Background: Health Department staff spend a significant amount of time in the community for a variety of activities including meeting with clients and community partners, participating in community events, holding health clinics and classes, and conducting inspections of licensed facilities. The Health Department currently has one vehicle, a 2016 Chevy Tahoe, that has had some mechanical issues and may not remain in service much longer. This vehicle is used full-time by the Environmental Health Specialist who spends the majority of their time in the community conducting inspections and working with licensed businesses.

The Health Department would like to purchase two new vehicles. The Department currently has Health ARPA grant funding available that has been approved to use for the vehicle purchase; this funding expires at the end of 2024. One vehicles will replace the current Chevy Tahoe and will largely be used by the Environmental Health Specialist. The other vehicle will be available for use by the Case Manager, Public Health Nurses, and other Health Department staff that spend time working in the community.

Health Department staff have met with the sales representative from Holz Motors and have identified the vehicles that we anticipate purchasing - a Chevy Blazer and a Chevy Trax; however, the vehicles chosen may depend on availability. The Blazer is a larger vehicle that will accommodate the supplies that need to be transported for clinics and other events, while the Trax is a smaller vehicle that will be useful for home visits and meetings. The vehicles will be purchased through Holz Motors through the State vehicle purchasing contract.

Options/Alternatives: The Health Department can continue to use the current vehicle until it is no longer in service and attempt to identify a funding source for a future vehicle when needed.

Fiscal Impact:	This equipment replacement purchase, along with a road patcher trailer and dump truck tarp system (separate requests), was approved with the 2024 CIP Budget for a total of \$103,000.

Background: This piece of equipment, along with the purchase of a road patcher trailer (separate item) will allow us to eliminate a truck from the overall fleet, while also utilizing a dump/plow truck in the non-winter months, resulting in significant cost savings by not needing to purchase a new patcher truck. The mini paver will be used to perform general roadway and end of driveway patching work following culvert installations, while the trailer unit will be used for pothole repair operations.

The paving unit will save time and result in a better finished surface. It can also be used for road shouldering and pathway paving. Material will be delivered to and loaded into the paver using an existing dump truck with tarp system.

Options/Alternatives: Retain existing 25-year-old patch truck for pothole and patch repairs. This is a slower method, and the truck will still need to be replaced at some point in the near future to avoid costly repairs.

Patch Truck Replacement

General Description:

Replace 1999 Patch Truck with Hot Pack Slide-in Unit, Mini Paver, and Dump Truck Tarp System.

Justification and Intent:

New equipment will allow us to eliminate a truck from the overall fleet, utilize a dump/plow truck in the nonwinter months, and save a lot of money not purchasing a new truck.

The slide in unit will be mounted in a mini-dump truck for pothole repairs, and the mini paver will be attached to an existing skid steer and be used to perform general roadway and end of driveway patching work following culvert installations.

The paving unit will save time and result in a better finished surface. It can also be used for road shouldering and pathway paving. Material will be delivered to and loaded into the paver using an existing dump truck with tarp system.

Description of Alternatives:

Retain existing 25-year-old patch truck for pothole and patch repairs. This is a slower method, and the truck will still need to be replaced at some point in the near future to avoid costly repairs.

We will look to sell the old patch truck on municipal auction. It is still functionable and should at least bring in a modest sale price.

General Description:

Replace 1999 Patch Truck with Hot Pack Slide-in Unit, Mini Paver, and Dump Truck Tarp System.

Justification and Intent:

New equipment will allow us to eliminate a truck from the overall fleet, utilize a dump/plow truck in the non-winter months, and save a lot of money not purchasing a new truck.

The slide in unit will be mounted in a mini-dump truck for pothole repairs, and the mini paver will be attached to an existing skid steer and be used to perform general roadway and end of driveway patching work following culvert installations.

The paving unit will save time and result in a better finished surface. It can also be used for road shouldering and pathway paving. Material will be delivered to and loaded into the paver using an existing dump truck with tarp system.

