Your **City Administrator**

The Mayor and Common Council, who serve on a parttime basis, appoint a City Administrator who serves as the Chief Administrative Officer of the City and carries out the executive management of the government. In this capacity, the City Administrator serves the residents of Oak Creek by carrying out the policies and directives of the Mayor and City Council.

The City Administrator runs the day-to-day operations of Oak Creek's government, oversees the City's eight departments and ten divisions and ensures that Oak Creek's government is operating efficiently and effectively for its residents.

In conjunction with various Department Directors, the City Administrator is also responsible for budget management, economic development negotiations, legislative initiatives, operational efficiency measures, policy development, labor negotiations, and the overall financial management of the City.

Your Common Council

The City of Oak Creek is governed under a Mayor/Council format, with the Mayor elected for a 3-year term. The Common Council, acting as the legislative branch of our municipal government, consists of six Aldermen, with one elected from each of six districts. Aldermen are elected to 2-year, staggered terms. Our Mayor and Council members serve in a part-time capacity.



About Our City

Founded in 1955, the City of Oak Creek is located along the western shore of Lake Michigan in the southeast corner of Milwaukee County and adjacent to the City of Milwaukee. Oak Creek, with its 28.4 square miles of area, enjoys an enviable location in the Midwest. Not only is Oak Creek a part of the Milwaukee Metropolitan area, but it is only 85 miles from the heart of Chicago and 330 miles from Minneapolis both via Interstate 94.



Many of our residents have moved here to enjoy the suburban and rural atmosphere while, at the same time, taking advantage of the urban services provided by the City, as well as the professional sports and cultural activities provided within the metropolitan area.

Oak Creek continues to be one of the fastest growing cities in Wisconsin. From 2000 to 2010 the population grew from 28,456 to 34,451 people, an increase of over 20 percent. In addition to population growth, over the last 15 years the City has seen significant retail and industrial growth.

In 2015, the Oak Creek's government operations and Library moved into their new home: the Oak Creek Civic Center in the newly developed Drexel Town Square. This transformational, mixed-use development, situated on 85 acres once occupied by a Delphi plant, is now the heart of our community's downtown. Surrounding the Civic Center, with its iconic clock tower, is a mix of upscale apartments, restaurant and retail establishments, a medical facility, a hotel, a large public park, and a welcoming town square! As designed, Drexel Town Square has become the central meeting place for friends and families to stop for a meal and to enjoy the many City events throughout the year.

Our City's Unique **History**

Did you know that "once upon a time", the Town of Oak Creek was the underdog when it took on the City of Milwaukee in an incorporation battle?

When the Town of Oak Creek was established in 1840, only 40 families lived here, but access to the lake and railroad, and the growth of industry to the area caused the population to grow. When the Wisconsin Electric Power Company built a power plant in Oak Creek in 1951, the City of Milwaukee wanted to annex the town into its boundaries. The Oak Creek Town Board and many residents of Oak Creek did not want to become part of the City of Milwaukee, so they began to fight to become a city of their own. However, under state statutes at the time, town government didn't have the authority to incorporate.

But that didn't stop town leaders. They decided to try to get that law changed. Town Attorney Anthony X. Basile drafted a law, which has become known as the Oak Creek Law, to allow the town to hold a referendum on the incorporation. The Wisconsin State Senate passed the law, and Oak Creek scheduled its referendum for October 27, 1955. Voters would get to decide if Oak Creek would become a city.

Milwaukee officials were unhappy when they found out that Oak Creek was trying to incorporate, and wanted to block the referendum. To do this, they had to deliver legal papers to Oak Creek officials, but they never got the chance. The Town's officials went into hiding to avoid being summoned. Some moved in with relatives and friends so they could not be found. One hid in an attic. Only town employees, acting as messengers, knew of their whereabouts.

The referendum was held as scheduled. The results: 2,107 voted for incorporation and 126 voted against it. A town employee, who had to take the ballots to where Town Clerk John W. Trost was hiding in Milwaukee, changed cars twice and drove through a field because he feared he was being followed.

