



#### **Executive Summary**

The Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) is a guiding document that utilizes community voices to inform and identify ways to improve the health of Oak Creek. The CHIP is a long-term plan that outlines chosen priorities, goals, objectives, and strategies that work together to provide a framework for positive change and improved health outcomes in the community. This framework intentionally addresses the social determinants of health and health disparities and works to incorporate equity throughout. Based on findings from the 2020 South Shore Community Health Assessment (CHA) and input from community partners, the CHIP outlines the top two health priorities and action plans for addressing them, both now and in the future. Through continued collaboration, shared resources, and accountability, the Oak Creek Health Department will work to use the CHIP as a guide for addressing these priorities throughout the Oak Creek community. This plan was developed in collaboration with the Healthiest Oak Creek Coalition and additional partners and community members whose input has been crucial to its creation.



#### The South Shore Community Health Assessment

The 2020 South Shore Community Health Assessment (CHA) was a collaboration between the Oak Creek, Cudahy, and South Milwaukee-St. Francis Health Departments, which are located in the South Shore of Milwaukee County. It was developed to provide an understanding of our community's strengths, resources, gaps, and needs through community feedback collected through a variety of ways, as mentioned below. The collected data was assembled into a comprehensive document and was utilized when selecting the two priority areas incorporated in the CHIP.

## HEALTHIEST OAK CREEK COALITION

Started in 2021, the Healthiest Oak Creek Coalition (HOCC) is a group of organizations and community members who work to promote health and wellness throughout the Oak Creek community. Prior to the coalition's creation, four task force groups were formed by the Health Department to address priorities identified in the 2014 Community Health Improvement Plan. The coalition includes some of those involved with the task force groups and additional organizations and community members who, together, form one, large coalition. Currently, HOCC members meet monthly to identify priority areas and to create and implement work plans. Much of the coalition's decision making was informed by findings from the 2020 South Shore Community Health Assessment, including the decision to make substance misuse and mental health the two priorities.

Within the HOCC, the Health Department serves as the lead organization, facilitating meetings and ensuring that progress is made within the group's work plans. HOCC members were involved in all stages of the CHIP development process and will continue to do so throughout implementation.



#### Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships

The Health Department utilized the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) framework to guide the process of prioritizing public health issues, identifying the resources for addressing them, and taking action to improve conditions that support healthy living. MAPP is a unique framework that uses both quantitative and qualitative data and encourages involvement from a wide variety of stakeholders to inform the development, implementation, and evaluation of strategic community health improvement plans. The framework consists of six phases which can be seen below. The framework facilitates the strategic and intentional development of the community health assessment and the community health improvement plan by the Health Department.



#### An Emphasis on Equity

The Health Department acknowledges that centering our work around health equity is vital to promoting and ensuring the health of our entire community. For this reason, we will work to implement the CHIP intentionally and through a health equity lens. A wide variety of disparities or variation in age, race, income, sexual orientation, gender, culture, language, and religion can present barriers to achieving health and accessing needed services and providers. Our determination to address these disparities will deeply drive and motivate our commitment to improving health throughout our community.

#### What is Health Equity?

"Health equity means that everyone has a fair and just opportunity to be as healthy as possible. This requires removing obstacles to health such as poverty, discrimination, and their consequences, including powerlessness and lack of access to good jobs with fair pay, quality education and housing, safe environments, and health care."

#### Person-First Language

There are many misconceptions and stigmas associated with substance misuse and mental health. When talking about these topics as a Health Department and as a coalition, we strive to ensure that we do not add to the stigma. To prevent this, we place an intentional emphasis on using person-first language when talking about these subjects in and outside of work. Doing so helps to avoid using conditions, labels, and/or disorders to define someone. Examples of person-first language can be seen below:

#### Instead of saying:

#### Try saying:

"They are an addict"



"They are a person with substance use disorder"

"They are depressed"

"They live with depression"

#### Priority Area: Substance Misuse

#### Why is Substance Misuse a Priority?

Substance misuse is a growing public health issue that affects all communities. More than one-third of adults surveyed in Oak Creek said that drug abuse was one of the top three most important health issues on our community. Misuse occurs when an individual uses substances, like drugs or alcohol, outside of the realm of their intended use. Whether through over consumption of alcohol, using prescription medication for purposes other than intended, or use of illegal drugs, such misuse can be harmful to one's health and the community. For the purposes of our CHIP, substances focused on opioids, alcohol, and tobacco.



#### Priority Area: Mental Health



#### Why is Mental Health a Priority?

Mental health is a crucial aspect of one's overall health and includes emotional, psychological, and social well-being. Factors that can impact mental health include genetics, family history of mental health, and life experiences such as trauma. Mental health often affects how a person thinks, feels, or acts and can also determine how someone copes with stress, relates to others, and makes choices. Just under 50% of adults surveyed in Oak Creek said mental health/mental conditions is one of the top three most important health issues in our community.





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#### Appendix A: Logic Models for Substance Misuse Goals

Logic models are an organizational tool used to graphically demonstrate the relationship between inputs (resources), activities, and outcomes. They vary in size and can be revised and updated to reflect changes and lessons learned. HOCC used logic models to assist in determining how goals would be achieved and what would be needed to do so. 


