SUBJECT: Crime Analysis Report, May 2022

During the Month of May, the Oak Creek Police Department responded to 2,267 calls for service. This is a 2% increase compared to the previous month of April, and a 1% increase compared to May of 2021. 499 incidents came from the East Side, 991 came from the West Side, and 674 came from the city center.

This report will look at the following calls for service: Property Damage Motor Vehicle Accidents, Theft, Burglary, Theft from Vehicle, and Vehicle Thefts

Property Damage Motor Vehicle Accident (PDO)

There were 74 reports of PDO during the month of May. This is a 7% decrease compared to the previous month of April. The top five contributing factors are listed from greatest to least: Following to Close, Inattentive Driving, Failure to Yield, Unsafe Lane Change, and Red-Light Violation.

There was 1 fatal accident during this month.

Theft

There were 60 thefts during the month of May. This is an 3% increase compared to the previous month of April. The top 4 retailers with theft are listed from greatest to least: Woodman's, Meijer, Farm & Fleet, and Pick N Save S 27th. There were 15 delayed reports from the following stores: Woodman's (8), Meijer (4), Farm & Fleet (1), Kohl's (1), and Pick N Save S Howell (1).

Burglary

There were 2 residential burglaries during the month of May. There is no change between months.

Residential:

- **Riverwood Apt:** Caller reported that his ex-girlfriend broke into his apartment and damaged his property.
- **8640 S Glen Forest Ct:** Caller reported that his Milwaukee Blower was stolen from his unlocked/opened garage.

Theft from Vehicle

There were 24 thefts from vehicles during the month of May. This is an 84% increase compared to the previous month of April. Of the 24 thefts, 4 locked vehicles were entered forcefully and 6 unlocked vehicles were entered. There were 11 theft of catalytic converter, and 1 report of theft of license plate.

Theft from Vehicle:

- Multiple thefts at around W College Ave by Hotel/Motels
 - Amazon: On 5/5 at approx 0812 hours, surveillance showed an unknown subject entering V vehicle and proceeds to steal items.
 - Hawthorne Suites/Fairfield Inn: Between 2130 hours on 5/25, and 0000 hours on 5/26, three callers reported that an unknown person(s) broke into their vehicles by breaking the window.

Catalytic Converter Theft: (Reference pg. 14 for theft locations)

- Multiple thefts at around W College Ave by Hotel/Motels
 - Kwik Trip S 27th: On 5/6 at approx 1058 hours, surveillance showed two vehicles, a dark SUV, and a white sedan, parking next to the V vehicle and removing the catalytic converter.
 - o **Kwik Trip Ryan:** On 5/6 at approx 2045 hours, surveillance showed a Black SUV PLT# AKJ3067/WI pulling up to the V vehicle and removing the catalytic converter.
 - South Shore Cinema: On 5/15 at approx 2210 hours, surveillance showed a Gray newer midsized SUV, possibly a Subaru, park next to the V vehicle and remove the catalytic converter.
 - o **2600 B W Sycamore Ave:** On 5/14 at approx 2051 hours, surveillance showed a small four door vehicle stop by the V vehicle and remove the catalytic converter.
 - o **Ikea:** On 5/24 at approx 0230 hours, surveillance showed a Dark Colored SUV drive around the building, park next to the V vehicle, and remove the catalytic converter.

License Plate Theft:

Vehicle Theft

There were 15 vehicle thefts during the month of May. This is a 400% increase compared to the previous month of April. Of the 15 vehicle thefts, 13 were Kia/Hyundai thefts.

- **Motel 6:** On 5/9 at approx 1048 hours, caller reported that her vehicle was taken by a male subject wearing a black hoodie with white letterings on the sleeve. The male subject was seen driving away with the V vehicle with another small Gray SUV. Caller stated that she recognized one of the subjects as one of the "Kia Boy's" but does not know his name.
- Comfort Suites: On 5/12 at approx 2319 hours, surveillance showed a White/Silver SUV
 (unknown make/model) park behind V vehicle and proceeds to steal it. Vehicle was later
 recovered by MPD at 5500 W Townsend St.
- **Motel 6:** Between 2240 hours on 5/15 and 0330 hours on 5/16, caller reported that her vehicle was taken without keys. Glass was left where vehicle was last parked. MPD reported that they located the vehicle in an alley at 3300B N 27th St.
- Fairfield Inn: On 5/19 at approx 0940 hours, caller reported that a vehicle was just stolen from the back lot. Caller stated that 3 other vehicles pulled up, 1 gray sedan, 2 other SUV's one dark, one orange/rust colored. A young B/M subject exited one of the vehicles and smashed the rear driver's side door window of the parked Kia (398PPC) and left with it.





Time of Day Reported




Day of Week Reported

Crash Locations:







Time of Day Reported




Day of Week Reported

Theft Locations:












Theft from Vehicle Locations:

Vehicle Theft: Appendix E

- Motel 6: On 5/9 at approx 1048 hours, caller reported that her vehicle was taken by a male subject wearing a black hoodie with white letterings on the sleeve. The male subject was seen driving away with the V vehicle with another small Gray SUV. Caller stated that she recognized one of the subjects as one of the "Kia Boy's" but does not know his name.
- Comfort Suites: On 5/12 at approx 2319 hours, surveillance shows a White/Silver SUV
 (unknown make/model) park behind V vehicle and proceeds to steal it. Vehicle was later
