Recommendation: That the Council adopt Resolution No. 11441-121713 vacating a portion of the E. Forest Hill Avenue right-of-way.

Background: A request was made in 2012 by the owner of 1101 E. Forest Hill Avenue to vacate a portion of the unimproved right-of-way between his property and 931 E. Forest Hill Avenue. The owner would like to complete the vacation process at this time.

The area to be vacated is approximately 80 feet in width at its widest and tapers toward the east south of 1101 E. Forest Hill Avenue. Originally this right-of-way was intended to connect to Puetz Road; however, the lands are now part of the Oak Leaf Trail and were removed from the official map. An officially-mapped north-south street exists to the east of the Applicant's property that, once constructed, will connect E. Forest Hill Avenue to Puetz Road. Once vacated, the lands will be distributed to the property owners abutting each side of the right-of-way. No utilities exist within the right-of-way, so no additional easements will be needed.

Staff raised a concern for trail safety considering the proximity of the proposed area to be vacated to the bike trail in terms of the potential for a residential driveway onto E. Forest Hill Avenue. Staff recommended, and the Plan Commission approved, an access restriction along the entire width of the former right-of-way. The Plan Commission recommends approval with this access restriction.

This resolution was previously introduced at the December 17, 2013 meeting, and held to allow for publication and a public hearing.

Fiscal Impact: This vacation will return the right-of-way to private ownership. There are currently homes on three of the four affected parcels and no plans for further development. Therefore, there is no fiscal impact at this time.



MINUTES OF THE OAK CREEK PLAN COMMISSION MEETING TUESDAY, December 10, 2013

Mayor Scaffidi called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The following Commissioners were present at roll call: Commissioner Dickmann, Commissioner Johnston, Commissioner Carrillo, Alderman Bukiewicz, Mayor Scaffidi, Alderman Michalski, Commissioner Siepert, Commissioner Correll and Commissioner Chandler. Also present were Kari Papelbon, Planner, Pete Wagner, Zoning Administrator/Planner, Assistant Fire Chief Mike Kressuk and Doug Seymour, Director of Community Development

Right of Way Omar Barasneh 931 and 1101 E. Forest Hill Avenue

Ms. Papelbon explained that the applicant is requesting this right-of-way vacation which began in 2012 be brought forward and completed. The area to be vacated is approximately 80 feet in width at its widest and tapers toward the east, south of 1101 E. Forest Hill Avenue. Originally this right-of-way was intended to connect to Puetz Road; however, the lands are now part of the Oak Leaf Trail and were removed from the Official Map. An officially mapped north-south street exists to the east of the applicants property that once constructed will connect E. Forest Hill Avenue to Puetz Road. Once vacated, the lands will be distributed to the property owners abutting each side of the right-of-way. Concerns were raised by staff for the location of a potential future driveway. Staff recommends that the Plan Commission include a condition that no new driveways would be allowed within the vacated area.

Mr. Iglinski, 8341 S. Benjamin Drive, asked if his taxes will increase if he accepts the small piece of land. Mr. Seymour stated that yes, but not by very much.

Commissioner Dickmann motioned that the Plan Commission recommends to the Common Council that the unimproved right-of-way of a portion of the Northwest ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 16 (lands between 931 and 1101 E. Forest Hill Avenue be vacated after a public hearing and with the condition that no new driveways are allowed within the vacated area. Alderman Bukiewicz second. All voted aye. Motion carries.

WITNESSETH:

That the Contractor, and the City, for the consideration stated herein, agree as follows:

1. SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor shall provide marketing services to facilitate economic development in the City of Oak Creek. Services shall include initiating contact, arranging meetings, and developing relationships with a variety of businesses in order to attract, retain and expand the presence of those businesses in the City. The Contractor shall provide City with minutes from those meetings and follow-up strategy.

The Contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, services, expertise and everything necessary for the completion of the work more fully hereinafter set forth, all in strict accordance with this contract. The Contractor shall do everything required by this contract and other documents constituting a part hereof and in the manner specified herein.

The City shall be the exclusive public sector client of the Contractor. The Contractor may provide services hereunder to other private clients, and the same shall not be considered a violation of this contract. The Contractor shall disclose said other clients to the City, which City agrees to keep confidential.