The City Charter was finally signed by State officials on December 15, 1955, designating Oak Creek as a fourth class city. This made it impossible for Milwaukee or anyone else to try to annex them.

The City's first officials were Mayor Arthur Abendschein (pictured below), City Clerk John Trost and Treasurer Fred Brinkman.



Animal Control

Contact the Police Department to report lost/found domestic animals. Other problems with domestic animals or wildlife are handled through the Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission (MADACC).

The City will remove dead animals on City roads only. To report a dead animal please contact the Department of Public Works. If you see a dead animal on a county road, please report it to Milwaukee County.

The City Health Department oversees rabies prevention for all reported animal bites that occur in the City. Animal bites should be reported to the Police Department.

Note: The City does not pick up any animal, alive or dead, on private property. It is the property owner's responsibility to call a local animal control contractor for assistance.

Branches need to be curbside by 6:45 a.m. on these dates to be guaranteed a pickup. Branches should be stacked with cut ends towards the street. Stumps and logs should be separated from the branches. Contractor generated waste will not be picked up.



The Health Department has a Certified Lactation Counselor (CLC) on staff to assist with breastfeeding questions or concerns by appointment.

Child Development

The Health Department offers resources and referrals to ensure your child is meeting important developmental milestones. A developmental screening tool, the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ), is available to all Oak Creek residents at no cost from the Oak Creek Health Department. Staff will assist with understanding screening results and will provide additional resources or referrals as necessary or requested.



Car Seat Checks

The Health Department offers free car seat checks to all residents to provide education on proper installation and use. Additionally, car seats may be available if you cannot afford one. Contact the Health Department for availability and qualifications.

Infant Home Visitation

All new infants in Oak Creek are eligible to receive a free home visit from a public health nurse. The public health nurse can weigh the infant, answer questions, offer breastfeeding support, and discuss concerns. Contact the Health Department to request a visit.

Pregnancy Testing

The Health Department provides pregnancy testing and verification for a fee. Contact the Health Department for more information or to schedule an appointment.

Safe Sleep Program

The Health Department offers resources and information on safe infant sleep. Additionally, if you cannot afford a safe place for your baby to sleep, the City may have a free pack 'n play available. Please contact the Health Department for availability and qualifications.



Christmas Tree Disposal

The Department of Public Works collects real Christmas trees regularly throughout the month of January. Please place your trees curbside for this collection.

Spring and Fall Citywide Cleanups

The City conducts cleanups beginning May 15 and November 15 each year for residential homes and condos that have City provided trash and recycling pickup. There is no charge for these pickups, but there is a charge for freon appliances and televisions. Pre-payment is required for these items: freon appliances \$15/each and TV's \$20/each.

Items must be roadside prior to 6:45 a.m. on the 15th to be guaranteed a pickup. Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers. Carpet and padding rolls must not exceed 4 feet in width. The following will **NOT** be picked up: paint, tires, batteries, fluorescent lights, hazardous materials, grass clippings, leaves, branches, concrete, dirt, gravel, shingles and recyclables.

Special Pickups

In addition to the spring and fall cleanups, the City provides special Friday pickups for residential homes and condos that have City-provided trash and recycling pickup for a fee of \$25. Freon appliances require an additional fee of \$15/each, and televisions \$20/each. The following will **NOT** be picked up: paint, tires, batteries, fluorescent lights, hazardous materials, grass clippings, leaves, branches, concrete, dirt, gravel, shingles and recyclables.

Garbage and Recycling

Residential trash and recycling carts are distributed and maintained by Advanced Disposal. All trash and recycling must be placed in the carts, with the lids closed, in order to be picked up. Carts should be curbside by 6:45 a.m. on day of collection but no earlier than 6:45 p.m. of the day prior.

Carts should be stored on private property but not in front yard setbacks, and should be returned to the original storage location on the same day of collection. Visit our website for more information on cart placement on pickup days.