Description of Alternatives:

Retain existing 25-year-old patch truck for pothole and patch repairs. This is a slower method, and the truck will still need to be replaced at some point in the near future to avoid costly repairs.

We will look to sell the old patch truck on municipal auction. It is still functionable and should at least bring in a modest sale price.

Background: The Log cabin was built in the 1840's by Irish immigrants Thomas and Bridget Hughes. It was originally on the east end of Ryan Road, where Bender Park is now located. The building was donated to the Historical Society when Milwaukee County bought the land. The building is one of the oldest in existence in Milwaukee County. It is a great representation of an early Oak Creek pioneer home. The building was moved to the City museum site in 1978. Its significance to the city/area, residents, and visitors is in its value as a tool to help explain what life was like for Oak Creek's pioneer residents.

The cabin has reached the point where significant repair is needed to preserve it. It would be prudent to take action now to save this important part of our area's history for future generations to continue to learn from and enjoy.

Options/Alternatives: The City and Historical Society could let the cabin continue to deteriorate over time, ultimately leading to demolition. We could also possibly seek out and gauge the interest from other museums or societies to deed the cabin to, however given its current condition that might not be a viable option.

Background: A request for sanitary service was received from Bill Zimmermann of 999 Oak Wood LLC for his proposed residential single family home at 1834 E Oakwood Road. The service is being proposed to be connected to the existing 2" force main that serves the two houses at 1800 and 1816 E Oakwood Road, currently. This force main previously served the lot in question. The Utility does not have records on when or how the 2" force main was installed. It is assummed that this force main would need to be extended to serve the property at 1834 E Oakwood Road and that it stops in front of the property at 1816 E Oakwood Road. There is no gravity sewer in front of this property to serve. There is a sanitary manhole that the main could be extended from to serve this parcel 345 feet to the east.

There was a temporary sanitary sewer connection agreement from 1990 between Kenneth Meyer and the City to serve a three-unit apartment building that had a failed spetic system. At the time of the 1990 connection agreement the sanitary sewer was not extended from the east past the railroad tracks. The sewer was extended past the tracks in 2004 for the Willow Creek Estates Subdivision. This parcel is west of the proposed Mallard Creek Subdivison Phase 2 from 2008. The proposed subdivision plans that were approved extended the sanitary sewer from the east to serve the 3 homes at 1800, 1816, and 1834 E Oakwood Road as well as 2 lots from the proposed subdivision. The three-unit apartment building was demolished in June of 2018 when Milwaukee County took possession of the property. Milwaukee County took the property over when the previous owner failed to pay the taxes. The water lateral was abandoned to the main and the sanitary lateral was abandoned to the west property line.

The approval of the sanitary sewer service connection will perpetuate the existing force main liability on the Utility. There is a gravity sewer solution to serve the parcel with a special assessment project. The cost of the special assessment and the connection agreement would be the same for the developer as it is based on the lot frontage cost. The special assessment option would require the home owners at 1800 and 1816 E Oakwood Road to change out their plumbing from a grinder pump system to a gravity system.

Options/Alternatives: Deny the connection agreement and require a special assessment project to serve the parcel.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner proposes to connect to proposed sanitary sewer system for 1834 E Oakwood Road, Oak Creek, WI 53154, which is more particularly described as Lot 1 of Certified Survey Map No. 7679 in the Southwest ¼ of Section 27, Range 5 North, Township 22 East, in Milwaukee County, Wisconsin and

WHEREAS, the Owner desires to extend the existing 2" force main in front of the property and connect via a sewer lateral, to provide sewer service to a proposed single-family structure at 1834 E Oakwood Road, Oak Creek, WI 53154

WHEREAS, a sanitary sewer main connection fee shall be imposed, at this time by the City, for the privilege of connecting to the public sanitary sewer, and

