4. MICHAEL FABER, Case #20-0001.

Michael Faber (on behalf of Lucia Rivas) is requesting a variance of Oak Creek Municipal Code, Section 17.0502(e), which states:

Ornamental Fences, as defined in Section 17.1401 of this ordinance, are permitted, upon the issuance of a building permit, adjacent to the lot line in any district, but shall not exceed a height of three (3) feet when located in the front yard or street yard in a residential district unless otherwise authorized by the Plan Commission. Ornamental fences must maintain a minimum of fifty (50) percent open space unless otherwise authorized by the Plan Commission. Ornamental fences shall comply with the traffic visibility requirements set forth in Section 17.0401 of this ordinance.
