in the City's official newspaper, showing the taxpayer's name and/or business name, address, the delinquent principal amount plus interest. By the following June 1, the Treasurer shall also prepare a list of names and amounts of delinquent personal property for which the likelihood of collection appears remote, which shall be written off the books subject to approval by the Common Council; however, collection efforts will continue.

Therefore, I respectfully request that the Common Council authorize the publication and write-off of the 2017 delinquent personal property tax as detailed on the attached reports and as follows:

\$8,990.95 to be approved for publication in the City's official newspaper. Any accounts that have prior year delinquencies are indicated as "Multiple Year's". Accounts that are not allowable by law to be published have been noted and subtracted from the total. We will also post it on the city website until August 1st.

\$11,132.17 to be approved for removal from the City's general account.

Please note that COLLECTION EFFORTS WILL CONTINUE through the City's collection agency, on those accounts allowable by law.

Options/Alternatives: The Common Council could deny the write-off and/or publication of the 2017 delinquent personal property tax and the City portion would remain on the books as a current receivable.

THE POLICY ON HANDLING OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE CITY OF OAK CREEK

The following shall be considered as the policy on the handling of delinquent personal property taxes as allowed by WI State Statutes:

- 1. Those accounts determined by the City Treasurer to be delinquent as of February 1, will receive a notice of delinquency.
- Those accounts determined by the City Treasurer to be delinquent as of March 1, will receive a copy of this policy and a letter of delinquency from the City Attorney, which will advise the taxpayer of the ramifications of nonpayment.
- 3. If not paid on or before July 31, those delinquent accounts in which the City has no other recourse will be turned over to the City's collection agency. The City Treasurer will work with the collection agency to determine and approve which delinquent accounts will be subject to a lawsuit initiated by the City's collection agency.
- By the following April 1, the City Treasurer may charge back to each taxing jurisdiction within the taxation district, except this state, its proportionate share of those personal property taxes for which the taxation district settled in full the previous year, which were delinquent at the time of settlement, which have not been collected in the intervening year, and which remain delinquent, if the taxes are owed by an entity that has ceased operations, or filed a petition for bankruptcy, or are due on personal property that has been removed from the next assessment roll.
- By the following June 1, regardless of whether in collection or in legal proceedings will be noticed in the City's official newspaper, showing the taxpayer's name and/or business name, address, the delinquent principal amount plus interest.

By the following June 1, the Treasurer shall also prepare a list of names and amounts of delinquent personal property for which the likelihood of collection appears remote, which shall be written off the books subject to approval by the Common Council; however, collection efforts will continue.

An amount equal to any delinquent personal property taxes charged back which are subsequently collected by the taxation district, minus the cost of collecting those taxes, shall be proportionately distributed to each taxing jurisdiction to which the delinquent taxes were charged back. Distributions shall be made on May 15, August 15, November 15 and February 15.

WHEREAS, WI State Statute 74.30(1)(i) provides that on or before February 20, the City of Oak Creek shall pay in full to each taxing district all personal property taxes which have not previously been paid; and

WHEREAS, the uncollected personal property taxes may be charged back to each taxing district in the following year and thus will have an adverse effect on that years' tax levy for each taxing district; and

WHEREAS, the City previously adopted Resolution 11424-110513 which established a policy on the handling of delinquent personal property taxes; and

WHEREAS, WI State Statutes 74.42(1) provides that no later than April 1, the taxation district treasurer may charge back to each taxing jurisdiction within the taxation district, its proportionate share of those personal property taxes for which the taxation district settled in full the previous year and which remain delinquent, if the taxes are owed by an entity that has ceased operations, or filed a petition for bankruptcy, or are due on personal property that has been removed from the next assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, the timely and efficient collection of monies due to the City of Oak Creek will benefit the taxpayer and enhance budgeting procedures of the City Government.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Common Council that Resolution No. 11424-110513 is hereby rescinded; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Oak Creek that there is hereby established a Policy on Handling of Delinquent Personal Property Taxes, as attached to and made a part of this resolution in its entirety, to improve the accuracy of the City's financial position and enhance budgeting procedures by the timely and efficient collection of monies due to the City; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions contravening the provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Treasurer and City Administrator are hereby authorized to sign the Handling of Delinquent Personal Property Taxes Policy in behalf of the City of Oak Creek.