WHEREAS, said sanitary sewer connection fee amount shall be applied to the total future sanitary sewer assessment cost, with the Owner responsible for paying any due amounts over and above the sanitary sewer connection fee amount and the Owner is not eligible for a refund, should the future sanitary sewer special assessment total be below the sanitary sewer connection fee amount, and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 to each in hand paid, in receipt and sufficiency whereof is hereby acknowledged, and in further consideration of the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

THE CITY AGREES:

To grant permission to the Owner to extend the existing 2" force main along E. Oakwood Road in front of the property and connect via a sewer lateral, all for the purpose of providing sanitary sewer service for one single-family residential structure at 1834 E Oakwood Road, Oak Creek, WI 53154.

THE OWNER AGREES:

- 1) To pay for all costs of extending the force main, if needed, so that it is extended past the west property line of 1834 E. Oakwood Road.
- 2) To pay for all costs of installing the proposed sanitary sewer service lateral, including the cost of inspection by the City.
- To obtain a permit from the City for the installation of the sanitary sewer lateral, all in compliance with the City and State plumbing codes.
- 4) To pay all sanitary sewer service charges in accord with the rates levied by the Oak Creek Water and Sewer Utility.
- 5) To pay all future special assessments for local sanitary sewer installed in E Oakwood Road, based upon the then existing special assessment rates for the sanitary sewer and the frontages for the zoning of the property.
- 6) To pay a sanitary sewer connection fee of \$13,568.00, which is based on the current residential sanitary sewer special assessment rate of \$128.00 per front foot

as applied against the lot frontage, 106 feet. The total fees paid shall be \$13,568.00.

7) To disconnect the aforementioned temporary sanitary sewer service lateral and reconnect the single-family residential building to the sanitary sewer in East Oakwood Road, at the time as such gravity sanitary sewer is installed fronting the property at 1834 E. Oakwood Road, at the Owner's cost.

BOTH PARTIES AGREE:

- 1) This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- This agreement shall be recorded by the City with the Register of Deeds of Milwaukee County after it has been executed by the Owners and the proper officials of the City.

