

SUBJECT: Crime Analysis Report, July 2023

During the month of July, the Oak Creek Police Department responded to 2,477 calls for service. This is an 6% decrease compared to the previous month of June, and a 5% increase compared to July of 2022. 646 incidents came from the East Side, 1,097 came from the West Side, and 801 came from the city center.

This report will look at the following calls for service: Property Damage Motor Vehicle Accidents, Theft, Burglary, Theft from Vehicle, and Vehicle Theft.

Property Damage Motor Vehicle Accident (PDO)

There were 54 reports of PDO during the month of July. This is a 34% decrease compared to the previous month of June. The top five contributing factors are listed from greatest to least: Failure to Yield, Inattentive Driving, Following to Close, Failure to Control Vehicle, and unsafe Lane Change.

There were no fatal accidents during this month.

Theft

There were 47 thefts during the month of July. This is a 21% decrease compared to the previous month of June.

Burglary


There were 4 burglaries during the month of July. This is a 100% increase compared to the previous month of June. Of the four burglaries, three were residential and one was commercial.

Theft from Vehicle

There were 13 theft from vehicles during the month of July. This is a 225% increase compared to the previous month of June. Of the 13 thefts, 6 locked vehicles were forcefully entered, 6 unlocked/opened vehicles was entered, and 1 license plate was stolen.






Top 5 Cause for Crash



Day of Week Reported




Time of Day Reported








PDO and PI Heat Chart by Area (July):




Count by Day and Hour



(Retail Theft Only) Day of Week Reported




(Retail Theft Only) Time of Day Reported









Change in Thefts (2023)






Theft Heat Chart by Area (July):




