## CITY OF OAK CREEK NEW STOP SIGN INSTALLATION APPLICATION FORM

The City of Oak Creek Traffic & Safety Commission has created guidelines to establish a consistent and standardized process to evaluate requests for the installation of a stop sign. The guidelines are intended to provide a procedure for the review and approval or denial of a stop sign request and are included on page three of this application form.

When considering making a request for a stop sign at an uncontrolled intersection, please first consider that your request must meet one of the conditions as outlined in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). Under the current guidance within the MUTCD, stop sign requests will be evaluated based on the following:

- ".....the use of YIELD or STOP signs <u>should</u> be considered at the intersection of two minor streets or local roads where the intersection has more than three approaches and where one or more of the following conditions exist:
- A. The combined vehicular, bicycle, and pedestrian volume entering the intersection from all approaches averages more than 2,000 units per day;
- B. The ability to see conflicting traffic on an approach is not sufficient to allow a road user to stop or yield in compliance with the normal right-of-way rule if such stopping or yielding is necessary; and/or
- C. Crash records indicate that five or more crashes that involve the failure to yield the right-of-way at the intersection under the normal right-of-way rule have been reported within a 3-year period, or that three or more such crashes have been reported within a 2-year period."

When considering making a request for a multi-way stop at an intersection, please first consider that your request must meet the following criteria as outlined in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). Under the current guidance within the MUTCD, multi-way stop requests will be evaluated based on the following:

"The following criteria should be considered in the engineering study for a multiway STOP sign installation:

A. Where traffic control signals are justified, the multi-way stop is an interim measure that can be installed quickly to control traffic while arrangements are being made for the installation of the traffic control signal.

B. Five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period that are susceptible to correction by a multi-way stop installation. Such crashes include right-turn and left-turn collisions as well as right-angle collisions.

## C. Minimum volumes:

- 1. The vehicular volume entering the intersection from the major street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 300 vehicles per hour for any 8 hours of an average day; and
- 2. The combined vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle volume entering the intersection from the minor street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 200 units per hour for the same 8 hours, with an average delay to minor-street vehicular traffic of at least 30 seconds per vehicle during the highest hour; but
- 3. If the 85th-percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph, the minimum vehicular volume warrants are 70 percent of the values provided in Items 1 and 2.
- D. Where no single criterion is satisfied, but where Criteria B, C.1, and C.2 are all satisfied to 80 percent of the minimum values. Criterion C.3 is excluded from this condition."

"YIELD or STOP signs should not be used for speed control."

"A YIELD or STOP sign should not be installed on the higher volume roadway unless justified by an engineering study."

# CITY OF OAK CREEK STOP SIGN INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

## I. PURPOSE

To establish a consistent and standardized process to evaluate the request for the installation of stop signs within the City of Oak Creek. The guidelines are intended to provide a procedure for the review and approval or denial of stop sign installation requests.

## II. STATEMENT OF GUIDELINES

The City of Oak Creek Traffic & Safety Commission deems it important to provide and improve public rights-of-way to ensure the safety of vehicular, bicycle, and pedestrian traffic within the City.

## III. DEFINITIONS

<u>MUTCD</u> means the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (latest edition). <u>TSC</u> means the Traffic & Safety Commission of the City of Oak Creek, Wisconsin.

## **IV. Guidelines**

Requests for a stop sign will be evaluated by the Engineering Department and approved or denied utilizing the following process:

- Requests may be made by residents, businesses, or any other users of the City's street system.
- 2. Requests for stop signs shall be submitted to the Engineering Department utilizing a standard request form that may be obtained from www.oakcreekwi.org or by calling 414-766-7000.
- Upon receipt of the request, the Engineering and Police Departments will collaborate to collect the necessary data to evaluate the request based on guidance from the MUTCD.
- 4. The City Engineer or their designee will evaluate the data collected to determine if the requested stop sign meets any of the required warrants as outlined in the MUTCD.

- 5. If the stop sign is not warranted, the City Engineer will notify the person/s making the request of the results and send a copy to the Alderperson of the District. Should the applicant wish to appeal the decision of the City Engineer he/she must submit a letter describing why MUTCD guidance should not be utilized. The TSC will then discuss the item and will determine whether to uphold or overturn the City Engineer's decision.
- 6. If the stop sign is warranted, the City Engineer will place the item on a future TSC agenda for discussion and potential recommendation for approval to the Common Council