Background: The Applicant is requesting approval for a Certified Survey Map (CSM) to divide and reconfigure the properties at 3961 E. Oakwood Rd. and 10303 S. Chicago Ave. into four (4) conforming single-family residential lots. Council will recall that the parcel at 3961 E. Oakwood Rd. was rezoned to Rs-3, Single Family Residential on March 19, 2019 (Ord. 2931).

Lots 1-3 are proposed to be 0.4707 acres each, and lot 4 is proposed to be 0.6168 acres. Lot 4 will retain the existing dwelling following division. Per the Water and Sewer Utility Engineer, utility laterals will need to be installed to the new lots at such time as they are developed. Council will note that the CSM also includes a 30-foot-wide road dedication along E. Oakwood Road for future public roadway improvements.

The Plan Commission reviewed the CSM proposal at their meeting on April 23, 2019, and recommend approval with the condition that all technical corrections, including, but not limited to spelling errors, minor coordinate geometry corrections, and corrections required for compliance with the Municipal Code and Wisconsin Statutes, are made prior to recording.

Options/Alternatives: Council has the discretion to modify the condition(s) of Certified Survey Map approval, or deny the request. Disapproval will likely result in the existing condition of the properties to remain as one (1) vacant, underutilized lot, and one (1) developed lot with a single-family residential dwelling.



Background: The Applicant is requesting that the Planned Land Use category and map in the Comprehensive Plan for the properties at 1001 W. Ryan Rd. and Lot 4 of Certified Survey Map No. 9085 (address TBD) are amended from "Planned Industrial" to "Planned Business" in consideration of future commercial redevelopment plans for the properties. Future rezoning may also be required depending upon the specific redevelopment proposal(s).

Parcels in the area of the subject parcels in this request are currently identified in the Comprehensive Plan as "Planned Business," "Planned Industrial," "Resource Protection Area," and "Limited Development Area." Existing uses in the immediate area include quick-service restaurants with drive-through facilities to the northwest and west; a gas station, natural area, retail, and business park to the west and southwest; Ryan Business Park to the south; agricultural and residential to the east; and grocery distribution and warehousing to the north. Planned Business would allow for commercial development on the properties.







Location: It is proposed that Ryan Business Park will have a component consisting of all land north of the south branch of the Oak Creek at the intersection of Ryan Road (STH 100) and 13th Street (CTH V). The four specific parcels which are the subject of this request include 1199 and 1203 W. Ryan Road (the former "Tischendorf Parcels"); 1001 W. Ryan Road (the former "Evershine Parcel") and the portion of 9600 S. 13th Street North of the creek or Lot 4 of CSM 9085 (formerly a portion of "the County Parcel"). The request is to expand the Planned Business area to include this entire component north of the creek.

Description: As background, General Capital and its partner, Capstone Quadrangle (together, "RBP LLC"), assembled and purchased approximately 114 acres to create a Class A Business Park. In late 2018, RBP LLC sold 75 acres to another developer who is constructing a 2.6mm SF distribution facility with an investment of not less than \$200mm and creating 1,500+ jobs. RBP LLC worked collaboratively with the City of Oak Creek to establish a TID to support the creation of the business park.

After the sale of the 75 acres, RBP LLC has two large developable areas remaining which will also create significant value for the City of Oak Creek. These areas include an industrial parcel at the south end of RBP off 13th Street with approximately 16 acres of developable land, and a "Retail" parcel at the gateway of the project consisting of approximately 14.5 acres of developable land (refer to the attached map).

The "Retail" development area, soon to be consolidated into one development parcel, is the subject of this request for a Comprehensive Plan Amendment.



<u>Scope:</u> This change will enhance the continued development and completion of the City's vision for a business park in this quadrant, with a Class A entrance and "front door" to the Ryan Business Park. The Planned Business designation permits flexibility for the highest and best use in terms of commercial, retail and industrial usage. In our opinion, it is consistent with the City's vision and the 2002 Comprehensive Plan as Amended by Ordinance No. 2906.


Land Use. The four parcels in question are primarily currently indicated for Agricultural Protection in the City's Comprehensive Plan, but the land is currently vastly underutilized as agricultural and is either cropland or farm buildings with two homes. The change to Planned Business will enable a Class A entrance to the Ryan Business Park.