The Contractor agrees to keep confidential any and all proprietary information of the City obtained by the Contractor in providing the services hereunder. The Contractor agrees to execute any reasonable confidentiality agreement of the City acknowledging same.

The parties agree that the rules of engagement surrounding the addition of accounts to a target list is a mutual event, but the final decision for inclusion or exclusion lies with the City. All qualifying accounts or leads shall be approved in writing or via email by the City of Oak Creek City Administrator to the Contractor prior to the commencement of activity by the Contractor. It is understood that quality of account leads rather than quantity is sought by this service contract. Contractor shall propose and jointly develop leads with the City including possible approach strategies.

City agrees that the Contractor will be providing the services utilizing the Contractor's reasonable best efforts, however, the City acknowledges that the services are purely advisory only, and that the Contractor will not be responsible for any losses, costs, expenses or damages incurred by the City as a result of the provision of the Contractor's services. The City agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the Contractor harmless from any and all liability, costs, damages or expense, including attorney's fees, incurred by the Contractor, brought by or against any third party, as a result of the Contractor's providing the services to the City hereunder assuming Contractor was not working outside the scope of his authority.

Contractor shall be required to prepare and submit on a quarterly basis written reports detailing lead contacts, development, strategy, and timing estimates on decision making and building plans when appropriate. Additional information may be required which will be jointly discussed and agreed to between the parties.

2. TERM

The term of this Contract shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing (the "Commencement Date") and terminating _____.

Thereafter this Contract may be renewed for additional terms of one year by mutual written agreement of the parties.

3. FEES AND PAYMENT

City shall pay the Contractor a monthly retention fee of one thousand and no/100 dollars (\$1,000.00) on or about the first of each month, consistent with internal processing schedules, which retention fee shall entitle City up to eight (8) hours of billable time each month.

A "Success Fee" shall be available to the Contractor under the following conditions and based upon the City taxes produced for the first full year of improved values. This Success Fee is paid by the City to the Contractor for a business which expands or locates in the City based upon leads generated by the Contractor or jointly agreed to by the City. The Success Fee shall be determined as follows:

- For City levied real estate property taxes received which amount to less than \$100,000.00, the Contractor shall be paid 10% of the City taxes collected.
- For City levied real estate property taxes received which amount to more than \$100,000.00, the Contractor shall be paid 7.5% of the City taxes collected.

Payment of a Success Fee is due within 30 days of the City Assessor's valuation of the completed project. The Contractor acknowledges that a business has the right to appeal any assessment valuation and, therefore, payment of any Success Fee due shall be paid

after all appeals are finalized. Assessments for payment of "Success Fee" shall include land improvements, building and personal property. The City portion of taxes for purposes of making a Success Fee payment are the only taxes to be considered.

City shall be responsible for reimbursing the Contractor for any ordinary and reasonable business expenses incurred in providing the services hereunder, with mileage expenses at \$0.55 per mile and reasonable costs for hotels and meals when travel time outside of southeastern Wisconsin is required. For any single business expense exceeding \$250.00, the Contractor shall first obtain City approval in writing for said business expense before incurring that expense.

The Contractor shall be paid as an independent contractor to City for liability and tax purposes. The Contractor shall be paid all gross fees and be responsible for any tax withholding.

4. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES LIABILITY AND INSURANCE

The Contractor shall provide the City with certificates of insurance acceptable to the City prior to commencement of the work. It is hereby agreed and understood that the insurance required by the City is primary coverage and that any insurance or self insurance maintained by the City, its officers, council members, agents, employees or authorized volunteers will not contribute to a loss. All insurance shall be in full force prior to commencing work and remain in force until all services are completed and the length of time specified, if any, in the contract or listed below, whichever is longer.

5. TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this contract prior to the expiration of the term upon 30 days prior written notice. In addition, the Contractor shall be entitled to a bonus payment or commission upon the closing or completion of any success fee events the Contractor was working on prior to termination, which is subsequently closed or completed for up to one (1) year after City's termination of this contract.