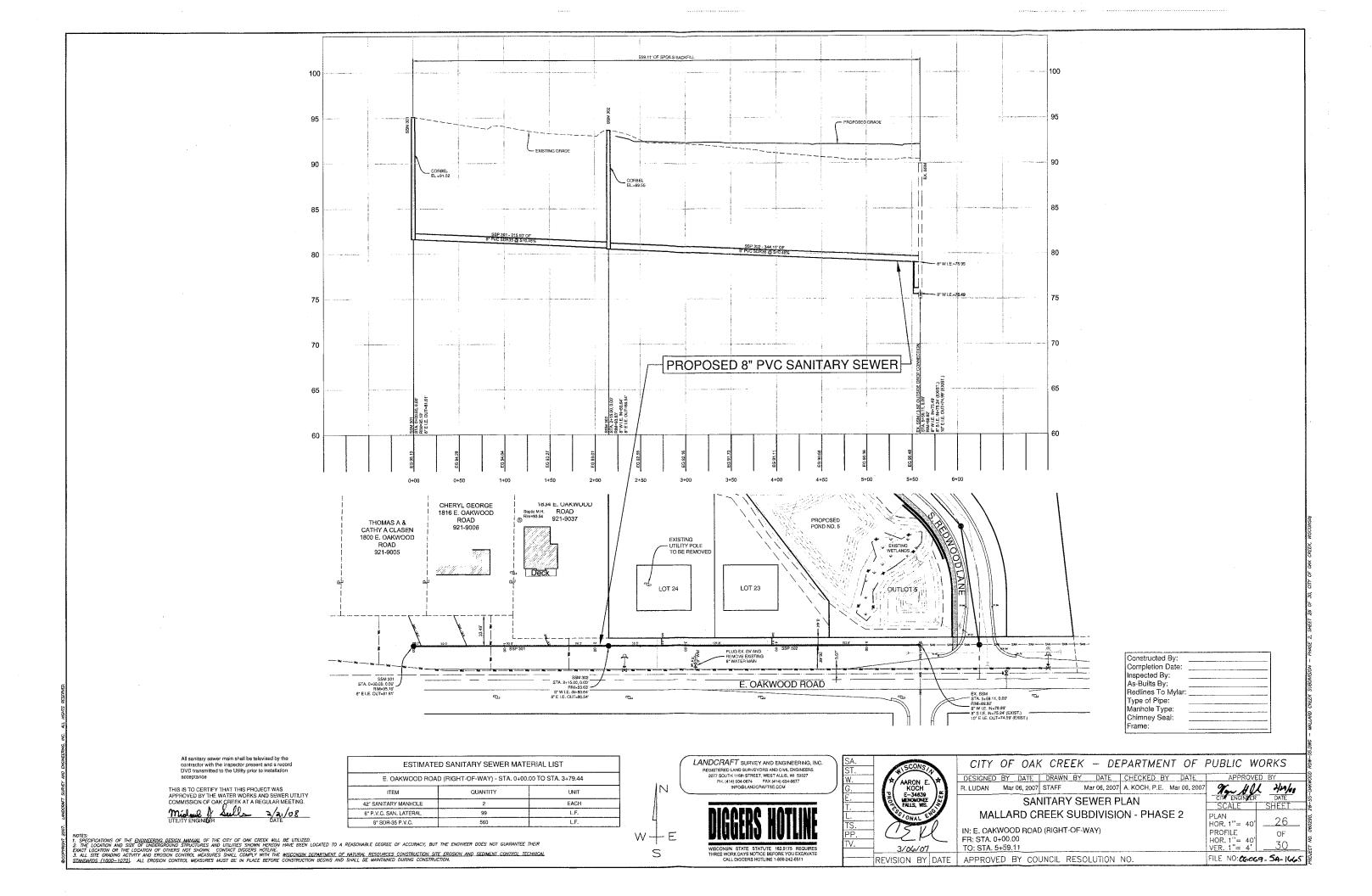

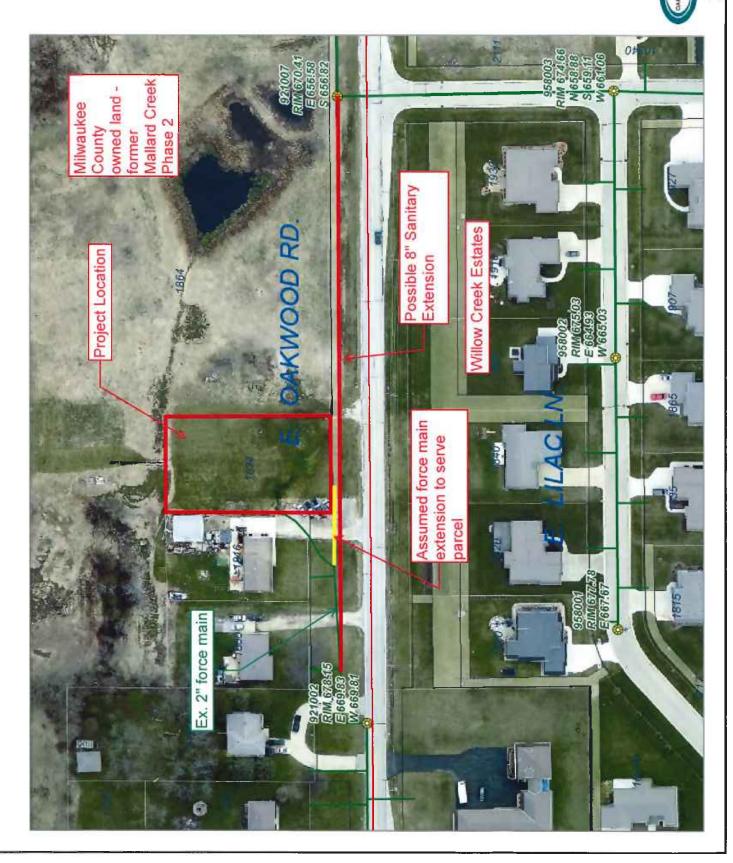

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS — Matt Trebatoski

- In May we will be welcoming two new Public Works Technicians to our team, which will put us at full staff for the first time in two years. Seasonal part-time help will begin returning throughout the months of May and June to assist with additional summer maintenance responsibilities;
- Street crews will be busy repairing catch basins in preparation for summer street improvement projects, replacing residential culverts, filling potholes, repairing road shoulders, removing signs on 13th Street for the County road project, and making improvements to the Municipal Services Building and Recycling Yard grounds to comply with DNR MS4 permit requirements;
- Parks staff will be ramping up boulevards and public grounds mowing efforts, cleaning rental pavilions, string trimming, ball fields and courts preparation and maintenance, playground equipment inspections and repairs, and general grounds cleanup and trash removal;
- Forestry crews will be conducting spring tree plantings, stump grinding, young tree maintenance, and lawn care at City facilities and miscellaneous rights-of-way. In DTS they will be spraying weeds, planting grasses and flowers, and performing pond maintenance in the Serenity Garden;
- Our Fleet mechanics will be preparing the mastic machine and tar kettle for crack filling operations, removing snowplow equipment, and servicing ditching and concrete machinery for those respective crews. They will also continue performing regular DPW and OCFD preventative maintenance;
- Water for the splash pad and DTS sprinkler system will be turned on and tested in May;
- We will help set up and tear down the following events: Bike Blessing, Farmers Markets, Car Event, Guzi's Hunt for the Cure, and Art in the Park;
- Annual brush/branch pick up will commence May 1 and continue until crews have been through the entire City.

INFRASTRUCTURE, LAND USE & COMMUNITY BUILDING — Matt Sullivan

- Developer Project Updates:
 - Lakeshore Commons continues with the North Townhomes and Clubhouse construction;
 - The Oaks at 8100 (Multi-Family Development on S. 27th Street) continues to progress with vertical construction. Two buildings obtained occupancies in March

- (for a total of 7-multifamily buildings). The final stage of construction of the public roadway will begin in fall 2024 to not damage the pavement while constructing the remaining multifamily buildings;
- Broadacre development (441 W. Ryan Road) obtained occupancies in April for the final two buildings within the development. A Bond was secured to guarantee final grading and asphalt pavement will be placed in spring/summer 2024;
- The Avid Hotel (9293 S. 13th Street) completed utilities, rough framing, and the roofing system;
- North Shore Bank (200 W. Drexel Avenue) obtained occupancy in March. Final restoration and landscaping anticipated in spring/summer 2024;
- Heyday Development (Puetz Road) continues footings/foundations and framing on several buildings. Occupancies are anticipated to begin in late May/early June. The final stage of construction of the public roadway is anticipated in fall 2024 to not damage the pavement while construction traffic utilizes the roadway to access the site;
- The Learning Experience (150 W. Forest Hill) continues with interior and exterior construction;
- The 517 E. Rawson Avenue Development installed erosion control measure and began site grading in April.

• Design/Construction Updates:

- Bluff stabilization/revetment is temporarily on hold while the WDNR reviews a
 Historical Fill Exemption permit. It is anticipated that the permit will be approved
 in early May with the project completion in June;
- The PPII project in Rowen Estates continues to progress with design to be completed this early summer with construction anticipated to begin in late summer:
- o Construction continues for the Abendschein Park Entrance and Parking Lot;
- Received bids in April for the 2024 Paving Project- contract award anticipated in May;
- Engineering staff continue to work on Fire Station #3 Parking Lot and Police Station Parking Lot.

