SUBJECT: Crime Analysis Report, March 2023

During the month of March, the Oak Creek Police Department responded to 2,307 calls for service. This is an 6% increase compared to the previous month of February, and a 3% decrease compared to March of 2022. 499 incidents came from the East Side, 948 came from the West Side, and 756 came from the city center.

This report will look at the following calls for service: Property Damage Motor Vehicle Accidents, Theft, Theft from Vehicle, and Vehicle Thefts

Property Damage Motor Vehicle Accident (PDO)

There were 81 reports of PDO during the month of March. This is a 72% increase compared to the previous month of February. The top five contributing factors are listed from greatest to least: Following to Close, Failure to Yield, Failure to Control Vehicle, Inattentive Driving, and Unsafe Lane Change.

There were no fatal accidents during this month.

Theft

There were 62 thefts during the month of March. This is a 31% increase compared to the previous month of February.

Theft from Vehicle

There were 6 thefts from vehicles during the month of March. This is a 25% decrease compared to the previous month of February. Of the 6 thefts, 3 unlocked/opened vehicles were entered, 1 vehicle was entered forcefully, and 2 license plates were taken.

Vehicle Theft

There were 7 vehicle thefts during the month of March. This is a 16% increase compared to the previous month of March. Of the seven vehicle thefts, 3 were residential and 4 were commercial.







Time of Day Reported








PDO Heat Chart by Area (March):









(Retail Theft Only) Day of Week Reported