6. AMENDMENTS

This Contract constitutes the entire understanding of the parties regarding the provision of the services, and there are no other understandings or agreements between the parties other than what is contained in this contract. This contract may only be amended upon the mutual signed written agreement of the parties. This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

Background: Pursuant to Section 2.23 of the Municipal Code the Mayor may from time to time, appoint Special Committees or ad hoc committees to review a particular project or a particular issue. The staff recommends that the listed ad hoc committees as well as the Environmental Advisory Committee and the Cable Advisory Committee, both of which are standing committees be disbanded because they have been inactive for some time. The following is a brief description of the status of each committee listed above.

ad hoc Bender Park Committee

Formed in August of 1990, this committee met in support of Milwaukee County Board's Bender Park Advisory Committee to evaluate the shore line protection measures and planned uses at the Bender Park site.

ad hoc Fire Station No. 1 Committee

Formed in December of 2010, this committee was created for the purpose of determining design parameters for construction of a new fire station 1 on a property acquired by the City. At this time full RFP recommendations are complete.

ad hoc Lakeview Village Redevelopment Plan Committee

This committee, formed in January 2001, was created to assist the Community Development Authority and the consultants in creating a redevelopment plan for the Carrollville area of Oak Creek. This committee comprised of the CDA and 10 property owners from the district. Today a master development plan does exist for this site, thus placing this Committee as inactive.

ad hoc City Facility Space Needs Committee

This Committee was created to determine the future needs of City facilities such as the City Hall building, the Library, the garage, and Fire Station #1. Space needs would be the focus of this group. Development plans are in place at this time.

ad hoc Civic Center Design Steering Committee

Established in July 2007, the Committee was approved by Council to further study and make recommendations regarding design of the new buildings and site design considerations for the Oak Creek Civic Center. The site for the new city hall and library has been selected and construction plans are being finalized. Additionally, the Council approved creation of a Library Foundation.

ad hoc Joint Library Exploratory Committee

In February of 2007, Mayor Bolender commenced preliminary exploration into the feasibility of constructing a City of Oak Creek / Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC) Joint Library Facility on the MATC South Campus site. A decision has been made to not construct a joint library with MATC and the City is finalizing constructions plans for a new library at Drexel Town Square.

Environmental Advisory Committee

This Committee was created by Ordinance in 2001, its major function being to guide the city thru the mandatory recycling regulations. This Committees objective is complete.

Cable Advisory Committee

The City signed a Franchise Agreement with Time Warner Cable back in 1997. At that time the City formed a Committee to conduct business related to the agreement and to handle all citizen complaints properly. The Franchise agreement does not state the City must maintain this Committee. This Committee no longer meets and is not needed.

Recommendation: The Common Council approves the purchase of the Locution Station Alerting System in the amount of \$220,000.

Background: A station alerting system notifies department personnel of incidents. These systems can help reduce overall response times by quickly providing clear information to the appropriate stations.

The Fire Department has been exploring several station alerting options as part of the Fire Station 1 reconstruction. We identified four systems; Locution, Comtech, Zetron, and Phoenix G2, and had each company submit a price quote. The Locution system was selected due to its integration with our current CAD system and overall alerting features. This system will be installed at all three fire stations.

The implementation of this system will help us to reduce our call processing and turnout times, which will allow us to improve our total response times to emergencies.

Fiscal Impact: \$160,000 has been approved through the CIP process; the remaining \$60,000 has been included in the Fire Station 1 construction budget.

The Committee reviewed the application for an Operator's license submitted by Cornelius S. Williams, 2610 W. Holton. Milwaukee (Applebee's). Mr. Williams was invited to the meeting, but did not attend.

On his application, Mr. Williams disclosed a conviction for aggravated battery in 2010.

The police report presented the following convictions:

- Home Invasion/Cause Injury (felony) (Cook County, IL) convicted 8/13/07
- Child Abduction (felony) (Cook County, IL) convicted 2/20/07
- Aggravated Battery/Weapon (felony) (Canton, IL) convicted 8/13/10

Mr. Williams has three felony convictions, two of which were omitted on his application. The License Committee determined that these omissions constituted falsification by omission. Additionally, an application can be denied on the basis that he had been convicted of felony charges.