ENGINEERING OPERATIONS

April, 2024

Drexel Lift Station

Mid-City has been submitting materials to get ordered for the Drexel lift station replacement project. This work is expected to start this fall. There is a 6-month lead time on materials. Currently, we are working on building material selection.

PLC Replacement Project

Next has completed the PLC replacements in all of the cabinets. We are going through punch list items and final drawing submittals. We will need to work through change orders and time delay issues with the contractor. We have installed corrosion monitors in the cabinets in the filter gallery to determine the corrosivity level in the room.

HVAC Replacement at WTP

Clark-Dietz has submitted the plans to DSPS for approval. We are anticipating their approval in May. Once we have the DSPS approval we will submit to PSC for approval.

Abendschein Park Water Extension

raSmith is working on the design and soil borings have been completed. We plan on putting the completed plans on the shelf. The Utility will hold off on construction until it is needed in the future.

6th and Marquette Sanitary Relay

raSmith completed the design of the sanitary sewer relay under the proposed bridge replacement. The plans were submitted to MMSD/DNR for approvals. The plans will be part of the bridge project and completed when the bridge is removed.

Shepard Avenue Water Relay

raSmith working on the design of the water main and have submitted 90% plans. We expect to bid this out in May. We plan on construction starting after the Fourth of July parade.

Clement Avenue Force Main

Graef has completed the soil borings and survey work. They have submitted 90% plans for review. This project will be bid out in May.

Garden Place Force Main

Graef has completed the soil borings and survey work. They have submitted 90% plans for review. This project will be bid out in May. We are working with the City for the design and installation of the fiber line to the lift station as well.

Water Valve Rehab

Distribution has inspected our jammed open and problem valves for the project. We have gathered our information and sent it over to Graef for the plans and specifications to be developed. They have submitted 90% plans for review. This project will be bid out in May.

Remote Station Radio Replacement

Engineering has been gathering information for a radio study to be completed for our system. This will look at all remote stations currently in service and new stations.

Sanitary Model Update and System Plans

Engineering met with Brown and Caldwell to discuss the completion of the revised system plans into a GIS format. BC is reviewing the subbasins and future land use with the project.

Developer projects

- Oaks at 8100-punch list items remain.
- Hey Day-sanitary construction is completed, and water main will be completed in April.
- The Learning Experience-punch list items remain.
- Edgemont Estates-DNR has approved the water and sanitary for the project.
- Rawson Business Park-Water plans submitted to DNR and Sanitary approved by MMSD.
- Frontline-working with designer for public water submittal to DNR.

DISTRIBUTION & COLLECTION OPERATIONS April 2024

Water Main Breaks:

There were no main breaks in the month of April.

Water Lateral Repairs:

The homeowner at 8810 S. Knollhaven heard his water lateral leaking. Once we excavated, we found a leak on their side of the curb stop. A repair was made by replacing the curb stop and the bad piece of pipe. This was completed on April 5th.

Hydrant Repairs/Maintenance:

Because we flushed all of the hydrants in the system, we found many that needed repairs. We began assessing and repairing these hydrants.

Valve Repairs:

On April 24th, there was a valve from 1994 that blew apart and started leaking on Nicholson just south of Puetz. We had to remove the top, replace the gasket, and put new bolts in it. We have had several issues with the valves in the 1993-1994 era.

Sewer Repairs/Maintenance:

Utility Workers continued performing sewer cleaning and televising.

Miscellaneous:

Annual hydrant flushing started and finished in 7 days. Much of the crew was involved in the flushing and they did a great job of completing this quickly.

Distribution had the sewer truck, camera truck, excavator, and a dump truck on display at Sneak Peek Oak Creek.

Utility Workers Volbrecht, Pier, and Nitecki attended a sewer nozzle seminar.

Out Of Service:

There is currently 1 hydrant out of service and 33 valves jammed open in need of repair.