Advanced Disposal observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

Trash Pickup, Curbside

Building

Any structural changes, additions, alterations/remodel, and new structures require a building permit.

Deck

A permit is required for any type of deck installation. Concrete patios do not require a permit. Please contact the Engineering Department and Zoning Administrator for any restrictions.

Driveway Approach

A driveway approach permit is required for new or replacement of the entrance portion of the driveway (the portion that lies within the public road right-of-way, approximately 16 feet from road or curb) and it must be concrete or asphalt. Gravel approaches are not allowed. There is no permit required for the main driveway portion that is constructed on private property. However, concrete/asphalt or gravel must be 5 feet or the size of an easement away from the property line. Please contact Diggers Hotline before you dig.

Electrical

Any electrical work requires an electrical permit.

Fencing

A permit is required for installing any length and type of fencing. The City does not mark your property lines nor have any involvement in property line disputes. Please contact Diggers Hotline before you dig.

Garages

A permit is required for any accessory structures larger than 10 x 12 (120 square feet). Sheds 120 square feet or less shall follow the setback guidelines of 5 feet from any property lines and 10 feet from the house.

Gazebos

A permit is required for any type of gazebo installation.

Hot Tubs

A building permit is required for installing a hot tub on an existing grade. An electrical permit is required. If placing the hot tub on a previously installed deck, a building permit is required.

Patios, Concrete

Plumbing

Any plumbing work requires a plumbing permit. This includes new or replacement water heater and dishwasher, and any plumbing fixtures.

Ramps

A permit is required for any type of ramp installation.

Shingles

No building permit required unless adding a third layer or structural components.

Sidewalks

There is a permit (free of charge) for replacing a public sidewalk. No permit is required for adding, replacing, or removing sidewalk on private property.

Pet Licensing

The City requires all pets over five months of age to be licensed. A current certificate of rabies vaccination showing the tag number and expiration date must be submitted at time of licensing.

Plow Damage

The Department of Public Works will install black dirt and seed to repair any damage to lawns caused during plowing. Damage to other appurtenances installed within the City street right-of-way (i.e. walls, planters, sprinkler heads, etc.) will not be considered for cost of replacement. To report plow damage, contact the Department of Public Works.

Mailboxes

If your mailbox and/or post was damaged during snow plow operations, please report damage to the Department of Public Works. The City will first attempt to repair the damage. If damage is too extensive, the mailbox and/ or post will be replaced at no cost with a standard City mailbox. If necessary, the City will drop off a temporary mailbox which will then be picked up once the final repair/ replacement is completed. Custom mailboxes will not be replaced but if the resident prefers a custom mailbox, the City will reimburse up to \$100 per event for parts only.

The yard is open to all residential homes and condos. Proof of residency is required at entrance of yard.

No contractor vehicles will be allowed into the yard. Items should not exceed 4' in length except for branches, furniture, appliances and metals. The following items require payment by check or cash to dispose of: freon appliances \$15/each, Televisions \$20/each and tires \$3/ each. Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers and tires should be removed from rims. Gasoline engines must be free of gasoline and oil. Carpet and padding rolls should not exceed 4' in width. Pets and children must remain in vehicle at all times. There is no loitering or scavenging allowed at the Recycling Yard.

This includes but is not limited to yard sale, for sale, election, business promotion, etc. Community or Nonprofit event signs being placed on private property with property owner's consent requires a temporary sign permit at no cost. Election Signs

Although a temporary sign permit is not required for the placement of election signs, consent of the property owner is still necessary. Signs must not be erected prior to the first day of the election campaign period, as defined in Section 12.04 of the Wisconsin Statutes, and must be removed within 7 days following the election. Signs cannot be placed in a street right-of-way or on any utility poles, nor within a vision clearance triangle. Signs cannot be larger than 32 square feet in area on one side, and 64 square feet in area on all sides.

Property owners are required to clear their mailboxes and fire hydrants of snow and ice. Sidewalks also are required to be cleared of snow and ice within 24 hours after such snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumulate.
